- 1 In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.
- ² And the earth was without <u>form</u>, and <u>void</u>; and <u>darkness</u> was upon the <u>face</u> of the <u>deep</u>. And the <u>Spirit</u> of <u>God moved</u> upon the face of the <u>waters</u>.
- ³ And God said, Let there be <u>light</u>: and there was light.
- ⁴ And God saw the <u>light</u>, that it was <u>good</u>: and God <u>divided</u> the light from the <u>darkness</u>.
- ⁵ And God called the <u>light</u> <u>Day</u>, and the <u>darkness</u> he called <u>Night</u>. And the <u>evening</u> and the <u>morning</u> were the <u>first day</u>.
- 6 And God said, Let there be a <u>firmament</u> in the *midst* of the <u>waters</u>, and let it <u>divide</u> the waters from the waters.
- 7 And God made the <u>firmament</u>, and <u>divided</u> the <u>waters</u> which were *under* the firmament from the waters which were *above* the firmament: and it was so.
- 8 And God called the <u>firmament Heaven</u>. And the <u>evening</u> and the <u>morning</u> were the <u>second</u> day.
- ⁹ And God said, Let the <u>waters</u> <u>under</u> the <u>heaven</u> be <u>gathered</u> together unto <u>one place</u>, and let the <u>dry</u> <u>land appear</u>: and it was so.
- And God called the dry land Earth; and the gathering together of the waters called he Seas: and God saw that it was good.
- 11 And God said, Let the <u>earth</u> bring forth <u>grass</u>, the <u>herb yielding seed</u>, and the <u>fruit tree</u> yielding <u>fruit</u> after his <u>kind</u>, whose seed is in itself, upon the earth: and it was so.
- 12 And the <u>earth</u> brought forth <u>grass</u>, and <u>herb yielding seed</u> <u>after</u> his kind, and the <u>tree</u> yielding <u>fruit</u>, whose seed was in itself, <u>after</u> his kind: and <u>God</u> saw that it was <u>good</u>.
- ¹³ And the <u>evening</u> and the <u>morning</u> were the <u>third</u> <u>day</u>.
- 14 And God said, Let there be <u>lights</u> in the <u>firmament</u> of the <u>heaven</u> to <u>divide</u> the <u>day</u> from the <u>night</u>; and let them be for **signs**, and for **seasons**, and for **days**, and **years**:
- 15 And let them be for <u>lights</u> in the <u>firmament</u> of the <u>heaven</u> to give <u>light</u> upon the <u>earth</u>: and it was so.
- 16 And God made two great lights; the greater light to rule the day, and the lesser light to rule the night: he made the stars also.
- 17 And God set them in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth,

- 18 And to <u>rule</u> over the <u>day</u> and over the <u>night</u>, and to <u>divide</u> the <u>light</u> from the <u>darkness</u>: and <u>God</u> saw that it was <u>good</u>.
- ¹⁹ And the <u>evening</u> and the <u>morning</u> were the <u>fourth</u> <u>day</u>.
- 20 And God said, Let the <u>waters</u> bring forth *abundantly* the <u>moving creature</u> that hath <u>life</u>, and <u>fowl</u> that may <u>fly</u> *above* the <u>earth</u> in the *open* <u>firmament</u> of <u>heaven</u>.
- 21 And God <u>created great whales</u>, and <u>every living creature</u> that <u>moveth</u>, which the <u>waters</u> brought forth <u>abundantly</u>, <u>after their kind</u>, and <u>every <u>winged fowl</u> <u>after his kind</u>: and <u>God</u> saw that it was <u>good</u>.</u>
- 22 And God <u>blessed</u> them, saying, Be <u>fruitful</u>, and <u>multiply</u>, and <u>fill</u> the <u>waters</u> in the <u>seas</u>, and let <u>fowl</u> <u>multiply</u> in the <u>earth</u>.
- ²³ And the <u>evening</u> and the <u>morning</u> were the <u>fifth</u> <u>day</u>.
- 24 And God said, Let the <u>earth</u> bring forth the *living* <u>creature</u> <u>after</u> his kind, <u>cattle</u>, and <u>creeping</u> <u>thing</u>, and <u>beast</u> of the earth <u>after</u> his kind: and it was so.
- 25 And God made the <u>beast</u> of the <u>earth</u> *after* his <u>kind</u>, and <u>cattle</u> *after* their kind, and <u>every thing</u> that <u>creepeth</u> upon the earth *after* his kind: and God saw that it was good.
- 26 And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.
- 27 So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.
- 28 And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be <u>fruitful</u>, and <u>multiply</u>, and <u>replenish</u> the <u>earth</u>, and <u>subdue</u> it: and have <u>dominion</u> over the <u>fish</u> of the <u>sea</u>, and over the <u>fowl</u> of the <u>air</u>, and over <u>every living</u> that <u>moveth</u> upon the earth.
- 29 And God said, Behold, I have *given* you <u>every herb bearing seed</u>, which is upon the <u>face</u> of *all* the <u>earth</u>, and <u>every tree</u>, in the which is the <u>fruit</u> of a <u>tree yielding seed</u>; to you it shall be for <u>meat</u>.
- ³⁰ And to <u>every beast</u> of the <u>earth</u>, and to <u>every fowl</u> of the <u>air</u>, and to <u>every thing</u> that <u>creepeth</u> upon the earth, wherein there is <u>life</u>, I have given <u>every green herb</u> for <u>meat</u>: and it was so.
- 31 And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

- 1 Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them.
- 2 And on the <u>seventh</u> <u>day</u> <u>God ended</u> his <u>work</u> which he had <u>made</u>; and he <u>rested</u> on the <u>seventh day</u> from <u>all</u> his work which he had <u>made</u>.
- 3 And God <u>blessed</u> the <u>seventh</u> <u>day</u>, and <u>sanctified</u> it: because that in it he had <u>rested</u> from <u>all</u> his <u>work</u> which God created and <u>made</u>.
- These are the **generations** of the <u>heavens</u> and of the <u>earth</u> when they were <u>created</u>, in the <u>day</u> that the **LORD God** *made* the earth and the heavens,
- 5 And every plant of the <u>field</u> before it was in the <u>earth</u>, and <u>every herb</u> of the <u>field</u> before it <u>grew</u>: for the <u>LORD God</u> had <u>not caused</u> it to <u>rain</u> upon the <u>earth</u>, and there was <u>not</u> a <u>man</u> to *till* the <u>ground</u>.
- 6 But there went *up* a *mist* from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground.
- ⁷ And the LORD God <u>formed man</u> of the <u>dust</u> of the <u>ground</u>, and <u>breathed</u> into his <u>nostrils</u> the <u>breath</u> of <u>life</u>; and man became a <u>living soul</u>.
- 8 And the LORD God planted a garden eastward in Eden; and there he put the man whom he had formed.
- 9 And *out* of the <u>ground</u> made the **LORD God** to <u>grow</u> every <u>tree</u> that is <u>pleasant</u> to the <u>sight</u>, and <u>good</u> for <u>food</u>; the <u>tree</u> of <u>life</u> also in the <u>midst</u> of the <u>garden</u>, and the <u>tree</u> of <u>knowledge</u> of <u>good</u> and <u>evil</u>.
- 10 And a <u>river</u> went *out* of **Eden** to <u>water</u> the <u>garden</u>; and from thence it was <u>parted</u>, and became into <u>four heads</u>.
- 11 The name of the <u>first</u> is **Pison**: that is it which compasseth the *whole* <u>land</u> of **Havilah**, where there is *gold*;
- 12 And the gold of that land is good: there is bdellium and the onyx stone.
- 13 And the name of the <u>second river</u> is **Gihon**: the same is it that compasseth the *whole* <u>land</u> of **Ethiopia**.
- 14 And the name of the <u>third river</u> is **Hiddekel**: that is it which goeth *toward* the *east* of **Assyria**. And the <u>fourth river</u> is **Euphrates**.
- 15 And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it.
- ¹⁶ And the LORD God <u>commanded</u> the <u>man</u>, saying, Of <u>every tree</u> of the <u>garden</u> thou mayest <u>freely eat</u>:
- 17 But of the <u>tree</u> of the <u>knowledge</u> of <u>good</u> and <u>evil</u>, thou shalt <u>not</u> eat of it: for in the <u>day</u> that thou <u>eatest</u> thereof thou shalt <u>surely die</u>.

- ¹⁸ And the LORD God said, It is <u>not good</u> that the <u>man</u> should be <u>alone</u>; I will <u>make</u> him an <u>help meet</u> for him.
- 19 And *out* of the <u>ground</u> the <u>LORD God formed every beast</u> of the <u>field</u>, and <u>every fowl</u> of the <u>air</u>; and brought them unto <u>Adam</u> to see what he would <u>call</u> them: and whatsoever <u>Adam</u> called <u>every living creature</u>, that was the <u>name</u> thereof.
- 20 And Adam gave names to *all* cattle, and to the <u>fowl</u> of the <u>air</u>, and to <u>every beast</u> of the <u>field</u>; but for Adam there was <u>not found</u> an <u>help meet</u> for him.
- 21 And the LORD God caused a *deep* sleep to <u>fall</u> upon Adam, and he slept: and he took <u>one</u> of his <u>ribs</u>, and <u>closed</u> *up* the <u>flesh</u> *instead* thereof;
- ²² And the <u>rib</u>, which the LORD God had taken from <u>man</u>, <u>made</u> he a <u>woman</u>, and brought her unto the man.
- 23 And Adam said, This is *now* bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken *out* of Man.
- ²⁴ Therefore shall a <u>man leave</u> his father and his mother, and shall <u>cleave</u> unto his <u>wife</u>: and they shall be one flesh.
- ²⁵ And they were both <u>naked</u>, the <u>man</u> and his <u>wife</u>, and were <u>not ashamed</u>.

- Now the <u>serpent</u> was more <u>subtil</u> than <u>any beast</u> of the <u>field</u> which the <u>LORD God</u> had made. And he said unto the <u>woman</u>, Yea, hath <u>God</u> said, Ye shall <u>not eat</u> of every <u>tree</u> of the <u>garden</u>?
- 2 And the <u>woman</u> said unto the <u>serpent</u>, We may <u>eat</u> of the <u>fruit</u> of the <u>trees</u> of the <u>garden</u>:
- 3 But of the <u>fruit</u> of the <u>tree</u> which is in the *midst* of the <u>garden</u>, <u>God</u> hath said, Ye shall <u>not eat</u> of it, <u>neither</u> shall ye <u>touch</u> it, lest ye <u>die</u>.
- ⁴ And the <u>serpent</u> said unto the <u>woman</u>, Ye shall <u>not</u> <u>surely <u>die</u>.
 </u>
- 5 For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil.
- ⁶ And when the <u>woman</u> saw that the <u>tree</u> was <u>good</u> for <u>food</u>, and that it was <u>pleasant</u> to the <u>eyes</u>, and a tree to be <u>desired</u> to make one <u>wise</u>, she took of the <u>fruit</u> thereof, and did <u>eat</u>, and gave <u>also</u> unto her <u>husband</u> with her; and he did eat.
- 7 And the <u>eyes</u> of them <u>both</u> were <u>opened</u>, and they <u>knew</u> that they were <u>naked</u>; and they <u>sewed fig</u> <u>leaves</u> together, and made themselves <u>aprons</u>.
- And they heard the <u>voice</u> of the <u>LORD God walking</u> in the <u>garden</u> in the <u>cool</u> of the <u>day</u>: and <u>Adam</u> and his <u>wife hid</u> themselves from the <u>presence</u> of the <u>LORD God</u> amongst the <u>trees</u> of the garden.
- ⁹ And the LORD God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where art thou?
- ¹⁰ And he said, I heard thy <u>voice</u> in the <u>garden</u>, and I was <u>afraid</u>, because I was <u>naked</u>; and I <u>hid</u> myself.
- ¹¹ And he said, Who <u>told</u> thee that thou wast <u>naked</u>? Hast thou <u>eaten</u> of the <u>tree</u>, whereof I <u>commanded</u> thee that thou shouldest <u>not eat</u>?
- 12 And the man said, The woman whom thou gavest to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I did eat.
- ¹³ And the LORD God said unto the <u>woman</u>, What is this that thou hast done? And the woman said, The <u>serpent beguiled</u> me, and I did <u>eat</u>.
- ¹⁴ And the LORD God said unto the <u>serpent</u>, Because thou hast done this, thou art <u>cursed</u> above all <u>cattle</u>, and <u>above every beast</u> of the <u>field</u>; upon thy <u>belly</u> shalt thou go, and <u>dust</u> shalt thou <u>eat</u> all the <u>days</u> of thy <u>life</u>:
- 15 And I will <u>put enmity</u> between thee and the <u>woman</u>, and between thy <u>seed</u> and *her seed*; it shall <u>bruise</u> thy <u>head</u>, and thou shalt *bruise* his <u>heel</u>.

- ¹⁶ Unto the <u>woman</u> he said, I will <u>greatly multiply</u> thy <u>sorrow</u> and thy <u>conception</u>; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth <u>children</u>; and thy <u>desire</u> shall be to thy <u>husband</u>, and he shall <u>rule</u> over thee.
- ¹⁷ And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast <u>hearkened</u> unto the <u>voice</u> of thy <u>wife</u>, and hast <u>eaten</u> of the <u>tree</u>, of which I <u>commanded</u> thee, saying, Thou shalt <u>not eat</u> of it: <u>cursed</u> is the <u>ground</u> for thy sake; in <u>sorrow</u> shalt thou eat of it <u>all</u> the <u>days</u> of thy <u>life</u>;
- 18 Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field;
- 19 In the <u>sweat</u> of thy <u>face</u> shalt thou <u>eat bread</u>, till thou <u>return</u> unto the <u>ground</u>; for *out* of it wast thou <u>taken</u>: for <u>dust</u> thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return.
- And Adam called his wife's name Eve; because she was the mother of all living.
- Unto Adam also and to his wife did the LORD God make coats of skins, and clothed them.
- ²² And the LORD God said, Behold, the <u>man</u> is become as *one of us*, to <u>know good</u> and <u>evil</u>. and now, lest he put forth his <u>hand</u>, and take <u>also</u> of the <u>tree</u> of <u>life</u>, and <u>eat</u>, and <u>live</u> for ever.
- 23 Therefore the LORD God <u>sent</u> him forth from the <u>garden</u> of <u>Eden</u>, to <u>till</u> the <u>ground</u> from whence he was taken.
- 24 So he <u>drove out</u> the <u>man</u>; and he <u>placed</u> at the <u>east</u> of the <u>garden</u> of <u>Eden Cherubims</u>, and a <u>flaming</u> <u>sword</u> which <u>turned every way</u>, to <u>keep</u> the way of the <u>tree</u> of <u>life</u>.

- And Adam <u>knew</u> Eve his <u>wife</u>; and she <u>conceived</u>, and <u>bare</u> Cain, and said, I have gotten a <u>man</u> from the LORD.
- ² And she <u>again bare</u> his brother Abel. And Abel was a <u>keeper</u> of <u>sheep</u>, but Cain was a <u>tiller</u> of the <u>ground</u>.
- ³ And in <u>process</u> of <u>time</u> it came to <u>pass</u>, that <u>Cain</u> brought of the <u>fruit</u> of the <u>ground</u> an <u>offering</u> unto the <u>LORD</u>.
- ⁴ And Abel, he also brought of the <u>firstlings</u> of his <u>flock</u> and of the <u>fat</u> thereof. And the <u>LORD</u> had <u>respect</u> unto <u>Abel</u> and to his <u>offering</u>:
- 5 But unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, and his countenance fell.
- ⁶ And the LORD said unto Cain, Why art thou wroth? and why is thy countenance fallen?
- 7 If thou doest *well*, shalt thou <u>not</u> be <u>accepted</u>? and if thou doest <u>not</u> *well*, <u>sin</u> <u>lieth</u> at the <u>door</u>. And unto thee shall be his **desire**, and thou shalt **rule** over him.
- 8 And Cain talked with Abel his brother: and it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and slew him.
- ⁹ And the LORD said unto Cain, Where is Abel thy brother? And he said, I <u>know</u> not: Am I my brother's <u>keeper</u>?
- And he said, What hast thou done? the <u>voice</u> of thy brother's <u>blood crieth</u> unto me from the <u>ground</u>.
- 11 And now art thou *cursed* from the <u>earth</u>, which hath <u>opened</u> her <u>mouth</u> to <u>receive</u> thy brother's <u>blood</u> from thy <u>hand</u>;
- 12 When thou <u>tillest</u> the <u>ground</u>, it shall <u>not</u> henceforth <u>yield</u> unto thee her <u>strength</u>; a <u>fugitive</u> and a <u>vagabond</u> shalt thou be in the <u>earth</u>.
- 13 And Cain said unto the LORD, My <u>punishment</u> is <u>greater</u> than I can <u>bear</u>.
- 14 Behold, thou hast <u>driven</u> me *out* this <u>day</u> from the <u>face</u> of the <u>earth</u>; and from *thy face* shall I be <u>hid</u>; and I shall be a <u>fugitive</u> and a <u>vagabond</u> in the earth; and it shall come to <u>pass</u>, that <u>every one</u> that <u>findeth</u> me shall <u>slay</u> me.
- ¹⁵ And the LORD said unto him, Therefore whosoever <u>slayeth</u> Cain, <u>vengeance</u> shall be taken on him <u>sevenfold</u>. And the LORD set a <u>mark</u> upon Cain, lest <u>any <u>finding</u> him should <u>kill</u> him.
 </u>

- 16 And Cain went *out* from the *presence* of the LORD, and <u>dwelt</u> in the <u>land</u> of <u>Nod</u>, on the *east* of <u>Eden</u>.
- 17 And Cain <u>knew</u> his <u>wife</u>; and she <u>conceived</u>, and bare Enoch: and he <u>builded</u> a <u>city</u>, and called the name of the city, *after* the name of his son, Enoch.
- ¹⁸ And unto Enoch was born Irad: and Irad begat Mehujael: and Mehujael begat Methusael: and Mehujael begat Lamech.
- ¹⁹ And Lamech took unto him two wives: the name of the one was Adah, and the name of the other Zillah.
- 20 And Adah bare Jabal: he was the <u>father</u> of such as <u>dwell</u> in <u>tents</u>, and of such as have <u>cattle</u>.
- 21 And his brother's name was Jubal: he was the father of all such as handle the harp and organ.
- ²² And **Zillah**, she also bare **Tubalcain**, an <u>instructer</u> of every <u>artificer</u> in <u>brass</u> and <u>iron</u>: and the sister of **Tubalcain** was **Naamah**.
- 23 And Lamech said unto his <u>wives</u>, Adah and Zillah, Hear my <u>voice</u>; ye wives of Lamech, hearken unto my speech: for I have <u>slain</u> a <u>man</u> to my <u>wounding</u>, and a <u>young</u> man to my <u>hurt</u>.
- 24 If Cain shall be <u>avenged</u> <u>sevenfold</u>, truly <u>Lamech</u> <u>seventy and sevenfold</u>.
- 25 And Adam <u>knew</u> his <u>wife again</u>; and she bare a son, and called his name **Seth**: For **God**, said she, hath <u>appointed</u> me <u>another **seed** instead of **Abel**, whom **Cain** <u>slew</u>.</u>
- ²⁶ And to Seth, to him also there was born a son; and he called his name Enos: then began men to call
 upon the name of the LORD.

- ¹ This is the <u>book</u> of the <u>generations</u> of <u>Adam</u>. In the <u>day</u> that <u>God created man</u>, in the <u>likeness</u> of <u>God made</u> he him;
- ² <u>Male</u> and <u>female</u> <u>created</u> he them; and <u>blessed</u> them, and called *their name* **Adam**, in the <u>day</u> when they were created.
- 3 And Adam lived an <u>hundred and thirty years</u>, and begat a son in his *own likeness*, and *after* his <u>image</u>; and called his name **Seth**:
- ⁴ And the <u>days</u> of <u>Adam after</u> he had begotten <u>Seth</u> were <u>eight hundred years</u>: and he begat sons and daughters:
- 5 And all the days that Adam lived were nine hundred and thirty years: and he died.
- 6 And Seth lived an hundred and five years, and begat Enos:
- 7 And Seth lived after he begat Enos eight hundred and seven years, and begat sons and daughters:
- 8 And all the days of Seth were nine hundred and twelve years: and he died.
- ⁹ And Enos lived <u>ninety years</u>, and begat Cainan:
- 10 And Enos lived *after* he begat Cainan eight hundred and fifteen years, and begat sons and daughters:
- 11 And all the days of **Enos** were nine hundred and five years: and he died.
- 12 And Cainan lived <u>seventy years</u> and begat <u>Mahalaleel</u>:
- ¹³ And Cainan lived after he begat Mahalaleel eight hundred and forty years, and begat sons and daughters:
- 14 And all the days of Cainan were nine hundred and ten years: and he died.
- 15 And Mahalaleel lived sixty and five years, and begat Jared:
- ¹⁶ And Mahalaleel lived after he begat Jared eight hundred and thirty years, and begat sons and daughters:
- 17 And all the days of Mahalaleel were eight hundred ninety and five years: and he died.
- 18 And Jared lived an <u>hundred sixty and two years</u>, and he begat **Enoch**:
- 19 And Jared lived after he begat Enoch eight hundred years, and begat sons and daughters:
- And all the days of Jared were nine hundred sixty and two years: and he died.

- 21 And Enoch lived sixty and five years, and begat Methuselah:
- 22 And Enoch walked with God after he begat Methuselah three hundred years, and begat sons and daughters:
- 23 And all the days of Enoch were three hundred sixty and five years:
- 24 And Enoch walked with God: and he was not; for God took him.
- ²⁵ And Methuselah lived an <u>hundred eighty and seven years</u>, and begat Lamech.
- ²⁶ And Methuselah lived after he begat Lamech seven hundred eighty and two years, and begat sons and daughters:
- 27 And *all* the <u>days</u> of **Methuselah** were <u>nine hundred sixty and nine years</u>: and he <u>died</u>.
- 28 And Lamech lived an hundred eighty and two years, and begat a son:
- ²⁹ And he called his name Noah, saying, This same shall <u>comfort</u> us concerning our <u>work</u> and <u>toil</u> of our <u>hands</u>, because of the <u>ground</u> which the LORD hath <u>cursed</u>.
- ³⁰ And Lamech lived after he begat Noah five hundred ninety and five years, and begat sons and daughters:
- 31 And all the days of Lamech were seven hundred seventy and seven years: and he died.
- 32 And Noah was five hundred years old: and Noah begat Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

- And it came to pass, when <u>men</u> began to <u>multiply</u> on the <u>face</u> of the <u>earth</u>, and daughters were <u>born</u> unto them,
- 2 That the **sons** of **God** saw the daughters of <u>men</u> that they were <u>fair</u>; and they took them <u>wives</u> of *all* which they <u>chose</u>.
- 3 And the LORD said, My spirit shall not always strive with man, for that he also is flesh: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years.
- There were <u>giants</u> in the <u>earth</u> in those <u>days</u>; and *also after* that, when the <u>sons</u> of <u>God</u> came in unto the daughters of <u>men</u>, and they <u>bare</u> children to them, the same became <u>mighty</u> <u>men</u> which were of <u>old</u>, men of <u>renown</u>.
- ⁵ And God saw that the <u>wickedness</u> of <u>man</u> was <u>great</u> in the <u>earth</u>, and that <u>every imagination</u> of the <u>thoughts</u> of his <u>heart</u> was *only <u>evil</u> continually*.
- 6 And it <u>repented</u> the LORD that he had made <u>man</u> on the <u>earth</u>, and it <u>grieved</u> him at his <u>heart</u>.
- And the LORD said, I will <u>destroy</u> man whom I have <u>created</u> from the <u>face</u> of the <u>earth</u>; both man, and <u>beast</u>, and the <u>creeping thing</u>, and the <u>fowls</u> of the <u>air</u>; for it <u>repenteth</u> me that I have made them.
- 8 But Noah found grace in the eyes of the LORD.
- These are the generations of Noah: Noah was a *just* man and perfect in his generations, and Noah walked with God.
- 10 And Noah begat three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth.
- 11 The <u>earth</u> also was <u>corrupt</u> before God, and the earth was <u>filled</u> with <u>violence</u>.
- 12 And God looked upon the <u>earth</u>, and, behold, it was <u>corrupt</u>; for *all* flesh had corrupted his <u>way</u> upon the earth.
- 13 And God said unto Noah, The end of all flesh is come before me; for the earth is filled with violence through them; and, behold, I will destroy them with the earth.
- ¹⁴ Make thee an <u>ark</u> of <u>gopher wood</u>, <u>rooms</u> shalt thou make in the ark, and shalt <u>pitch</u> it within and without with <u>pitch</u>.
- 15 And this is the <u>fashion</u> which thou shalt make it of: The *length* of the ark shall be <u>three hundred cubits</u>, the *breadth* of it <u>fifty cubits</u>, and the *height* of it <u>thirty cubits</u>.

- 16 A <u>window</u> shalt thou make to the <u>ark</u>, and in a <u>cubit</u> shalt thou finish it <u>above</u>; and the <u>door</u> of the ark shalt thou <u>set</u> in the side thereof; with <u>lower</u>, <u>second</u>, and <u>third stories</u> shalt thou make it.
- 17 And, behold, I, even I, do bring a <u>flood</u> of <u>waters</u> upon the <u>earth</u>, to <u>destroy</u> *all* <u>flesh</u>, wherein is the <u>breath</u> of <u>life</u>, from *under* <u>heaven</u>; and <u>every thing</u> that is in the <u>earth</u> shall <u>die</u>.
- 18 But with thee will I <u>establish</u> my <u>covenant</u>, and thou shalt come into the <u>ark</u>, thou, and thy sons, and thy <u>wife</u>, and thy sons' <u>wives</u> with thee.
- 19 And of every *living* thing of *all* flesh, two of every sort shalt thou bring into the ark, to keep them alive with thee; they shall be male and female.
- 20 Of fowls after their kind, and of cattle after their kind, of every creeping thing of the earth after his kind, two of every sort shall come unto thee, to keep them alive.
- 21 And take thou unto thee of *all* food that is <u>eaten</u>, and thou shalt <u>gather</u> it to thee; and it shall be for food for thee, and for them.
- 22 Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he.

- And the LORD said unto Noah, Come thou and all thy house into the ark; for thee have I seen righteous before me in this generation.
- ² Of <u>every clean beast</u> thou shalt take to thee by <u>sevens</u>, the <u>male</u> and his <u>female</u>: and of <u>beasts</u> that are <u>not clean</u> by <u>two</u>, the male and his female.
- 3 Of <u>fowls</u> also of the <u>air</u> by <u>sevens</u>, the <u>male</u> and the <u>female</u>; to <u>keep seed alive</u> upon the <u>face</u> of *all* the earth.
- ⁴ For yet <u>seven days</u>, and I will cause it to <u>rain</u> upon the <u>earth forty days</u> and <u>forty nights</u>; and <u>every living substance</u> that I have made will I <u>destroy</u> from *off* the <u>face</u> of the <u>earth</u>.
- 5 And Noah did according unto all that the LORD commanded him.
- 6 And Noah was six hundred years old when the flood of waters was upon the earth.
- ⁷ And Noah went in, and his sons, and his wife, and his sons' wives with him, into the ark, because of the waters of the flood.
- Of clean beasts, and of beasts that are not clean, and of fowls, and of every thing that creepeth upon the earth,
- ⁹ There went in two and two unto Noah into the ark, the male and the female, as God had commanded Noah.
- And it came to <u>pass</u> after <u>seven days</u>, that the <u>waters</u> of the <u>flood</u> were upon the <u>earth</u>.
- 11 In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month, the seventeenth day of the month, the same day were all the fountains of the great deep broken up, and the windows of heaven were opened.
- 12 And the <u>rain</u> was upon the earth <u>forty days</u> and <u>forty nights</u>.
- 13 In the selfsame <u>day</u> entered **Noah**, and **Shem**, and **Ham**, and **Japheth**, the sons of **Noah**, and **Noah's** <u>wife</u>, and the <u>three wives</u> of his sons with them, into the <u>ark</u>;
- 14 They, and every beast after his kind, and all the cattle after their kind, and every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind, and every fowl after his kind, every bird of every sort.
- 15 And they went in unto **Noah** into the <u>ark</u>, <u>two</u> and <u>two</u> of <u>all flesh</u>, wherein is the <u>breath</u> of <u>life</u>.
- ¹⁶ And they that went in, went in <u>male</u> and <u>female</u> of <u>all flesh</u>, as <u>God</u> had <u>commanded</u> him: and the <u>LORD</u> shut him in.

- 17 And the <u>flood</u> was <u>forty days</u> upon the <u>earth</u>; and the <u>waters increased</u>, and <u>bare</u> *up* the <u>ark</u>, and it was <u>lift</u> *up above* the earth.
- 18 And the <u>waters *prevailed*</u>, and were <u>increased</u> <u>greatly</u> upon the <u>earth</u>; and the <u>ark</u> went upon the <u>face</u> of the waters.
- 19 And the <u>waters prevailed</u> exceedingly upon the <u>earth</u>; and <u>all</u> the <u>high hills</u>, that were <u>under</u> the <u>whole heaven</u>, were <u>covered</u>.
- 20 Fifteen cubits upward did the waters prevail; and the mountains were covered.
- 21 And *all* <u>flesh died</u> that <u>moved</u> upon the <u>earth</u>, both of <u>fowl</u>, and of <u>cattle</u>, and of <u>beast</u>, and of <u>every</u> <u>creeping thing</u> that creepeth upon the earth, and <u>every man</u>.
- 22 All in whose nostrils was the breath of life, of all that was in the dry land, died.
- 23 And every living substance was destroyed which was upon the face of the ground, both man, and cattle, and the creeping things, and the fowl of the heaven; and they were destroyed from the earth: and Noah only remained alive, and they that were with him in the ark.
- ²⁴ And the <u>waters prevailed</u> upon the <u>earth</u> an <u>hundred and fifty days</u>.

- And God remembered Noah, and every living thing, and all the cattle that was with him in the ark: and God made a wind to pass over the earth, and the waters assuaged;
- ² The <u>fountains</u> also of the <u>deep</u> and the <u>windows</u> of <u>heaven</u> were <u>stopped</u>, and the <u>rain</u> from heaven was <u>restrained</u>;
- 3 And the <u>waters returned</u> from *off* the <u>earth</u> *continually*: and *after* the <u>end</u> of the <u>hundred and fifty days</u> the waters were *abated*.
- ⁴ And the <u>ark rested</u> in the <u>seventh month</u>, on the <u>seventeenth day</u> of the month, upon the <u>mountains</u> of <u>Ararat</u>.
- 5 And the <u>waters decreased</u> *continually* until the <u>tenth month</u>: in the tenth month, on the <u>first day</u> of the month, were the <u>tops</u> of the <u>mountains</u> seen.
- ⁶ And it came to <u>pass</u> at the <u>end</u> of <u>forty days</u>, that <u>Noah opened</u> the <u>window</u> of the <u>ark</u> which he had made:
- 7 And he <u>sent</u> forth a <u>raven</u>, which went forth to and fro, until the <u>waters</u> were <u>dried</u> *up* from *off* the <u>earth</u>.
- 8 Also he <u>sent</u> forth a <u>dove</u> from him, to see if the <u>waters</u> were <u>abated</u> from *off* the <u>face</u> of the <u>ground</u>;
- But the <u>dove found no rest</u> for the <u>sole</u> of her <u>foot</u>, and she <u>returned</u> unto him into the <u>ark</u>, for the <u>waters</u> were on the <u>face</u> of the <u>whole earth</u>: then he put forth his <u>hand</u>, and took her, and <u>pulled</u> her in unto him into the ark.
- And he <u>stayed</u> yet other <u>seven days</u>; and <u>again</u> he <u>sent</u> forth the <u>dove</u> out of the <u>ark</u>;
- 11 And the <u>dove</u> came in to him in the <u>evening</u>; and, lo, in her mouth was an <u>olive leaf pluckt</u> off. so **Noah** <u>knew</u> that the <u>waters</u> were <u>abated</u> from off the <u>earth</u>.
- 12 And he <u>stayed</u> yet other <u>seven days</u>; and <u>sent</u> forth the <u>dove</u>; which <u>returned not again</u> unto him *any more*.
- 13 And it came to <u>pass</u> in the <u>six hundredth and first year</u>, in the <u>first month</u>, the <u>first day</u> of the month, the <u>waters</u> were <u>dried</u> <u>up</u> from <u>off</u> the <u>earth</u>: and <u>Noah</u> <u>removed</u> the <u>covering</u> of the <u>ark</u>, and looked, and, behold, the <u>face</u> of the <u>ground</u> was <u>dry</u>.
- 14 And in the <u>second month</u>, on the <u>seven and twentieth day</u> of the month, was the <u>earth dried</u>.
- ¹⁵ And God spake unto Noah, saying,

- 16 Go forth of the ark, thou, and thy wife, and thy sons, and thy sons' wives with thee.
- 17 Bring forth with thee <u>every living thing</u> that is with thee, of <u>all flesh</u>, both of <u>fowl</u>, and of <u>cattle</u>, and of <u>every creeping thing</u> that creepeth upon the <u>earth</u>; that they may <u>breed abundantly</u> in the earth, and <u>be fruitful</u>, and <u>multiply upon the earth</u>.
- 18 And Noah went forth, and his sons, and his wife, and his sons' wives with him:
- 19 Every beast, every creeping thing, and every fowl, and whatsoever creepeth upon the earth, after their kinds, went forth out of the ark.
- 20 And Noah <u>builded</u> an <u>altar</u> unto the LORD; and took of <u>every clean beast</u>, and of <u>every clean fowl</u>, and <u>offered burnt offerings</u> on the altar.
- ²¹ And the LORD <u>smelled</u> a <u>sweet savour</u>; and the LORD said in his <u>heart</u>, I will <u>not again curse</u> the <u>ground</u> <u>any more</u> for <u>man's</u> <u>sake</u>; for the <u>imagination</u> of man's <u>heart</u> is <u>evil</u> from his <u>youth</u>; <u>neither</u> will I <u>again smite</u> <u>any more every thing living</u>, as I have done.
- 22 While the <u>earth remaineth</u>, <u>seedtime</u> and <u>harvest</u>, and <u>cold</u> and <u>heat</u>, and <u>summer</u> and <u>winter</u>, and <u>day</u> and night shall not <u>cease</u>.

- ¹ And God <u>blessed</u> Noah and his sons, and said unto them, Be <u>fruitful</u>, and <u>multiply</u>, and <u>replenish</u> the <u>earth</u>.
- 2 And the <u>fear</u> of you and the <u>dread</u> of you shall be upon <u>every beast</u> of the <u>earth</u>, and upon <u>every fowl</u> of the <u>air</u>, upon <u>all</u> that <u>moveth</u> upon the earth, and upon <u>all</u> the <u>fishes</u> of the <u>sea</u>; into your <u>hand</u> are they delivered.
- 3 Every moving thing that liveth shall be meat for you; even as the green herb have I given you all things.
- 4 But <u>flesh</u> with the <u>life</u> thereof, which is the <u>blood</u> thereof, shall ye <u>not eat</u>.
- 5 And *surely* your <u>blood</u> of your <u>lives</u> will I <u>require</u>; at the <u>hand</u> of <u>every beast</u> will I require it, and at the <u>hand</u> of <u>man</u>; at the <u>hand</u> of every man's brother will I require the <u>life</u> of man.
- Whoso <u>sheddeth man's blood</u>, by man shall his blood be <u>shed</u>: for in the <u>image</u> of <u>God</u> made he man.
- 7 And you, be ye <u>fruitful</u>, and <u>multiply</u>; bring forth *abundantly* in the <u>earth</u>, and multiply therein.
- 8 And God spake unto Noah, and to his sons with him, saying,
- 9 And I, behold, I **establish** my *covenant* with you, and with your **seed** *after* you;
- 10 And with every *living* creature that is with you, of the fowl, of the cattle, and of every beast of the earth with you; from all that go out of the ark, to every beast of the earth.
- ¹¹ And I will <u>establish</u> my <u>covenant</u> with you, <u>neither</u> shall <u>all flesh</u> be <u>cut</u> <u>off any more</u> by the <u>waters</u> of a <u>flood</u>; <u>neither</u> shall there <u>any more</u> be a <u>flood</u> to <u>destroy</u> the <u>earth</u>.
- 12 And God said, This is the token of the covenant which I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for perpetual generations:
- 13 I do set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be for a token of a covenant between me and the earth.
- ¹⁴ And it shall come to <u>pass</u>, when I bring a <u>cloud</u> over the <u>earth</u>, that the <u>bow</u> shall be seen in the cloud:
- 15 And I will <u>remember</u> my <u>covenant</u>, which is <u>between</u> me and you and <u>every</u> <u>living creature</u> of <u>all flesh</u>; and the <u>waters</u> shall <u>no</u> <u>more</u> become a <u>flood</u> to <u>destroy</u> <u>all flesh</u>.
- 16 And the <u>bow</u> shall be in the <u>cloud</u>; and I will look upon it, that I may <u>remember</u> the <u>everlasting covenant</u> between <u>God</u> and <u>every</u> <u>living creature</u> of <u>all flesh</u> that is upon the <u>earth</u>.
- 17 And God said unto Noah, This is the token of the covenant, which I have established between me and all flesh that is upon the earth.

- 18 And the sons of Noah, that went forth of the <u>ark</u>, were Shem, and Ham, and Japheth: and Ham is the <u>father</u> of Canaan.
- 19 These are the three sons of **Noah**: and of them was the whole earth overspread.
- 20 And Noah began to be an <u>husbandman</u>, and he <u>planted</u> a <u>vineyard</u>:
- And he <u>drank</u> of the <u>wine</u>, and was <u>drunken</u>; and he was <u>uncovered</u> within his <u>tent</u>.
- 22 And Ham, the father of Canaan, saw the nakedness of his father, and told his two brethren without.
- 23 And Shem and Japheth took a garment, and <u>laid</u> it upon both their <u>shoulders</u>, and <u>went backward</u>, and <u>covered</u> the <u>nakedness</u> of their <u>father</u>; and their <u>faces</u> were <u>backward</u>, and they saw <u>not</u> their father's nakedness.
- 24 And Noah awoke from his wine, and knew what his younger son had done unto him.
- 25 And he said, <u>Cursed</u> be <u>Canaan</u>; a <u>servant</u> of <u>servants</u> shall he be unto his <u>brethren</u>.
- ²⁶ And he said, <u>Blessed</u> be the <u>LORD God</u> of <u>Shem</u>; and <u>Canaan</u> shall be his <u>servant</u>.
- 27 God shall enlarge Japheth, and he shall dwell in the tents of Shem; and Canaan shall be his servant.
- 28 And Noah lived after the flood three hundred and fifty years.
- ²⁹ And all the days of Noah were nine hundred and fifty years: and he died.

- Now these are the <u>generations</u> of the sons of Noah, Shem, Ham, and Japheth: and unto them were sons <u>born after</u> the <u>flood</u>.
- 2 The sons of Japheth; Gomer, and Magog, and Madai, and Javan, and Tubal, and Meshech, and Tiras.
- 3 And the sons of Gomer; *Ashkenaz*, and Riphath, and Togarmah.
- ⁴ And the sons of Javan; Elishah, and Tarshish, Kittim, and Dodanim.
- 5 By these were the <u>isles</u> of the **Gentiles** <u>divided</u> in their <u>lands</u>; every one <u>after</u> his <u>tongue</u>, <u>after</u> their <u>families</u>, in their <u>nations</u>.
- 6 And the sons of Ham; Cush, and Mizraim, and Phut, and Canaan.
- ⁷ And the sons of Cush; Seba, and Havilah, and Sabtah, and Raamah, and Sabtechah: and the sons of Raamah; Sheba, and Dedan.
- 8 And **Cush** begat *Nimrod*: he began to be a *mighty* one in the earth.
- 9 He was a *mighty* <u>hunter</u> *before* the **LORD**: wherefore it is said, Even as **Nimrod** the *mighty* hunter before the **LORD**.
- 10 And the beginning of his <u>kingdom</u> was **Babel**, and **Erech**, and **Accad**, and **Calneh**, in the land of **Shinar**.
- 11 Out of that land went forth Asshur, and builded Nineveh, and the city Rehoboth, and Calah,
- 12 And Resen between Nineveh and Calah: the same is a *great* city.
- ¹³ And Mizraim begat Ludim, and Anamim, and Lehabim, and Naphtuhim,
- ¹⁴ And Pathrusim, and Casluhim, (out of whom came Philistim,) and Caphtorim.
- ¹⁵ And Canaan begat Sidon his first born, and Heth,
- 16 And the *Jebusite*, and the *Amorite*, and the *Girgasite*,
- ¹⁷ And the *Hivite*, and the *Arkite*, and the *Sinite*,
- 18 And the *Arvadite*, and the *Zemarite*, and the *Hamathite*: and *afterward* were the <u>families</u> of the Canaanites <u>spread</u> *abroad*.
- 19 And the <u>border</u> of the Canaanites was from Sidon, as thou comest to Gerar, unto Gaza; as thou goest, unto Sodom, and Gomorrah, and Admah, and Zeboim, even unto Lasha.

- 20 These are the sons of **Ham**, *after* their <u>families</u>, *after* their <u>tongues</u>, in their <u>countries</u>, and in their <u>nations</u>.
- 21 Unto **Shem** also, the <u>father</u> of *all* the children of *Eber*, the brother of <u>Japheth</u> the <u>elder</u>, even to him were children <u>born</u>.
- 22 The children of Shem; Elam, and Asshur, and Arphaxad, and Lud, and Aram.
- 23 And the children of **Aram**; **Uz**, and **Hul**, and **Gether**, and **Mash**.
- ²⁴ And Arphaxad begat Salah; and Salah begat Eber.
- 25 And unto **Eber** were born <u>two</u> sons: the name of one was **Peleg**; for in his <u>days</u> was the <u>earth divided</u>; and his brother's name was **Joktan**.
- ²⁶ And Joktan begat Almodad, and Sheleph, and Hazarmaveth, and Jerah,
- 27 And Hadoram, and Uzal, and Diklah,
- 28 And Obal, and Abimael, and Sheba,
- 29 And *Ophir*, and *Havilah*, and Jobab: *all* these were the sons of Joktan.
- 30 And their <u>dwelling</u> was from <u>Mesha</u>, as thou goest unto <u>Sephar</u> a <u>mount</u> of the *east*.
- 31 These are the sons of **Shem**, *after* their <u>families</u>, *after* their <u>tongues</u>, in their <u>lands</u>, *after* their <u>nations</u>.
- 32 These are the <u>families</u> of the sons of **Noah**, *after* their <u>generations</u>, in their <u>nations</u>: and by these were the nations <u>divided</u> in the <u>earth</u> *after* the <u>flood</u>.

- And the whole earth was of one language, and of one speech.
- ² And it came to <u>pass</u>, as they <u>journeyed</u> from the <u>east</u>, that they <u>found</u> a <u>plain</u> in the <u>land</u> of <u>Shinar</u>; and they <u>dwelt</u> there.
- 3 And they said one to another, Go to, let us make <u>brick</u>, and <u>burn</u> them *thoroughly*. And they had <u>brick</u> for <u>stone</u>, and <u>slime</u> had they for <u>morter</u>.
- ⁴ And they said, Go to, let us <u>build</u> us a <u>city</u> and a <u>tower</u>, whose <u>top</u> may <u>reach</u> unto <u>heaven</u>; and let us make us a name, lest we be <u>scattered</u> <u>abroad</u> upon the face of the <u>whole</u> earth.
- 5 And the LORD came down to see the <u>city</u> and the <u>tower</u>, which the children of <u>men builded</u>.
- 6 And the LORD said, Behold, the *people* is <u>one</u>, and they have all <u>one language</u>; and this they begin to do: and now <u>nothing</u> will be <u>restrained</u> from them, which they have <u>imagined</u> to do.
- ⁷ **Go** to, let us go *down*, and there *confound* their <u>language</u>, that they may <u>not understand</u> one another's speech.
- So the LORD <u>scattered</u> them *abroad* from thence upon the <u>face</u> of *all* the <u>earth</u>: and they left *off* to <u>build</u> the <u>city</u>.
- Therefore is the <u>name</u> of it called **Babel**; because the **LORD** did there <u>confound</u> the <u>language</u> of *all* the <u>earth</u>: and from thence did the **LORD** <u>scatter</u> them *abroad* upon the <u>face</u> of *all* the earth.
- 10 These are the <u>generations</u> of **Shem**: **Shem** was an <u>hundred years old</u>, and begat **Arphaxad** <u>two</u> years *after* the flood:
- 11 And Shem lived after he begat Arphaxad five hundred years, and begat sons and daughters.
- 12 And **Arphaxad** lived <u>five and thirty years</u>, and begat **Salah**:
- 13 And Arphaxad lived after he begat Salah four hundred and three years, and begat sons and daughters.
- ¹⁴ And Salah lived thirty years, and begat Eber.
- ¹⁵ And Salah lived after he begat Eber four hundred and three years, and begat sons and daughters.
- 16 And Eber lived four and thirty years, and begat Peleg:
- 17 And Eber lived after he begat Peleg four hundred and thirty years, and begat sons and daughters.
- ¹⁸ And Peleg lived thirty years, and begat Reu:

- ¹⁹ And Peleg lived after he begat Reu two hundred and nine years, and begat sons and daughters.
- And Reu lived two and thirty years, and begat Serug:
- 21 And Reu lived after he begat Serug two hundred and seven years, and begat sons and daughters.
- 22 And Serug lived thirty years, and begat Nahor:
- 23 And Serug lived *after* he begat Nahor two hundred years, and begat sons and daughters.
- 24 And Nahor lived <u>nine and twenty years</u>, and begat **Terah**:
- 25 And Nahor lived *after* he begat **Terah** an <u>hundred and nineteen years</u>, and begat sons and daughters.
- ²⁶ And Terah lived <u>seventy years</u>, and begat *Abram*, Nahor, and Haran.
- 27 Now these are the generations of Terah: Terah begat Abram, Nahor, and Haran; and Haran begat Lot.
- 28 And Haran died before his father Terah in the land of his nativity, in Ur of the Chaldees.
- 29 And *Abram* and **Nahor** took them <u>wives</u>: the name of **Abram's** <u>wife</u> was *Sarai*, and the name of **Nahor's** wife, **Milcah**, the daughter of **Haran**, the <u>father</u> of **Milcah**, and the father of **Iscah**.
- 30 But Sarai was barren; she had no child.
- 31 And Terah took Abram his son, and Lot the son of Haran his son's son, and Sarai his daughter in law, his son Abram's wife; and they went forth with them from Ur of the Chaldees, to go into the land of Canaan; and they came unto Haran, and dwelt there.
- 32 And the <u>days</u> of <u>Terah</u> were <u>two hundred and five years</u>: and <u>Terah</u> <u>died</u> in <u>Haran</u>.

- Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:
- ² And I will *make* of thee a *great <u>nation</u>*, and I will *bless* thee, and make thy *name great*, and thou shalt be a *blessing*.
- ³ And I will <u>bless</u> them that <u>bless</u> thee, and <u>curse</u> him that <u>curseth</u> thee: and <u>in thee shall all families</u> of the <u>earth</u> be <u>blessed</u>.
- 4 So Abram <u>departed</u>, as the LORD had spoken unto him; and Lot went with him: and Abram was <u>seventy</u> and five years old when he departed *out* of Haran.
- ⁵ And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go into the land of Canaan; and into the land of Canaan they came.
- 6 And Abram passed through the land unto the place of Sichem, unto the plain of Moreh. And the Canaanite was then in the land.
- And the LORD <u>appeared</u> unto Abram, and said, Unto thy <u>seed</u> will I <u>give</u> this <u>land</u>: and there <u>builded</u> he an <u>altar</u> unto the LORD, who <u>appeared</u> unto him.
- And he <u>removed</u> from thence unto a <u>mountain</u> on the <u>east</u> of <u>Bethel</u>, and <u>pitched</u> his <u>tent</u>, having <u>Bethel</u> on the <u>west</u>, and <u>Hai</u> on the <u>east</u>. and there he <u>builded</u> an <u>altar</u> unto the <u>LORD</u>, and <u>called</u> upon the <u>name</u> of the <u>LORD</u>.
- 9 And **Abram** journeyed, going on still *toward* the *south*.
- ¹⁰ And there was a <u>famine</u> in the land: and <u>Abram</u> went <u>down</u> into <u>Egypt</u> to <u>sojourn</u> there; for the famine was <u>grievous</u> in the land.
- ¹¹ And it came to <u>pass</u>, when he was come <u>near</u> to <u>enter</u> into <u>Egypt</u>, that he said unto <u>Sarai</u> his <u>wife</u>, Behold now, I <u>know</u> that thou art a <u>fair woman</u> to look upon:
- 12 Therefore it shall come to <u>pass</u>, when the <u>Egyptians</u> shall see thee, that they shall say, This is his <u>wife</u>: and they will <u>kill</u> me, but they will <u>save</u> thee <u>alive</u>.
- 13 Say, I <u>pray</u> thee, thou art my *sister*: that it may be <u>well</u> with me for thy sake; and my <u>soul</u> shall <u>live</u> because of thee.

- ¹⁴ And it came to <u>pass</u>, that, when **Abram** was come into **Egypt**, the **Egyptians** beheld the <u>woman</u> that she was <u>very fair</u>.
- 15 The <u>princes</u> also of <u>Pharaoh</u> saw her, and <u>commended</u> her <u>before Pharaoh</u>: and the <u>woman</u> was taken into <u>Pharaoh</u>'s house.
- 16 And he <u>entreated Abram well</u> for her sake: and he had <u>sheep</u>, and <u>oxen</u>, and he <u>asses</u>, and <u>menservants</u>, and <u>maidservants</u>, and she <u>asses</u>, and <u>camels</u>.
- ¹⁷ And the LORD <u>plagued</u> Pharaoh and his <u>house</u> with <u>great plagues</u> because of Sarai Abram's <u>wife</u>.
- ¹⁸ And Pharaoh called Abram and said, What is this that thou hast done unto me? why didst thou not tell
 me that she was thy wife?
- 19 Why saidst thou, She is my *sister*? so I might have taken her to me *to <u>wife</u>*: now therefore behold thy wife, take her, and *go* thy <u>way</u>.
- 20 And Pharaoh commanded his men concerning him: and they sent him away, and his wife, and all that he had.

- And Abram went up out of Egypt, he, and his wife, and all that he had, and Lot with him, into the south.
- ² And Abram was very <u>rich</u> in <u>cattle</u>, in <u>silver</u>, and in <u>gold</u>.
- 3 And he went on his <u>journeys</u> from the *south* even to **Bethel**, unto the place where his <u>tent</u> had been at the beginning, between **Bethel** and **Hai**;
- 4 Unto the place of the <u>altar</u>, which he had make there at the <u>first</u>: and there <u>Abram called</u> on the <u>name</u> of the <u>LORD</u>.
- ⁵ And Lot also, which went with Abram, had flocks, and herds, and tents.
- 6 And the <u>land</u> was <u>not</u> able to <u>bear</u> them, that they might <u>dwell</u> together: for their <u>substance</u> was <u>great</u>, so that they could <u>not</u> dwell together.
- And there was a <u>strife</u> between the <u>herdmen</u> of <u>Abram's cattle</u> and the herdmen of <u>Lot's</u> cattle: and the <u>Canaanite</u> and the <u>Perizzite</u> dwelled then in the land.
- ⁸ And Abram said unto Lot, Let there be <u>no strife</u>, I <u>pray</u> thee, between me and thee, and between my <u>herdmen</u> and thy herdmen; for we be brethren.
- 9 Is <u>not</u> the *whole* <u>land</u> <u>before</u> thee? <u>separate</u> thyself, I <u>pray</u> thee, from me: if thou wilt take the <u>left hand</u>, then I will go to the right; or if thou depart to the right hand, then I will go to the left.
- 10 And Lot lifted up his eyes, and beheld all the plain of Jordan, that it was well watered every where, before the LORD destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah, even as the garden of the LORD, like the land of Egypt, as thou comest unto Zoar.
- 11 Then Lot chose him all the plain of Jordan; and Lot journeyed east: and they separated themselves the one from the other.
- 12 **Abram** dwelled in the land of **Canaan**, and **Lot** dwelled in the cities of the plain, and pitched his tent toward Sodom.
- 13 But the men of **Sodom** were <u>wicked</u> and <u>sinners</u> before the **LORD** exceedingly.
- 14 And the LORD said unto Abram, after that Lot was separated from him, Lift up now thine eyes, and look from the place where thou art northward, and southward, and eastward, and westward.
- 15 For all the land which thou seest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed for ever.
- 16 And I will make thy <u>seed</u> as the <u>dust</u> of the <u>earth</u>: so that if a <u>man</u> can <u>number</u> the dust of the earth, then shall thy seed also be numbered.
- 17 Arise, walk through the land in the length of it and in the breadth of it; for I will give it unto thee.
- 18 Then Abram removed his tent, and came and dwelt in the plain of Mamre, which is in Hebron, and built there an altar unto the LORD.

- And it came to <u>pass</u> in the <u>days</u> of <u>Amraphel</u> king of <u>Shinar</u>, <u>Arioch</u> king of <u>Ellasar</u>, <u>Chedorlaomer</u> king of <u>Elam</u>, and <u>Tidal</u> king of <u>nations</u>;
- 2 That these made war with Bera king of Sodom, and with Birsha king of Gomorrah, Shinab king of Admah, and Shemeber king of Zeboiim, and the king of Bela, which is Zoar.
- 3 All these were joined together in the vale of Siddim, which is the salt sea.
- 4 Twelve years they served Chedorlaomer, and in the thirteenth year they rebelled.
- 5 And in the <u>fourteenth year</u> came <u>Chedorlaomer</u>, and the <u>kings</u> that were with him, and <u>smote</u> the <u>Rephaims</u> in <u>Ashteroth Karnaim</u>, and the <u>Zuzims</u> in <u>Ham</u>, and the <u>Emins</u> in <u>Shaveh Kiriathaim</u>,
- 6 And the Horites in their mount Seir, unto Elparan, which is by the wilderness.
- ⁷ And they <u>returned</u>, and came to <u>Enmishpat</u>, which is <u>Kadesh</u>, and <u>smote</u> <u>all</u> the <u>country</u> of the <u>Amalekites</u>, and also the <u>Amorites</u>, that <u>dwelt</u> in <u>Hazezontamar</u>.
- And there went out the king of Sodom, and the king of Gomorrah, and the king of Admah, and the king of Zeboiim, and the king of Bela (the same is Zoar;) and they joined battle with them in the vale of Siddim;
- ⁹ With Chedorlaomer the king of Elam, and with Tidal king of nations, and Amraphel king of Shinar, and Arioch king of Ellasar; four kings with five.
- 10 And the <u>vale</u> of **Siddim** was full of <u>slimepits</u>; and the kings of **Sodom** and **Gomorrah** <u>fled</u>, and <u>fell</u> there; and they that <u>remained</u> fled to the <u>mountain</u>.
- And they took all the goods of Sodom and Gomorrah, and all their victuals, and went their way.
- 12 And they took Lot, Abram's brother's son, who dwelt in Sodom, and his goods, and departed.
- ¹³ And there came <u>one</u> that had <u>escaped</u>, and told <u>Abram</u> the <u>Hebrew</u>, for he <u>dwelt</u> in the <u>plain</u> of <u>Mamre</u> the <u>Amorite</u>, brother of <u>Eshcol</u>, and brother of <u>Aner</u>: and these were <u>confederate</u> with <u>Abram</u>.
- 14 And when **Abram** heard that his brother was taken <u>captive</u>, he <u>armed</u> his <u>trained servants</u>, <u>born</u> in his <u>own house</u>, <u>three hundred and eighteen</u>, and <u>pursued</u> them unto **Dan**.
- 15 And he <u>divided</u> himself <u>against</u> them, he and his <u>servants</u>, by <u>night</u>, and <u>smote</u> them, and <u>pursued</u> them unto <u>Hobah</u>, which is on the <u>left hand</u> of <u>Damascus</u>.
- 16 And he brought back all the goods, and also brought again his brother Lot, and his goods, and the women also, and the people.

- 17 And the king of **Sodom** went *out* to <u>meet</u> him *after* his <u>return</u> from the <u>slaughter</u> of **Chedorlaomer**, and of the kings that were with him, at the <u>valley</u> of **Shaveh**, which is the <u>king's dale</u>.
- 18 And *Melchizedek* king of *Salem* brought forth <u>bread</u> and <u>wine</u>: and he was the <u>priest</u> of the *most high* God.
- ¹⁹ And he <u>blessed</u> him, and said, <u>Blessed</u> be <u>Abram</u> of the <u>most high</u> God, <u>possessor</u> of <u>heaven</u> and <u>earth</u>:
- ²⁰ And <u>blessed</u> be the *most high* God, which hath <u>delivered</u> thine <u>enemies</u> into thy <u>hand</u>. And he *gave* him <u>tithes</u> of all.
- 21 And the king of Sodom said unto Abram, Give me the persons, and take the goods to thyself.
- ²² And Abram said to the king of Sodom, I have <u>lift</u> up mine <u>hand</u> unto the LORD, the <u>most high</u> God, the <u>possessor</u> of <u>heaven</u> and <u>earth</u>,
- 23 That I will <u>not</u> take from a <u>thread</u> even to a <u>shoelatchet</u>, and that I will <u>not</u> take <u>any thing</u> that is thine, lest thou shouldest say, *I have made Abram <u>rich</u>*.
- ²⁴ <u>Save</u> only that which the <u>young men</u> have <u>eaten</u>, and the <u>portion</u> of the men which went with me, <u>Aner</u>, <u>Eshcol</u>, and <u>Mamre</u>; let them take their portion.

- 1 After these things the word of the LORD came unto Abram in a vision, saying, Fear not, Abram: I am thy shield, and thy exceeding great reward.
- ² And Abram said, LORD God, what wilt thou give me, seeing I go childless, and the <u>steward</u> of my <u>house</u> is this <u>Eliezer</u> of <u>Damascus</u>?
- 3 And Abram said, Behold, to me thou hast given no seed: and, lo, one born in my house is mine heir.
- ⁴ And, behold, the <u>word</u> of the <u>LORD</u> came unto him, saying, This shall <u>not</u> be thine <u>heir</u>; but he that shall come forth out of thine own <u>bowels</u> shall be thine heir.
- 5 And he brought him forth *abroad*, and said, Look now *toward* <u>heaven</u>, and tell the <u>stars</u>, if thou be able to <u>number</u> them: and he said unto him, So shall thy <u>seed</u> be.
- 6 And he *believed* in the LORD; and he <u>counted</u> it to him for <u>righteousness</u>.
- ⁷ And he said unto him, I am the LORD that brought thee *out* of Ur of the Chaldees, to *give* thee this <u>land</u> to inherit it.
- 8 And he said, LORD God, whereby shall I know that I shall inherit it?
- 9 And he said unto him, Take me an <u>heifer</u> of <u>three years old</u>, and a she <u>goat</u> of <u>three years old</u>, and a <u>ram</u> of <u>three years old</u>, and a <u>turtledove</u>, and a <u>young pigeon</u>.
- 10 And he took unto him *all* these, and <u>divided</u> them in the midst, and <u>laid each piece one against another</u>: but the <u>birds</u> divided he <u>not</u>.
- ¹¹ And when the <u>fowls</u> came <u>down</u> upon the <u>carcases</u>, <u>Abram drove</u> them <u>away</u>.
- 12 And when the <u>sun</u> was going *down*, a *deep* <u>sleep fell</u> upon **Abram**; and, lo, an <u>horror</u> of <u>great darkness</u> fell upon him.
- ¹³ And he said unto Abram, Know of a <u>surety</u> that thy <u>seed</u> shall be a <u>stranger</u> in a <u>land</u> that is <u>not</u> theirs, and shall <u>serve</u> them; and they shall <u>afflict</u> them <u>four hundred years</u>;
- 14 And also that <u>nation</u>, whom they shall <u>serve</u>, will I <u>judge</u>: and <u>afterward</u> shall they come <u>out</u> with <u>great substance</u>.
- 15 And thou shalt go to thy <u>fathers</u> in <u>peace</u>; thou shalt be <u>buried</u> in a <u>good old age</u>.
- 16 But in the fourth generation they shall come hither again: for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet full.

- 17 And it came to <u>pass</u>, that, when the <u>sun</u> went *down*, and it was <u>dark</u>, behold a <u>smoking <u>furnace</u>, and a <u>burning lamp</u> that <u>passed</u> between those <u>pieces</u>.</u>
- 18 In the same day the LORD made a <u>covenant</u> with Abram, saying, Unto thy <u>seed</u> have I <u>given</u> this <u>land</u>, from the <u>river</u> of Egypt unto the <u>great river</u>, the <u>river</u> Euphrates:
- 19 The **Kenites**, and the **Kenizzites**, and the **Kadmonites**,
- 20 And the Hittites, and the Perizzites, and the Rephaims,
- 21 And the **Amorites**, and the **Canaanites**, and the **Girgashites**, and the **Jebusites**.

- Now Sarai Abram's wife bare him no children: and she had an handmaid, an Egyptian, whose name was Hagar.
- ² And Sarai said unto Abram, Behold now, the LORD hath <u>restrained</u> me from <u>bearing</u>: I <u>pray</u> thee, go in unto my <u>maid</u>; it may be that I may <u>obtain</u> children by her. And Abram hearkened to the <u>voice</u> of Sarai.
- ³ And Sarai Abram's wife took Hagar her maid the Egyptian, after Abram had dwelt ten years in the land of Canaan, and gave her to her husband Abram to be his wife.
- ⁴ And he went in unto Hagar, and she <u>conceived</u>: and when she saw that she had conceived, her <u>mistress</u> was <u>despised</u> in her <u>eyes</u>.
- ⁵ And Sarai said unto Abram, My <u>wrong</u> be upon thee: I have given my <u>maid</u> into thy <u>bosom</u>; and when she saw that she had <u>conceived</u>, I was <u>despised</u> in her <u>eyes</u>: the <u>LORD</u> <u>judge</u> between me and thee.
- 6 But **Abram** said unto **Sarai**, Behold, thy <u>maid</u> is in thine <u>hand</u>; do to her as it <u>pleaseth</u> thee. And when **Sarai** <u>dealt</u> <u>hardly</u> with her, she <u>fled</u> from her <u>face</u>.
- And the angel of the LORD found her by a fountain of water in the wilderness, by the fountain in the way
 to Shur.
- 8 And he said, Hagar, Sarai's maid, whence camest thou? and whither wilt thou go? And she said, I flee from the face of my mistress Sarai.
- 9 And the **angel** of the **LORD** said unto her, Return to thy mistress, and submit thyself *under* her hands.
- ¹⁰ And the angel of the LORD said unto her, I will multiply thy seed exceedingly, that it shall not be numbered for multitude.
- 11 And the **angel** of the **LORD** said unto her, Behold, thou art *with* **child** and shalt **bear** a **son**, and shalt call his <u>name</u> **Ishmael**; because the **LORD** hath heard thy <u>affliction</u>.
- 12 And he will be a *wild* man; his hand will be <u>against every</u> man, and every man's <u>hand</u> <u>against</u> him; and he shall <u>dwell</u> in the <u>presence</u> of <u>all</u> his brethren.
- ¹³ And she called the <u>name</u> of the <u>LORD</u> that spake unto her, Thou <u>God</u> seest me: for she said, Have I also here looked after him that seeth me?
- Wherefore the well was called Beerlahairoi; behold, it is between Kadesh and Bered.
- ¹⁵ And Hagar <u>bare</u> Abram a son: and Abram called his son's <u>name</u>, which Hagar bare, Ishmael.
- ¹⁶ And Abram was <u>fourscore and six years</u> old, when Hagar <u>bare</u> Ishmael to Abram.

- And when Abram was <u>ninety years old and nine</u>, the LORD <u>appeared</u> to Abram, and said unto him, I am the Almighty God; <u>walk</u> <u>before</u> me, and be thou <u>perfect</u>.
- ² And I will make my <u>covenant</u> between me and thee, and will <u>multiply</u> thee <u>exceedingly</u>.
- 3 And Abram <u>fell</u> on his <u>face</u>: and <u>God talked</u> with him, saying,
- ⁴ As for me, behold, my <u>covenant</u> is with thee, and thou shalt be a <u>father</u> of many <u>nations</u>.
- 5 Neither shall thy name any more be called **Abram**, but thy name shall be **Abraham**, for a <u>father</u> of <u>many</u> nations have I made thee.
- 6 And I will make thee *exceeding <u>fruitful</u>*, and I will make <u>nations</u> of thee, and <u>kings</u> shall *come out* of thee.
- And I will <u>establish</u> my <u>covenant</u> between me and thee and thy <u>seed</u> <u>after</u> thee in their <u>generations</u> for an <u>everlasting</u> covenant, to be a <u>God</u> unto thee, and to thy seed <u>after</u> thee.
- 8 And I will *give* unto thee, and to thy <u>seed</u> *after* thee, the <u>land</u> wherein thou art a <u>stranger</u>, *all* the land of **Canaan**, for an *everlasting possession*, and I will be their **God**.
- 9 And God said unto Abraham, Thou shalt keep my covenant therefore, thou, and thy seed after thee in their generations.
- 10 This is my <u>covenant</u>, which ye shall <u>keep</u>, between me and you and thy <u>seed</u> <u>after</u> thee; <u>Every man</u> <u>child</u> <u>among you shall be <u>circumcised</u>.</u>
- 11 And ye shall <u>circumcise</u> the <u>flesh</u> of your <u>foreskin</u>, and it shall be a <u>token</u> of the <u>covenant</u> <u>betwixt</u> me and you.
- 12 And he that is <u>eight days old</u> shall be <u>circumcised</u> among you, <u>every man child</u> in your <u>generations</u>, he that is <u>born</u> in the <u>house</u>, or <u>bought</u> with <u>money</u> of <u>any stranger</u>, which is <u>not</u> of thy <u>seed</u>.
- 13 He that is <u>born</u> in thy <u>house</u>, and he that is <u>bought</u> with thy <u>money</u>, *must needs* be <u>circumcised</u>: and my <u>covenant</u> shall be in your <u>flesh</u> for an *everlasting* covenant.
- 14 And the <u>uncircumcised man child</u> whose <u>flesh</u> of his <u>foreskin</u> is <u>not *circumcised*</u>, that <u>soul</u> shall be <u>cut</u> off from his people; he hath <u>broken</u> my <u>covenant</u>.
- ¹⁵ And God said unto Abraham, As for Sarai thy wife, thou shalt not call her name Sarai, but Sarah shall her name be.

- 16 And I will <u>bless</u> her, and *give* thee a **son** also of her: yea, I will <u>bless</u> her, and she shall be a <u>mother</u> of <u>nations</u>; <u>kings</u> of people shall be of her.
- 17 Then **Abraham** <u>fell</u> upon his <u>face</u>, and <u>laughed</u>, and said in his <u>heart</u>, Shall a child be <u>born</u> unto him that is an <u>hundred years old</u>? and shall **Sarah**, that is <u>ninety years old</u>, <u>bear</u>?
- ¹⁸ And Abraham said unto God, O that Ishmael might <u>live</u> before thee!
- 19 And God said, Sarah thy wife shall bear thee a son indeed; and thou shalt call his name Isaac. and I will establish my covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, and with his seed after him.
- 20 And as for **Ishmael**, I have heard thee: Behold, I have <u>blessed</u> him, and will make him <u>fruitful</u>, and will <u>multiply</u> him <u>exceedingly</u>, <u>twelve princes</u> shall he <u>beget</u>, and I will make him a <u>great nation</u>.
- 21 But my <u>covenant</u> will I <u>establish</u> with **Isaac**, which **Sarah** shall <u>bear</u> unto thee at this <u>set time</u> in the <u>next</u> <u>year</u>.
- 22 And he left *off* talking with him, and God went up from Abraham.
- 23 And Abraham took Ishmael his son, and all that were <u>born</u> in his <u>house</u>, and all that were <u>bought</u> with his <u>money</u>, <u>every male</u> among the <u>men</u> of Abraham's house; and <u>circumcised</u> the <u>flesh</u> of their <u>foreskin</u> in the <u>selfsame day</u>, as God had said unto him.
- 24 And Abraham was <u>ninety years old and nine</u>, when he was <u>circumcised</u> in the <u>flesh</u> of his <u>foreskin</u>.
- 25 And Ishmael his son was thirteen years old, when he was circumcised in the flesh of his foreskin.
- 26 In the *selfsame* day was **Abraham** circumcised, and **Ishmael** his son.
- 27 And *all* the <u>men</u> of his <u>house</u>, <u>born</u> in the house, and <u>bought</u> with <u>money</u> of the <u>stranger</u>, were circumcised with him.

- And the LORD <u>appeared</u> unto him in the <u>plains</u> of <u>Mamre</u>: and he <u>sat</u> in the <u>tent door</u> in the <u>heat</u> of the <u>day</u>;
- ² And he <u>lift up</u> his <u>eyes</u> and looked, and, lo, <u>three men stood</u> by him: and when he saw them, he <u>ran</u> to <u>meet</u> them from the <u>tent door</u>, and <u>bowed</u> himself *toward* the <u>ground</u>,
- ³ And said, My LORD, if now I have <u>found favour</u> in thy <u>sight</u>, <u>pass not away</u>, I pray thee, from thy <u>servant</u>:
- Let a little water, I pray you, be fetched, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree:
- ⁵ And I will <u>fetch</u> a <u>morsel</u> of <u>bread</u>, and <u>comfort</u> ye your <u>hearts</u>; <u>after</u> that ye shall <u>pass</u> on: for therefore are ye come to your <u>servant</u>. And they said, So do, as thou hast said.
- 6 And Abraham <u>hastened</u> into the <u>tent</u> unto Sarah, and said, Make <u>ready quickly three measures</u> of <u>fine meal, knead</u> it, and make <u>cakes</u> upon the <u>hearth</u>.
- ⁷ And Abraham <u>ran</u> unto the <u>herd</u>, and <u>fetcht</u> a <u>calf tender</u> and <u>good</u>, and gave it unto a <u>young man</u>; and he hasted to dress it.
- 8 And he took <u>butter</u>, and <u>milk</u>, and the <u>calf</u> which he had <u>dressed</u>, and <u>set</u> it <u>before</u> them; and he <u>stood</u> by them <u>under</u> the <u>tree</u>, and <u>they did eat</u>.
- 9 And they said unto him, Where is **Sarah** thy wife? And he said, Behold, in the tent.
- 10 And he said, I will *certainly* <u>return</u> unto thee according to the <u>time</u> of <u>life</u>; and, lo, <u>Sarah</u> thy <u>wife</u> shall have a son. And <u>Sarah</u> heard it in the <u>tent door</u>, which was *behind* him.
- 11 Now **Abraham** and **Sarah** were <u>old</u> and <u>well stricken</u> in <u>age</u>; and it <u>ceased</u> to be with **Sarah** *after* the <u>manner</u> of <u>women</u>.
- 12 Therefore **Sarah** <u>laughed</u> within herself, saying, *After* I am <u>waxed old</u> shall I have <u>pleasure</u>, my <u>lord</u> being old *also*?
- ¹³ And the LORD said unto Abraham, Wherefore did Sarah <u>laugh</u>, saying, Shall I of a <u>surety bear</u> a child, which am <u>old</u>?
- 14 Is any thing too hard for the LORD? At the time appointed I will return unto thee, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son.
- 15 Then Sarah denied, saying, I laughed not; for she was afraid. And he said, Nay; but thou didst laugh.

- ¹⁶ And the men rose up from thence, and looked toward Sodom: and Abraham went with them to bring them on the way.
- ¹⁷ And the LORD said, Shall I <u>hide</u> from Abraham that <u>thing</u> which I do;
- ¹⁸ Seeing that Abraham shall surely become a great and mighty nation, and all the nations of the earth shall be blessed in him?
- 19 For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment; that the LORD may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him.
- ²⁰ And the LORD said, Because the <u>cry</u> of Sodom and Gomorrah is <u>great</u>, and because their <u>sin</u> is <u>very grievous</u>;
- 21 I will go *down* now, and see whether they have done altogether according to the <u>cry</u> of it, which is come unto me; and if not, I will know.
- ²² And the men turned their faces from thence, and went toward Sodom: but Abraham stood yet before the LORD.
- And Abraham drew near, and said, Wilt thou also destroy the righteous with the wicked?
- ²⁴ Peradventure there be <u>fifty righteous</u> within the <u>city</u>: wilt thou also <u>destroy</u> and <u>not spare</u> the <u>place</u> for the fifty righteous that are therein?
- 25 That be far from thee to do after this manner, to slay the righteous with the wicked: and that the righteous should be as the wicked, that be far from thee: Shall not the Judge of all the earth do right?
- 26 And the LORD said, If I find in Sodom fifty righteous within the city, then I will spare all the place for their sakes.
- ²⁷ And Abraham answered and said, Behold now, I have taken upon me to speak unto the LORD, which am but dust and ashes:
- Peradventure there shall <u>lack five</u> of the <u>fifty righteous</u>: wilt thou <u>destroy</u> *all* the <u>city</u> for lack of five? And he said, If I <u>find</u> there <u>forty and five</u>, I will <u>not destroy</u> it. ²⁹ And he spake unto him yet <u>again</u>, and said, Peradventure there shall be <u>forty found</u> there. And he said, I will <u>not</u> do it for <u>forty's</u> sake. ³⁰ And he said unto him, Oh let <u>not</u> the **LORD** be <u>angry</u>, and I will speak: Peradventure there shall <u>thirty</u> be <u>found</u> there. And he said, I will <u>not</u> do it, if I <u>find thirty</u> there. ³¹ And he said, Behold now, I have taken upon me to speak unto the **LORD**: Peradventure there shall be <u>twenty found</u> there. And he said, I will <u>not destroy</u> it for <u>twenty's</u> sake. ³² And he said, Oh let <u>not</u> the **LORD** be <u>angry</u>, and I will speak yet but this <u>once</u>: Peradventure <u>ten</u> shall be <u>found</u> there. And he said, I will <u>not destroy</u> it for <u>ten's</u> sake. ³³ And the **LORD** went his way, as soon as he had left communing with **Abraham**: and **Abraham** returned unto his place.

- And there came two angels to Sodom at even; and Lot sat in the gate of Sodom: and Lot seeing them rose up to meet them; and he bowed himself with his face toward the ground;
- ² And he said, Behold now, my lords, turn in, I pray you, into your servant's house, and tarry all night, and wash your feet, and ye shall rise up early, and go on your ways. And they said, Nay; but we will abide in the street all night.
- And he <u>pressed</u> upon them *greatly*; and they <u>turned</u> in unto him, and <u>entered</u> into his <u>house</u>; and he made them a <u>feast</u>, and did <u>bake</u> <u>unleavened</u> <u>bread</u>, and they did <u>eat</u>.
- ⁴ But before they <u>lay down</u>, the <u>men</u> of the <u>city</u>, even the men of <u>Sodom</u>, <u>compassed</u> the <u>house</u> round, both <u>old</u> and <u>young</u>, all the people from <u>every quarter</u>:
- ⁵ And they called unto Lot, and said unto him, Where are the men which came in to thee this night? bring them out unto us, that we may know them.
- 6 And Lot went *out* at the door unto them, and shut the door *after* him,
- ⁷ And said, I <u>pray</u> you, brethren, do <u>not</u> so <u>wickedly</u>.
- Behold now, I have <u>two daughters</u> which have <u>not known man</u>; let me, I <u>pray</u> you, bring them *out* unto you, and do ye to them as is <u>good</u> in your <u>eyes</u>: only unto these <u>men</u> do <u>nothing</u>; for therefore came they <u>under</u> the <u>shadow</u> of my <u>roof</u>.
- 9 And they said, <u>Stand back</u>. And they said again, This <u>one fellow</u> came in to <u>sojourn</u>, and he will needs be a <u>judge</u>: now will we <u>deal</u> <u>worse</u> with thee, than with them. And they <u>pressed</u> <u>sore</u> upon the <u>man</u>, even <u>Lot</u>, and came <u>near</u> to <u>break</u> the <u>door</u>.
- 10 But the men put forth their hand, and pulled Lot into the house to them, and shut to the door.
- ¹¹ And they <u>smote</u> the <u>men</u> that were at the <u>door</u> of the <u>house</u> with <u>blindness</u>, both *small* and *great*: so that they <u>wearied</u> themselves to <u>find</u> the door.
- 12 And the men said unto Lot, Hast thou here *any* besides? son in *law*, and thy sons, and thy daughters, and whatsoever thou hast in the city, bring them *out* of this place:
- 13 For we will <u>destroy</u> this <u>place</u>, because the <u>cry</u> of them is <u>waxen</u> <u>great before</u> the <u>face</u> of the LORD; and the LORD hath <u>sent</u> us to destroy it.

- ¹⁴ And Lot went out, and spake unto his sons in law, which married his daughters, and said, Up, get you out of this place; for the LORD will destroy this city. But he seemed as one that mocked unto his sons in law.
- ¹⁵ And when the <u>morning arose</u>, then the <u>angels hastened</u> Lot, saying, <u>Arise</u>, take thy <u>wife</u>, and thy <u>two</u> <u>daughters</u>, which are here; lest thou be <u>consumed</u> in the <u>iniquity</u> of the <u>city</u>.
- ¹⁶ And while he <u>lingered</u>, the <u>men laid hold</u> upon his <u>hand</u>, and upon the <u>hand</u> of his <u>wife</u>, and upon the <u>hand</u> of his <u>two daughters</u>; the **LORD** being <u>merciful</u> unto him: and they brought him forth, and <u>set</u> him <u>without</u> the <u>city</u>.
- ¹⁷ And it came to <u>pass</u>, when they had brought them forth abroad, that he said, <u>Escape</u> for thy <u>life</u>; *look* not *behind* thee, <u>neither</u> *stay* thou in *all* the plain; escape to the mountain, lest thou be consumed.
- 18 And **Lot** said unto them, Oh, not so, my **LORD**:
- ¹⁹ Behold now, thy <u>servant</u> hath <u>found grace</u> in thy <u>sight</u>, and thou hast <u>magnified</u> thy <u>mercy</u>, which thou hast shewed unto me in <u>saving</u> my <u>life</u>; and I <u>cannot escape</u> to the <u>mountain</u>, lest some <u>evil</u> take me, and I <u>die</u>:
- ²⁰ Behold now, this <u>city</u> is <u>near</u> to <u>flee</u> unto, and it is a <u>little</u> one: Oh, let me <u>escape</u> thither, (is it <u>not</u> a <u>little</u> one?) and my <u>soul</u> shall <u>live</u>.
- 21 And he said unto him, See, I have <u>accepted</u> thee concerning this <u>thing</u> also, that I will <u>not overthrow</u> this <u>city</u>, for the which thou hast spoken.
- ²² Haste thee, <u>escape</u> thither; for I <u>cannot</u> do <u>anything</u> till thou be come thither. Therefore the <u>name</u> of the <u>city</u> was called **Zoar**.
- 23 The <u>sun</u> was <u>risen</u> upon the <u>earth</u> when <u>Lot entered</u> into <u>Zoar</u>.
- ²⁴ Then the LORD <u>rained</u> upon Sodom and upon Gomorrah <u>brimstone</u> and <u>fire</u> from the LORD <u>out</u> of <u>heaven</u>;
- 25 And he <u>overthrew</u> those <u>cities</u>, and *all* the <u>plain</u>, and *all* the <u>inhabitants</u> of the cities, and that which <u>grew</u> upon the <u>ground</u>.
- 26 But his wife looked back from behind him, and she became a pillar of salt.
- 27 And Abraham gat up early in the morning to the place where he stood before the LORD:
- ²⁸ And he looked toward Sodom and Gomorrah, and toward all the land of the <u>plain</u>, and beheld, and, lo, the smoke of the country went up as the smoke of a furnace.
- 29 And it came to <u>pass</u>, when **God** <u>destroyed</u> the <u>cities</u> of the <u>plain</u>, that **God** <u>remembered</u> **Abraham**, and <u>sent</u> **Lot** *out* of the midst of the <u>overthrow</u>, when he overthrew the cities in the which <u>Lot</u> <u>dwelt</u>.

- 30 And Lot went *up out* of Zoar, and <u>dwelt</u> in the <u>mountain</u>, and his <u>two daughters</u> with him; for he <u>feared</u> to <u>dwell</u> in Zoar: and he dwelt in a <u>cave</u>, he and his two daughters.
- 31 And the <u>firstborn</u> said unto the <u>younger</u>, Our <u>father</u> is <u>old</u>, and there is <u>not</u> a <u>man</u> in the <u>earth</u> to come in unto us <u>after</u> the <u>manner</u> of <u>all</u> the earth:
- 32 Come, let us make our <u>father drink wine</u>, and we will <u>lie</u> with him, that we may <u>preserve seed</u> of our father.
- 33 And they made their <u>father drink wine</u> that <u>night</u>: and the <u>firstborn</u> went in, and <u>lay</u> with her father; and he <u>perceived not</u> when she lay <u>down</u>, <u>nor</u> when she <u>arose</u>.
- 34 And it came to <u>pass</u> on the <u>morrow</u>, that the <u>firstborn</u> said unto the <u>younger</u>, Behold, I <u>lay yesternight</u> with my <u>father</u>: let us make him <u>drink wine</u> this <u>night</u> also; and go thou in, and <u>lie</u> with him, that we may preserve seed of our father.
- 35 And they made their <u>father drink wine</u> that <u>night</u> also: and the <u>younger arose</u>, and <u>lay</u> with him; and he <u>perceived not</u> when she lay <u>down</u>, <u>nor</u> when she <u>arose</u>.
- 36 Thus were both the daughters of **Lot** with child by their <u>father</u>.
- ³⁷ And the <u>first born bare</u> a son, and called his <u>name</u> Moab: the same is the <u>father</u> of the <u>Moabites</u> unto this <u>day</u>.
- 38 And the <u>younger</u>, she also <u>bare</u> a son, and called his <u>name</u> **Benammi**: the same is the <u>father</u> of the children of <u>Ammon</u> unto this <u>day</u>.

- And Abraham journeyed from thence toward the south country, and dwelled between Kadesh and Shur, and sojourned in Gerar.
- ² And **Abraham** said of **Sarah** his <u>wife</u>, She is my sister: and **Abimelech** king of **Gerar** <u>sent</u>, and took **Sarah**.
- 3 But God came to Abimelech in a <u>dream</u> by <u>night</u>, and said to him, Behold, thou art but a <u>dead man</u>, for the <u>woman</u> which thou hast taken; for she is a <u>man's wife</u>.
- ⁴ But Abimelech had <u>not</u> come *near* her: and he said, LORD, wilt thou <u>slay</u> also a <u>righteous nation</u>?
- 5 Said he <u>not</u> unto me, She is my sister? and she, even she herself said, He is my brother: in the <u>integrity</u> of my <u>heart</u> and <u>innocency</u> of my <u>hands</u> have I done this.
- 6 And God said unto him in a <u>dream</u>, Yea, I <u>know</u> that thou didst this in the <u>integrity</u> of thy <u>heart</u>; for I also <u>withheld</u> thee from <u>sinning against</u> me: therefore suffered I thee <u>not</u> to <u>touch</u> her.
- Now therefore <u>restore</u> the <u>man</u> his <u>wife</u>; for he is a <u>prophet</u>, and he shall <u>pray</u> for thee, and thou shalt <u>live</u>: and if thou restore her <u>not</u>, <u>know</u> thou that thou shalt <u>surely die</u>, thou, and <u>all</u> that are thine.
- Therefore Abimelech rose early in the morning, and called all his servants, and told all these things in their ears: and the men were sore afraid.
- Then Abimelech called Abraham, and said unto him, What hast thou done unto us? and what have I offended thee, that thou hast brought on me and on my kingdom a great sin? thou hast done deeds unto me that ought not to be done.
- And Abimelech said unto Abraham, What sawest thou, that thou hast done this thing?
- ¹¹ And Abraham said, Because I thought, Surely the fear of God is not in this place; and they will slay me for my wife's sake.
- 12 And yet <u>indeed</u> she is my sister; she is the daughter of my <u>father</u>, but <u>not</u> the daughter of my <u>mother</u>; and she became my <u>wife</u>.
- 13 And it came to <u>pass</u>, when **God** caused me to <u>wander</u> from my <u>father's house</u>, that I said unto her, This is thy <u>kindness</u> which thou shalt shew unto me; at <u>every place</u> whither we shall come, say of me, **He is my brother**.
- ¹⁴ And Abimelech took <u>sheep</u>, and <u>oxen</u>, and <u>menservants</u>, and <u>womenservants</u>, and <u>gave</u> them unto Abraham, and restored him Sarah his wife.

- 15 And **Abimelech** said, Behold, my <u>land</u> is *before* thee: <u>dwell</u> where it <u>pleaseth</u> thee.
- 16 And unto **Sarah** he said, Behold, I have given thy brother a <u>thousand pieces</u> of <u>silver</u>: behold, he is to thee a <u>covering</u> of the <u>eyes</u>, unto *all* that are with thee, and with *all* <u>other</u>: thus she was <u>reproved</u>.
- 17 So Abraham <u>prayed</u> unto God: and God <u>healed</u> Abimelech, and his <u>wife</u>, and his <u>maidservants</u>; and they <u>bare</u> children.
- 18 For the LORD had *fast* <u>closed</u> *up all* the <u>wombs</u> of the <u>house</u> of <u>Abimelech</u>, because of <u>Sarah</u> <u>Abraham's</u> wife.

- And the LORD visited Sarah as he had said, and the LORD did unto Sarah as he had spoken.
- ² For Sarah <u>conceived</u>, and <u>bare Abraham</u> a son in his <u>old age</u>, at the <u>set time</u> of which <u>God</u> had spoken to him.
- 3 And Abraham called the name of his son that was born unto him, whom Sarah bare to him, Isaac.
- ⁴ And Abraham <u>circumcised</u> his son Isaac being <u>eight days old</u>, as God had <u>commanded</u> him.
- ⁵ And Abraham was an <u>hundred years old</u>, when his son Isaac was born unto him.
- 6 And Sarah said, God hath made me to <u>laugh</u>, so that *all* that hear will laugh with me.
- ⁷ And she said, Who would have said unto Abraham, that Sarah should have given children <u>suck</u>? for I have born him a son in his <u>old age</u>.
- 8 And the child <u>grew</u>, and was <u>weaned</u>: and <u>Abraham</u> made a <u>great feast</u> the <u>same day</u> that <u>Isaac</u> was weaned.
- ⁹ And Sarah saw the son of Hagar the Egyptian, which she had born unto Abraham, mocking.
- 10 Wherefore she said unto **Abraham**, **Cast** *out* this <u>bondwoman</u> and her son: for the son of this bondwoman shall <u>not</u> be <u>heir</u> with my son, even with **Isaac**.
- 11 And the thing was very grievous in Abraham's sight because of his son.
- 12 And God said unto Abraham, Let it <u>not</u> be <u>grievous</u> in thy <u>sight</u> because of the <u>lad</u>, and because of thy <u>bondwoman</u>; in *all* that Sarah hath said unto thee, hearken unto her <u>voice</u>; for in Isaac shall thy <u>seed</u> be <u>called</u>.
- 13 And also of the son of the <u>bondwoman</u> will I make a <u>nation</u>, because he is thy <u>seed</u>.
- 14 And Abraham rose up early in the morning, and took bread, and a bottle of water, and gave it unto Hagar, putting it on her shoulder, and the child, and sent her away: and she departed, and wandered in the wilderness of Beersheba.
- 15 And the <u>water</u> was <u>spent</u> in the <u>bottle</u>, and she <u>cast</u> the child *under* one of the <u>shrubs</u>.
- 16 And she went, and <u>sat</u> her *down* over <u>against</u> him a <u>good way</u> <u>off</u>, as it were a <u>bow shot</u>: for she said, Let me <u>not</u> see the <u>death</u> of the child. And she sat over <u>against</u> him, and <u>lift</u> <u>up</u> her <u>voice</u>, and <u>wept</u>.
- 17 And God heard the <u>voice</u> of the <u>lad</u>; and the <u>angel</u> of God called to <u>Hagar out</u> of <u>heaven</u>, and said unto her, What <u>aileth</u> thee, <u>Hagar? fear not</u>; for God hath heard the <u>voice</u> of the <u>lad</u> where he is.

- 18 Arise, lift up the lad, and hold him in thine hand; for I will make him a great nation.
- 19 And God opened her eyes, and she saw a well of water; and she went, and filled the bottle with water, and gave the lad drink.
- 20 And God was with the lad; and he grew, and dwelt in the wilderness, and became an archer.
- 21 And he <u>dwelt</u> in the <u>wilderness</u> of <u>Paran</u>: and his <u>mother</u> took him a <u>wife</u> *out* of the land of <u>Egypt</u>.
- 22 And it came to <u>pass</u> at that <u>time</u>, that <u>Abimelech</u> and <u>Phichol</u> the <u>chief captain</u> of his host spake unto <u>Abraham</u>, saying, <u>God</u> is with thee in <u>all</u> that thou doest:
- 23 Now therefore <u>swear</u> unto me here by <u>God</u> that thou wilt <u>not deal</u> <u>falsely</u> with me, <u>nor</u> with my son, <u>nor</u> with my son's son: but according to the <u>kindness</u> that I have done unto thee, thou shalt do unto me, and to the <u>land</u> wherein thou hast <u>sojourned</u>.
- 24 And Abraham said, I will swear.
- 25 And Abraham reproved Abimelech because of a well of water, which Abimelech's servants had violently taken away.
- And Abimelech said, I <u>wot</u> not who hath done this <u>thing</u>; <u>neither</u> didst thou tell me, <u>neither</u> yet heard I of it, but *to* <u>day</u>.
- 27 And Abraham took sheep and oxen, and gave them unto Abimelech; and both of them made a covenant.
- And Abraham set seven ewe lambs of the flock by themselves.
- ²⁹ And Abimelech said unto Abraham, What mean these seven ewe lambs which thou hast set by themselves?
- 30 And he said, For these <u>seven ewe lambs</u> shalt thou take of my <u>hand</u>, that they may be a <u>witness</u> unto me, that I have <u>digged</u> this <u>well</u>.
- 31 Wherefore he called that <u>place</u> Beersheba; because there they <u>sware</u> both of them.
- 32 Thus they made a <u>covenant</u> at **Beersheba**: then **Abimelech** <u>rose</u> <u>up</u>, and **Phichol** the <u>chief captain</u> of his host, and they <u>returned</u> into the <u>land</u> of the **Philistines**.
- 33 And Abraham planted a grove in Beersheba, and called there on the name of the LORD, the everlasting God.
- 34 And Abraham sojourned in the Philistines' land many days.

- And it came to <u>pass</u> after these <u>things</u>, that <u>God</u> did <u>tempt</u> <u>Abraham</u>, and said unto him, <u>Abraham</u>: and he said, Behold, here I am.
- ² And he said, Take now thy son, thine only son Isaac, whom thou lovest, and get thee into the land of Moriah; and offer him there for a burnt offering upon one of the mountains which I will tell thee of.
- 3 And Abraham rose up early in the morning, and saddled his ass, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son, and clave the wood for the burnt offering, and rose up, and went unto the place of which God had told him.
- 4 Then on the third day Abraham lifted up his eyes, and saw the place afar off.
- ⁵ And Abraham said unto his <u>young men</u>, <u>Abide</u> ye here with the <u>ass</u>; and I and the <u>lad</u> will <u>go yonder</u> and <u>worship</u>, and <u>come <u>again</u> to you.
 </u>
- 6 And Abraham took the <u>wood</u> of the <u>burnt offering</u>, and <u>laid</u> it upon <u>lsaac</u> his son; and he took the <u>fire</u> in his <u>hand</u>, and a <u>knife</u>; and they went both of them together.
- And Isaac spake unto Abraham his <u>father</u>, and said, My father: and he said, Here am I, my son. And he said, Behold the <u>fire</u> and the <u>wood</u>: but where is the <u>lamb</u> for a <u>burnt offering</u>?
- ⁸ And Abraham said, My son, God will provide himself a lamb for a burnt offering.
 so they went both of them together.
- ⁹ And they came to the <u>place</u> which <u>God</u> had told him of; and <u>Abraham built</u> an <u>altar</u> there, and <u>laid</u> the <u>wood</u> in <u>order</u>, and <u>bound</u> <u>Isaac</u> his son, and <u>laid</u> him on the <u>altar</u> upon the <u>wood</u>.
- And <u>Abraham stretched</u> forth his <u>hand</u>, and took the <u>knife</u> to <u>slay</u> his son.
- ¹¹ And the angel of the LORD called unto him out of <u>heaven</u>, and said, Abraham, Abraham: and he said, Here am I.
- ¹² And he said, <u>Lay not</u> thine <u>hand</u> upon the <u>lad</u>, <u>neither</u> do thou <u>any thing</u> unto him: for now I <u>know</u> that thou <u>fearest</u> God, seeing thou hast <u>not</u> withheld thy son, thine <u>only</u> son from me.
- ¹³ And Abraham <u>lifted</u> up his <u>eyes</u>, and looked, and behold behind him a <u>ram caught</u> in a <u>thicket</u> by his <u>horns</u>: and Abraham went and took the ram, and <u>offered</u> him up for a burnt <u>offering</u> in the <u>stead</u> of his son.
- ¹⁴ And Abraham called the <u>name</u> of that <u>place</u> <u>Jehovahjireh</u>: as it is said to this <u>day</u>, In the <u>mount</u> of the LORD it shall be <u>seen</u>.

- ¹⁵ And the angel of the LORD called unto Abraham out of <u>heaven</u> the <u>second time</u>,
- 16 And said, By myself have I <u>sworn</u>, saith the <u>LORD</u>, for because thou hast done this <u>thing</u>, and hast <u>not</u> withheld thy son, thine *only* son:
- 17 That in <u>blessing I will bless</u> thee, and in <u>multiplying I will multiply</u> thy <u>seed</u> as the <u>stars</u> of the <u>heaven</u>, and as the <u>sand</u> which is upon the <u>sea shore</u>; and thy seed shall <u>possess</u> the <u>gate</u> of his <u>enemies</u>;
- 18 And in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed; because thou hast obeyed my voice.
- 19 So Abraham returned unto his young men, and they rose up and went together to Beersheba; and Abraham dwelt at Beersheba.
- 20 And it came to <u>pass</u> *after* these <u>things</u>, that it was told **Abraham**, saying, Behold, **Milcah**, she hath also <u>born</u> children unto thy brother **Nahor**;
- 21 Huz his firstborn, and Buz his brother, and Kemuel the father of Aram,
- 22 And Chesed, and Hazo, and Pildash, and Jidlaph, and Bethuel.
- 23 And Bethuel begat *Rebekah*: these <u>eight</u> Milcah did <u>bear</u> to Nahor, Abraham's brother.
- ²⁴ And his <u>concubine</u>, whose name was **Reumah**, she <u>bare</u> also **Tebah**, and **Gaham**, and **Thahash**, and **Maachah**.

- 1 And Sarah was an hundred and seven and twenty years old: these were the years of the life of Sarah.
- ² And Sarah <u>died</u> in Kirjatharba; the same is Hebron in the land of Canaan: and Abraham came to <u>mourn</u> for Sarah, and to <u>weep</u> for her.
- 3 And Abraham stood up from before his dead, and spake unto the sons of Heth, saying,
- 4 I am a <u>stranger</u> and a <u>sojourner</u> with you: give me a <u>possession</u> of a <u>buryingplace</u> with you, that I may <u>bury</u> my <u>dead</u> <u>out</u> of my <u>sight</u>.
- ⁵ And the children of Heth answered Abraham, saying unto him,
- 6 Hear us, my <u>lord</u>: thou art a *mighty* <u>prince</u> among us: in the <u>choice</u> of our <u>sepulchres</u> <u>bury</u> thy <u>dead</u>; <u>none</u> of us shall withhold from thee his sepulchre, but that thou mayest bury thy dead.
- 7 And Abraham stood *up*, and bowed himself to the people of the land, even to the children of Heth.
- ⁸ And he <u>communed</u> with them, saying, If it be your <u>mind</u> that I should <u>bury</u> my <u>dead</u> out of my <u>sight</u>; hear me, and <u>intreat</u> for me to <u>Ephron</u> the son of <u>Zohar</u>,
- That he may *give* me the <u>cave</u> of <u>Machpelah</u>, which he hath, which is in the <u>end</u> of his <u>field</u>; for as much <u>money</u> as it is <u>worth</u> he shall give it me for a <u>possession</u> of a <u>buryingplace</u> amongst you.
- ¹⁰ And Ephron <u>dwelt</u> among the children of Heth: and Ephron the Hittite answered Abraham in the <u>audience</u> of the children of Heth, even of *all* that went in at the <u>gate</u> of his <u>city</u>, saying,
- Nay, my lord, hear me: the field give I thee, and the cave that is therein, I give it thee; in the presence of the sons of my people give I it thee: bury thy dead.
- 12 And **Abraham** bowed down himself before the people of the land.
- ¹³ And he spake unto Ephron in the <u>audience</u> of the people of the land, saying, But if thou wilt *give* it, I <u>pray</u> thee, hear me: I will give thee <u>money</u> for the <u>field</u>; take it of me, and I will <u>bury</u> my <u>dead</u> there.
- ¹⁴ And Ephron answered Abraham, saying unto him,
- 15 My <u>lord</u>, hearken unto me: the land is worth <u>four hundred shekels</u> of <u>silver</u>; what is that *betwixt* me and thee? <u>bury</u> therefore thy <u>dead</u>.
- ¹⁶ And Abraham hearkened unto Ephron; and Abraham weighed to Ephron the silver, which he had named in the audience of the sons of Heth, four hundred shekels of silver, current money with the merchant.

- ¹⁷ And the <u>field</u> of Ephron which was in Machpelah, which was before Mamre, the field, and the <u>cave</u> which was therein, and all the <u>trees</u> that were in the field, that were in all the <u>borders</u> round about, were made sure
- 18 Unto Abraham for a <u>possession</u> in the <u>presence</u> of the children of Heth, *before all* that went in at the <u>gate</u> of his <u>city</u>.
- 19 And *after* this, **Abraham** <u>buried</u> **Sarah** his <u>wife</u> in the <u>cave</u> of the <u>field</u> of **Machpelah** *before* **Mamre**: the same is **Hebron** in the land of **Canaan**.
- ²⁰ And the <u>field</u>, and the <u>cave</u> that is therein, were made <u>sure</u> unto <u>Abraham</u> for a <u>possession</u> of a <u>buryingplace</u> by the sons of <u>Heth</u>.

- 1 And Abraham was old, and well stricken in age: and the LORD had blessed Abraham in all things.
- ² And Abraham said unto his <u>eldest servant</u> of his <u>house</u>, that <u>ruled</u> over <u>all</u> that he had, Put, I pray thee, thy <u>hand under my thigh</u>:
- And I will make thee <u>swear</u> by the <u>LORD</u>, the <u>God</u> of <u>heaven</u>, and the <u>God</u> of the <u>earth</u>, that thou shalt <u>not</u> take a <u>wife</u> unto my son of the daughters of the <u>Canaanites</u>, among whom I <u>dwell</u>:
- ⁴ But thou shalt go unto my <u>country</u>, and to my <u>kindred</u>, and take a <u>wife</u> unto my son <u>lsaac</u>.
- 5 And the <u>servant</u> said unto him, *Peradventure* the <u>woman</u> will <u>not</u> be willing to <u>follow</u> me unto this <u>land</u>: must I needs bring thy son <u>again</u> unto the land from whence thou camest?
- 6 And Abraham said unto him, Beware thou that thou bring not my son thither again.
- The LORD God of <u>heaven</u>, which took me from my <u>father's house</u>, and from the <u>land</u> of my <u>kindred</u>, and which spake unto me, and that <u>sware</u> unto me, saying, **Unto thy <u>seed</u> will I give this <u>land</u>**; he shall <u>send</u> his <u>angel</u> *before* thee, and thou shalt take a <u>wife</u> unto my son from thence.
- ⁸ And if the <u>woman</u> will <u>not</u> be willing to <u>follow</u> thee, then thou shalt be <u>clear</u> from this my <u>oath</u>: <u>only</u> bring <u>not</u> my son thither <u>again</u>.
- 9 And the <u>servant</u> put his <u>hand</u> *under* the <u>thigh</u> of **Abraham** his <u>master</u>, and <u>sware</u> to him concerning that matter.
- ¹⁰ And the <u>servant</u> took <u>ten camels</u> of the camels of his <u>master</u>, and <u>departed</u>; for <u>all</u> the <u>goods</u> of his master were in his <u>hand</u>: and he <u>arose</u>, and went to <u>Mesopotamia</u>, unto the <u>city</u> of <u>Nahor</u>.
- ¹¹ And he made his <u>camels</u> to <u>kneel</u> <u>down</u> without the <u>city</u> by a <u>well</u> of <u>water</u> at the <u>time</u> of the <u>evening</u>, even the time that <u>women</u> go <u>out</u> to <u>draw</u> water.
- 12 And he said O LORD God of my master Abraham, I pray thee, send me good speed this day, and shew kindness unto my master Abraham.
- 13 Behold, I <u>stand</u> here by the <u>well</u> of <u>water</u>; and the daughters of the <u>men</u> of the <u>city</u> come *out* to <u>draw</u> water:
- 14 And let it come to <u>pass</u>, that the <u>damsel</u> to whom I shall say, <u>Let down</u> thy <u>pitcher</u>, I pray thee, that I may <u>drink</u>; and she shall say, <u>Drink</u>, and I will give thy <u>camels</u> drink <u>also</u>: let the same be she that thou hast <u>appointed</u> for thy <u>servant</u> <u>Isaac</u>; and thereby shall I <u>know</u> that thou hast shewed <u>kindness</u> unto my master.

- 15 And it came to <u>pass</u>, *before* he had done speaking, that, behold, *Rebekah* came *out*, who was <u>born</u> to **Bethuel**, son of **Milcah**, the <u>wife</u> of **Nahor**, **Abraham's** brother, with her <u>pitcher</u> upon her <u>shoulder</u>.
- 16 And the <u>damsel</u> was <u>very fair</u> to look upon, a <u>virgin</u>, <u>neither</u> had <u>any man known</u> her: and she went down to the <u>well</u>, and <u>filled</u> her <u>pitcher</u>, and came <u>up</u>.
- ¹⁷ And the <u>servant ran</u> to <u>meet</u> her, and said, Let me, I pray thee, <u>drink</u> a *little* <u>water</u> of thy <u>pitcher</u>.
- ¹⁸ And she said, Drink, my <u>lord</u>: and she <u>hasted</u>, and <u>let down</u> her <u>pitcher</u> upon her <u>hand</u>, and gave him drink.
- ¹⁹ And when she had done giving him <u>drink</u>, she said, I will <u>draw water</u> for thy <u>camels</u> *also*, until they have done drinking.
- 20 And she hasted, and <u>emptied</u> her <u>pitcher</u> into the <u>trough</u>, and <u>ran again</u> unto the <u>well</u> to <u>draw water</u>, and drew for *all* his <u>camels</u>.
- 21 And the man wondering at her held his peace, to wit whether the LORD had made his journey prosperous or not.
- ²² And it came to <u>pass</u>, as the <u>camels</u> had done <u>drinking</u>, that the <u>man</u> took a <u>golden earring</u> of <u>half</u> a <u>shekel weight</u>, and <u>two bracelets</u> for her <u>hands</u> of <u>ten shekels weight</u> of <u>gold</u>;
- ²³ And said, Whose daughter art thou? tell me, I pray thee: is there <u>room</u> in thy <u>father's house</u> for us to <u>lodge</u> in?
- ²⁴ And she said unto him, I am the daughter of Bethuel the son of Milcah, which she bare unto Nahor.
- 25 She said moreover unto him, We have both <u>straw</u> and <u>provender</u> enough, and <u>room</u> to <u>lodge</u> in.
- 26 And the <u>man bowed</u> down his <u>head</u>, and <u>worshipped</u> the LORD.
- ²⁷ And he said, <u>Blessed</u> be the <u>LORD God</u> of my <u>master Abraham</u>, who hath <u>not left destitute</u> my master of his <u>mercy</u> and his <u>truth</u>: I being in the <u>way</u>, the <u>LORD led</u> me to the <u>house</u> of my master's brethren.
- 28 And the <u>damsel ran</u>, and told them of her <u>mother's house</u> these <u>things</u>.
- ²⁹ And Rebekah had a brother, and his name was Laban: and Laban ran out unto the man, unto the well.
- ³⁰ And it came to <u>pass</u>, when he saw the <u>earring</u> and <u>bracelets</u> upon his sister's <u>hands</u>, and when he heard the <u>words</u> of <u>Rebekah</u> his sister, saying, Thus spake the <u>man</u> unto me; that he came unto the man; and, behold, he <u>stood</u> by the <u>camels</u> at the <u>well</u>. ³¹ And he said, Come in, thou <u>blessed</u> of the <u>LORD</u>; wherefore standest thou without? for I have <u>prepared</u> the <u>house</u>, and <u>room</u> for the <u>camels</u>. ³² And the <u>man</u> came into the <u>house</u>: and he <u>ungirded</u> his <u>camels</u>, and gave <u>straw</u> and <u>provender</u> for the camels, and <u>water</u> to <u>wash</u> his <u>feet</u>, and the <u>men's</u> feet that were with him.

- 33 And there was <u>set meat</u> *before* him to <u>eat</u>: but he said, I will <u>not</u> eat, until I have told mine <u>errand</u>. And he said, Speak on.
- 34 And he said, I am Abraham's servant.
- 35 And the LORD hath <u>blessed</u> my <u>master</u> *greatly*, and he is become <u>great</u>: and he hath given him <u>flocks</u>, and <u>herds</u>, and <u>silver</u>, and <u>gold</u>, and <u>menservants</u>, and <u>maidservants</u>, and <u>camels</u>, and <u>asses</u>.
- 36 And Sarah my master's wife bare a son to my master when she was old: and unto him hath he given all that he hath.
- 37 And my <u>master</u> made me <u>swear</u>, saying, Thou shalt <u>not</u> take a <u>wife</u> to my son of the daughters of the <u>Canaanites</u>, in whose land I dwell:
- 38 But thou shalt go unto my <u>father's house</u>, and to my <u>kindred</u>, and take a <u>wife</u> unto my son.
- ³⁹ And I said unto my <u>master</u>, *Peradventure* the <u>woman</u> will <u>not follow</u> me.
- 40 And he said unto me, The LORD, before whom I <u>walk</u>, will <u>send</u> his <u>angel</u> with thee, and <u>prosper</u> thy <u>way</u>; and thou shalt take a <u>wife</u> for my son of my <u>kindred</u>, and of my <u>father's house</u>:
- 41 Then shalt thou be <u>clear</u> from this my <u>oath</u>, when thou comest to my <u>kindred</u>; and if they give <u>not</u> thee one, thou shalt be clear from my oath.
- ⁴² And I came this <u>day</u> unto the <u>well</u>, and said, O LORD God of my <u>master</u> Abraham, if now thou do <u>prosper</u> my <u>way</u> which I go:
- 43 Behold, I <u>stand</u> by the <u>well</u> of <u>water</u>; and it shall come to <u>pass</u>, that when the <u>virgin</u> cometh forth to <u>draw</u> water, and I say to her, Give me, I pray thee, a *little* water of thy <u>pitcher</u> to <u>drink</u>;
- 44 And she say to me, Both <u>drink</u> thou, and I will <u>also draw</u> for thy <u>camels</u>: let the same be the <u>woman</u> whom the <u>LORD</u> hath <u>appointed</u> <u>out</u> for my master's son.
- ⁴⁵ And *before* I had done speaking in mine <u>heart</u>, behold, Rebekah came forth with her <u>pitcher</u> on her <u>shoulder</u>; and she went *down* unto the <u>well</u>, and <u>drew water</u>: and I said unto her, Let me <u>drink</u>, I pray thee.
- 46 And she made haste, and let down her pitcher from her shoulder, and said, Drink, and I will give thy camels drink also: so I drank, and she made the camels drink also.
- ⁴⁷ And I asked her, and said, Whose daughter art thou? And she said, the daughter of Bethuel, Nahor's son, whom Milcah bare unto him: and I put the earring upon her face, and the bracelets upon her hands.
- ⁴⁸ And I <u>bowed</u> down my <u>head</u>, and <u>worshipped</u> the LORD, and <u>blessed</u> the LORD God of my <u>master</u> Abraham, which had <u>led</u> me in the <u>right way</u> to take my <u>master's</u> brother's daughter unto his <u>son</u>.
- 49 And now if ye will <u>deal</u> *kindly* and *truly* with my <u>master</u>, tell me: and if <u>not</u>, tell me; that I may <u>turn</u> to the right hand, or to the left.

- Then Laban and Bethuel answered and said, The thing proceedeth from the LORD: we cannot speak unto thee bad or good.
- 51 Behold, Rebekah is *before* thee, take her, and go, and let her be thy <u>master's</u> son's <u>wife</u>, as the LORD hath spoken.
- ⁵² And it came to <u>pass</u>, that, when <u>Abraham's servant</u> heard their <u>words</u>, he <u>worshipped</u> the <u>LORD</u>, <u>bowing</u> himself to the <u>earth</u>.
- 53 And the <u>servant</u> brought forth <u>jewels</u> of <u>silver</u>, and jewels of <u>gold</u>, and <u>raiment</u>, and gave them to **Rebekah**: he gave *also* to her brother and to her <u>mother precious things</u>.
- 54 And they did <u>eat</u> and <u>drink</u>, he and the <u>men</u> that were with him, and <u>tarried</u> *all* <u>night</u>; and they <u>rose</u> *up* in the <u>morning</u>, and he said, <u>Send</u> me <u>away</u> unto my <u>master</u>.
- 55 And her brother and her mother said, Let the damsel abide with us a few days, at the least ten; after that she shall go.
- ⁵⁶ And he said unto them, <u>Hinder</u> me <u>not</u>, seeing the <u>LORD</u> hath <u>prospered</u> my <u>way</u>; <u>send</u> me <u>away</u> that I may go to my <u>master</u>.
- 57 And they said, We will call the <u>damsel</u>, and <u>enquire</u> at her <u>mouth</u>.
- 58 And they called Rebekah, and said unto her, Wilt thou go with this man? And she said, I will go.
- 59 And they <u>sent away</u> Rebekah their sister, and her <u>nurse</u>, and Abraham's <u>servant</u>, and his <u>men</u>.
- 60 And they <u>blessed</u> Rebekah, and said unto her, Thou art our sister, be thou the <u>mother</u> of <u>thousands</u> of <u>millions</u>, and let thy <u>seed possess</u> the <u>gate</u> of those which <u>hate</u> them.
- 61 And Rebekah <u>arose</u>, and her <u>damsels</u>, and they <u>rode</u> upon the <u>camels</u>, and <u>followed</u> the <u>man</u>: and the <u>servant</u> took Rebekah, and went his <u>way</u>.
- 62 And Isaac came from the <u>way</u> of the <u>well</u> Lahairoi; for he <u>dwelt</u> in the <u>south country</u>.
- 63 And **Isaac** went *out* to <u>meditate</u> in the <u>field</u> at the <u>eventide</u>: and he <u>lifted</u> *up* his <u>eyes</u>, and <u>saw</u>, and, behold, the <u>camels</u> were coming.
- 64 And Rebekah lifted up her eyes, and when she saw Isaac, she lighted off the camel.
- 65 For she had said unto the <u>servant</u>, What <u>man</u> is this that <u>walketh</u> in the <u>field</u> to <u>meet</u> us? And the <u>servant</u> had said, It is my <u>master</u>: therefore she took a <u>vail</u>, and <u>covered</u> herself.
- 66 And the <u>servant</u> told <u>lsaac</u> all <u>things</u> that he had done.
- 67 And Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent, and took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her: and Isaac was comforted after his mother's death.

- 1 Then <u>again</u> Abraham took a <u>wife</u>, and her name was Keturah.
- 2 And she bare him Zimran, and Jokshan, and Medan, and Midian, and Ishbak, and Shuah.
- ³ And Jokshan begat Sheba, and Dedan. And the sons of Dedan were Asshurim, and Letushim, and Leummim.
- ⁴ And the sons of Midian; Ephah, and Epher, and Hanoch, and Abidah, and Eldaah. A// these were the children of Keturah.
- 5 And Abraham gave all that he had unto Isaac.
- ⁶ But unto the sons of the <u>concubines</u>, which <u>Abraham</u> had, <u>Abraham</u> gave <u>gifts</u>, and <u>sent</u> them <u>away</u> from <u>Isaac</u> his son, while he yet <u>lived</u>, <u>eastward</u>, unto the <u>east country</u>.
- 7 And these are the <u>days</u> of the <u>years</u> of <u>Abraham's life</u> which he <u>lived</u>, an <u>hundred threescore and fifteen</u> years.
- Then Abraham *gave up the ghost*, and <u>died</u> in a <u>good old age</u>, an old <u>man</u>, and <u>full</u> of <u>years</u>; and was <u>gathered</u> to his *people*.
- ⁹ And his sons Isaac and Ishmael <u>buried</u> him in the <u>cave</u> of <u>Machpelah</u>, in the <u>field</u> of <u>Ephron</u> the son of <u>Zohar</u> the <u>Hittite</u>, which is <u>before Mamre</u>;
- 10 The <u>field</u> which **Abraham** <u>purchased</u> of the sons of **Heth**: there was **Abraham** <u>buried</u>, and **Sarah** his <u>wife</u>.
- 11 And it came to <u>pass</u> after the <u>death</u> of **Abraham**, that **God** <u>blessed</u> his son <u>lsaac</u>; and <u>lsaac</u> <u>dwelt</u> by the <u>well</u> <u>Lahairoi</u>.
- 12 Now these are the <u>generations</u> of <u>Ishmael</u>, <u>Abraham's</u> son, whom <u>Hagar</u> the <u>Egyptian</u>, <u>Sarah's</u> <u>handmaid</u>, <u>bare</u> unto <u>Abraham</u>:
- ¹³ And these are the names of the sons of Ishmael, by their names, according to their generations: the firstborn of Ishmael, Nebajoth; and Kedar, and Adbeel, and Mibsam,
- ¹⁴ And Mishma, and Dumah, and Massa,
- ¹⁵ Hadar, and Tema, Jetur, Naphish, and Kedemah:
- 16 These are the sons of Ishmael, and these are their names, by their towns, and by their castles; twelve princes according to their nations.

- 17 And these are the <u>years</u> of the <u>life</u> of **Ishmael**, an <u>hundred and thirty and seven years</u>: and he gave *up* the <u>ghost</u> and <u>died</u>; and was <u>gathered</u> unto his <u>people</u>.
- 18 And they <u>dwelt</u> from **Havilah** unto **Shur**, that is *before* **Egypt**, as thou goest *toward* **Assyria**: and he <u>died</u> in the <u>presence</u> of *all* his brethren.
- 19 And these are the generations of Isaac, Abraham's son: Abraham begat Isaac:
- And Isaac was forty years old when he took Rebekah to wife, the daughter of Bethuel the Syrian of Padanaram, the sister to Laban the Syrian.
- 21 And Isaac <u>intreated</u> the LORD for his <u>wife</u>, because she was <u>barren</u>: and the LORD was intreated of him, and Rebekah his wife <u>conceived</u>.
- 22 And the **children struggled together within** her; and she said, If it be so, why am I thus? And she went to enquire of the LORD.
- 23 And the LORD said unto her, <u>Two nations</u> are in thy <u>womb</u>, and <u>two manner</u> of people shall be <u>separated</u> from thy <u>bowels</u>; and the <u>one</u> people shall be <u>stronger</u> than the <u>other</u> people; and the <u>elder</u> shall <u>serve</u> the <u>younger</u>.
- 24 And when her <u>days</u> to be <u>delivered</u> were <u>fulfilled</u>, behold, there were <u>twins</u> in her <u>womb</u>.
- ²⁵ And the <u>first</u> came out <u>red</u>, all over like an <u>hairy garment</u>; and they called his name <u>Esau</u>.
- ²⁶ And after that came his brother out, and his <u>hand</u> took <u>hold</u> on <u>Esau's</u> <u>heel</u>; and his name was called <u>Jacob</u>: and <u>Isaac</u> was <u>threescore years old</u> when she <u>bare</u> them.
- ²⁷ And the <u>boys grew</u>: and <u>Esau</u> was a <u>cunning hunter</u>, a <u>man</u> of the <u>field</u>; and <u>Jacob</u> was a <u>plain</u> man, <u>dwelling</u> in <u>tents</u>.
- And Isaac loved Esau, because he did eat of his venison: but Rebekah loved Jacob.
- 29 And **Jacob** sod pottage: and **Esau** came from the field, and he was faint:
- 30 And **Esau** said to **Jacob**, <u>Feed</u> me, I pray thee, with that *same red <u>pottage</u>*; for I am <u>faint</u>: therefore was his name called **Edom**.
- 31 And Jacob said, <u>Sell</u> me this <u>day</u> thy <u>birthright</u>.
- 32 And Esau said, Behold, I am at the <u>point</u> to <u>die</u>: and what <u>profit</u> shall this <u>birthright</u> do to me?
- ³³ And Jacob said, <u>Swear</u> to me this <u>day</u>; and he sware unto him: and he <u>sold</u> his <u>birthright</u> unto Jacob.
- 34 Then **Jacob** gave **Esau** <u>bread</u> and <u>pottage</u> of <u>lentiles</u>; and he did <u>eat</u> and <u>drink</u>, and <u>rose</u> up, and went his <u>way</u>: thus **Esau** <u>despised</u> his <u>birthright</u>.

- And there was a <u>famine</u> in the <u>land</u>, beside the <u>first</u> famine that was in the <u>days</u> of <u>Abraham</u>. And <u>Isaac</u> went unto <u>Abimelech</u> king of the <u>Philistines</u> unto <u>Gerar</u>.
- ² And the LORD <u>appeared</u> unto him, and said, Go <u>not</u> <u>down</u> into Egypt; <u>dwell</u> in the <u>land</u> which I shall tell thee of:
- 3 Sojourn in this land, and I will be with thee, and will bless thee; for unto thee, and unto thy seed, I will give all these countries, and I will perform the oath which I sware unto Abraham thy father;
- ⁴ And I will make thy <u>seed</u> to <u>multiply</u> as the <u>stars</u> of <u>heaven</u>, and will give unto thy seed <u>all</u> these <u>countries</u>; and in thy seed shall <u>all the nations</u> of the <u>earth be blessed</u>;
- ⁵ Because that Abraham <u>obeyed</u> my <u>voice</u>, and <u>kept</u> my <u>charge</u>, my <u>commandments</u>, my <u>statutes</u>, and my <u>laws</u>.
- 6 And Isaac dwelt in Gerar:
- 7 And the men of the place asked him of his wife; and he said, She is my sister: for he feared to say, She is my wife; lest, said he, the men of the place should kill me for Rebekah; because she was fair to look upon.
- And it came to <u>pass</u>, when he had been there a <u>long time</u>, that <u>Abimelech</u> king of the <u>Philistines</u> looked <u>out</u> at a <u>window</u>, and saw, and, behold, <u>Isaac</u> was <u>sporting</u> with <u>Rebekah</u> his <u>wife</u>.
- ⁹ And Abimelech called Isaac, and said, Behold, of a <u>surety</u> she is thy <u>wife</u>; and how saidst thou, She is my sister? And Isaac said unto him, Because I said, Lest I die for her.
- And Abimelech said, What is this thou hast done unto us? one of the people might *lightly* have <u>lien</u> with thy <u>wife</u>, and thou shouldest have brought <u>guiltiness</u> upon us.
- 11 And Abimelech charged all his people, saying, He that toucheth this man or his wife shall surely be put to death.
- 12 Then Isaac sowed in that land, and received in the same year an hundredfold: and the LORD blessed him.
- ¹³ And the man waxed great, and went forward, and grew until he became very great.
- 14 For he had <u>possession</u> of <u>flocks</u>, and possession of <u>herds</u>, and <u>great store</u> of <u>servants</u>: and the <u>Philistines envied</u> him.

- 15 For all the wells which his father's servants had digged in the days of Abraham his father, the Philistines had stopped them, and filled them with earth.
- 16 And **Abimelech** said unto **Isaac**, Go from us; for thou art *much mightier* than we.
- 17 And Isaac <u>departed</u> thence, and <u>pitched</u> his <u>tent</u> in the valley of **Gerar**, and <u>dwelt</u> there.
- 18 And Isaac <u>digged again</u> the <u>wells</u> of <u>water</u>, which they had digged in the <u>days</u> of <u>Abraham</u> his <u>father</u>; for the <u>Philistines</u> had <u>stopped</u> them <u>after</u> the <u>death</u> of <u>Abraham</u>: and he called their names after the names by which his father had called them.
- 19 And Isaac's servants digged in the valley, and found there a well of springing water.
- ²⁰ And the <u>herdmen</u> of Gerar did <u>strive</u> with <u>Isaac's</u> herdmen, saying, The <u>water</u> is ours: and he called the name of the <u>well Esek</u>; because they <u>strove</u> with him.
- 21 And they <u>digged another well</u>, and <u>strove</u> for that *also*: and he called the name of it **Sitnah**.
- 22 And he <u>removed</u> from thence, and <u>digged another well</u>; and for that they <u>strove not</u>: and he called the name of it **Rehoboth**; and he said, For now the **LORD** hath made <u>room</u> for us, and we shall be <u>fruitful</u> in the land.
- 23 And he went *up* from thence to **Beersheba**.
- ²⁴ And the LORD <u>appeared</u> unto him the same <u>night</u>, and said, I am the God of Abraham thy <u>father</u>: <u>fear</u> not, for I am with thee, and will <u>bless</u> thee, and <u>multiply</u> thy <u>seed</u> for my <u>servant</u> Abraham's sake.
- 25 And he <u>builded</u> an <u>altar</u> there, and <u>called</u> upon the <u>name</u> of the **LORD**, and <u>pitched</u> his <u>tent</u> there: and there <u>lsaac's servants digged</u> a <u>well</u>.
- ²⁶ Then **Abimelech** went to him from **Gerar**, and **Ahuzzath** one of his <u>friends</u>, and **Phichol** the *chief* <u>captain</u> of his <u>army</u>.
- ²⁷ And Isaac said unto them, Wherefore come ye to me, seeing ye <u>hate</u> me, and have <u>sent</u> me <u>away</u> from you?
- ²⁸ And they said, We saw certainly that the LORD was with thee: and we said, Let there be now an oath betwixt us, even betwixt us and thee, and let us make a covenant with thee;
- 29 That thou wilt do us <u>no hurt</u>, as we have <u>not touched</u> thee, and as we have done unto thee <u>nothing</u> but <u>good</u>, and have <u>sent</u> thee <u>away</u> in <u>peace</u>: thou art now the <u>blessed</u> of the <u>LORD</u>.
- ³⁰ And he made them a <u>feast</u>, and they did <u>eat</u> and <u>drink</u>.
- ³¹ And they <u>rose</u> up betimes in the <u>morning</u>, and <u>sware</u> one to <u>another</u>: and <u>lsaac</u> <u>sent</u> them <u>away</u>, and they <u>departed</u> from him in <u>peace</u>.

- 32 And it came to <u>pass</u> the same <u>day</u>, that <u>Isaac's servants</u> came, and told him concerning the <u>well</u> which they had <u>digged</u>, and said unto him, We have <u>found water</u>.
- 33 And he called it **Shebah**: therefore the name of the <u>city</u> is **Beersheba** unto this <u>day</u>.
- 34 And Esau was forty years old when he took to wife Judith the daughter of Beeri the Hittite, and Bashemath the daughter of Elon the Hittite:
- 35 Which were a grief of mind unto Isaac and to Rebekah.

- 1 And it came to <u>pass</u>, that when <u>Isaac</u> was <u>old</u>, and his <u>eyes</u> were <u>dim</u>, so that he could <u>not</u> <u>see</u>, he called <u>Esau</u> his <u>eldest</u> son, and said unto him, My son: and he said unto him, Behold, here am I.
- 2 And he said, Behold now, I am old, I know not the day of my death:
- ³ Now therefore take, I pray thee, thy <u>weapons</u>, thy <u>quiver</u> and thy <u>bow</u>, and go *out* to the <u>field</u>, and take me some <u>venison</u>;
- ⁴ And make me savoury meat, such as I love, and bring it to me, that I may eat; that my soul may bless thee before I die.
- ⁵ And Rebekah heard when Isaac spake to Esau his son. And Esau went to the field to <u>hunt</u> for <u>venison</u>, and to bring it.
- ⁶ And Rebekah spake unto Jacob her son, saying, Behold, I heard thy <u>father</u> speak unto Esau thy brother, saying,
- The Bring me venison, and make me savoury meat, that I may eat, and bless thee before the LORD before my death.
- Now therefore, my son, <u>obey</u> my <u>voice</u> according to that which I <u>command</u> thee.
- Go now to the <u>flock</u>, and <u>fetch</u> me from thence <u>two good kids</u> of the <u>goats</u>; and I will make them <u>savoury meat</u> for thy <u>father</u>, such as he <u>loveth</u>:
- 10 And *thou* shalt bring it to thy <u>father</u>, that he may <u>eat</u>, and that he may <u>bless</u> *thee* before his <u>death</u>.
- ¹¹ And Jacob said to Rebekah his mother, Behold, Esau my brother is a hairy man, and I am a smooth man:
- ¹² My <u>father peradventure</u> will <u>feel</u> me, and I shall seem to him as a <u>deceiver</u>, and I shall bring a <u>curse</u> upon me, and <u>not</u> a <u>blessing</u>.
- 13 And his mother said unto him, **Upon** me be thy curse, my son: only obey my voice, and go fetch me them.
- 14 And he went, and <u>fetched</u>, and brought them to his <u>mother</u>: and his mother made <u>savoury meat</u>, such as his <u>father loved</u>.
- ¹⁵ And Rebekah took goodly raiment of her eldest son Esau, which were with her in the house, and put them upon Jacob her younger son:

- And she put the <u>skins</u> of the <u>kids</u> of the <u>goats</u> upon his <u>hands</u>, and upon the <u>smooth</u> of his <u>neck</u>:
- ¹⁷ And she gave the savoury meat and the bread, which she had prepared, into the hand of her son Jacob.
- 18 And he came unto his <u>father</u>, and said, My father: and he said, Here am I; who art thou, my son?
- ¹⁹ And Jacob said unto his <u>father</u>, I am <u>Esau</u> thy <u>first born</u>; I have done according as thou <u>badest</u> me: <u>arise</u>, I pray thee, sit and <u>eat</u> of my <u>venison</u>, that thy <u>soul</u> may <u>bless</u> me.
- ²⁰ And Isaac said unto his son, How is it that thou hast <u>found</u> it so *quickly*, my son? And he said, Because the LORD thy God brought it to me.
- ²¹ And Isaac said unto Jacob, Come near, I pray thee, that I may <u>feel</u> thee, my son, whether thou be my very son Esau or <u>not</u>.
- 22 And **Jacob** went *near* unto **Isaac** his <u>father</u>; and he <u>felt</u> him, and said, The <u>voice</u> is **Jacob's** voice, but the <u>hands</u> are the hands of **Esau**.
- ²³ And he <u>discerned</u> him <u>not</u>, because his <u>hands</u> were <u>hairy</u>, as his brother **Esau's** hands: so he <u>blessed</u> him.
- ²⁴ And he said, Art thou my very son Esau? And he said, I am.
- 25 And he said, Bring it near to me, and I will eat of my son's venison, that my soul may bless thee. And he brought it near to him, and he did eat: and he brought him wine and he drank.
- 26 And his <u>father</u> **Isaac** said unto him, Come *near* now, and <u>kiss</u> me, my son.
- ²⁷ And he came near, and <u>kissed</u> him: and he <u>smelled</u> the <u>smell</u> of his <u>raiment</u>, and <u>blessed</u> him, and said, See, the smell of my son is as the smell of a <u>field</u> which the <u>LORD</u> hath blessed:
- ²⁸ Therefore God give thee of the <u>dew</u> of <u>heaven</u>, and the <u>fatness</u> of the <u>earth</u>, and <u>plenty</u> of <u>corn</u> and <u>wine</u>:
- 29 Let people <u>serve</u> thee, and <u>nations bow</u> <u>down</u> to thee: be <u>lord</u> over thy brethren, and let thy <u>mother's</u> sons bow <u>down</u> to thee: <u>cursed</u> be <u>every one</u> that curseth thee, and <u>blessed</u> be he that blesseth thee.
- 30 And it came to <u>pass</u>, as soon as <u>lsaac</u> had made an <u>end</u> of <u>blessing Jacob</u>, and <u>Jacob</u> was yet scarce gone *out* from the <u>presence</u> of <u>lsaac</u> his <u>father</u>, that <u>Esau</u> his brother came in from his <u>hunting</u>.
- ³¹ And he also had made <u>savoury meat</u>, and brought it unto his <u>father</u>, and said unto his father, Let my <u>father arise</u>, and <u>eat</u> of his son's <u>venison</u>, that thy <u>soul</u> may <u>bless</u> me.
- 32 And Isaac his father said unto him, Who art thou? And he said, I am thy son, thy firstborn Esau.

- ³³ And Isaac <u>trembled</u> very exceedingly, and said, Who? where is he that hath taken <u>venison</u>, and brought it me, and I have <u>eaten</u> of all before thou camest, and have <u>blessed</u> him? yea, and he shall be blessed.
- 34 And when **Esau** heard the <u>words</u> of his <u>father</u>, he <u>cried</u> with a **great** and **exceeding bitter** <u>cry</u>, and said unto his father, <u>Bless</u> me, even me <u>also</u>, O my father.
- 35 And he said, Thy brother came with *subtilty*, and hath taken *away* thy *blessing*.
- 36 And he said, Is <u>not</u> he rightly named <u>Jacob</u>? for he hath <u>supplanted</u> me these <u>two times</u>: he took <u>away</u> my <u>birthright</u>; and, behold, now he hath taken <u>away</u> my <u>blessing</u>. And he said, Hast thou <u>not reserved</u> a blessing for me?
- ³⁷ And Isaac answered and said unto Esau, Behold, I have made him thy lord, and all his brethren have I given to him for servants; and with corn and wine have I sustained him: and what shall I do now unto thee, my son?
- ³⁸ And Esau said unto his <u>father</u>, Hast thou but <u>one blessing</u>, my father? bless me, even me also, O my father. And Esau <u>lifted</u> up his <u>voice</u>, and <u>wept</u>.
- ³⁹ And Isaac his <u>father</u> answered and said unto him, Behold, thy <u>dwelling</u> shall be the <u>fatness</u> of the <u>earth</u>, and of the <u>dew</u> of <u>heaven</u> from *above*;
- 40 And by thy **sword** shalt thou **live**, and shalt **serve** thy brother; and it shall come to <u>pass</u> when thou shalt have the **dominion**, that thou shalt <u>break</u> his <u>yoke</u> from *off* thy <u>neck</u>.
- ⁴¹ And Esau <u>hated</u> Jacob because of the <u>blessing</u> wherewith his <u>father</u> blessed him: and Esau said in his <u>heart</u>, The <u>days</u> of <u>mourning</u> for my <u>father</u> are at <u>hand</u>; then will I <u>slay</u> my brother <u>Jacob</u>.
- 42 And these words of Esau her elder son were told to Rebekah: and she sent and called Jacob her younger son, and said unto him, Behold, thy brother Esau, as touching thee, doth comfort himself, purposing to kill thee.
- 43 Now therefore, my son, <u>obey</u> my <u>voice</u>; <u>arise</u>, <u>flee</u> thou to **Laban** my brother to **Haran**;
- 44 And <u>tarry</u> with him a few <u>days</u>, until thy brother's <u>fury turn away</u>;
- 45 Until thy brother's <u>anger turn away</u> from thee, and he <u>forget</u> that which thou hast done to him: then I will <u>send</u>, and <u>fetch</u> thee from thence: why should I be <u>deprived</u> also of you both in one <u>day</u>?
- 46 And Rebekah said to Isaac, I am weary of my life because of the daughters of Heth: if Jacob take a wife of the daughters of Heth, such as these which are of the daughters of the land, what good shall my life do me?

- And Isaac called Jacob, and <u>blessed</u> him, and <u>charged</u> him, and said unto him, Thou shalt <u>not</u> take a <u>wife</u> of the daughters of Canaan.
- ² <u>Arise</u>, go to <u>Padanaram</u>, to the <u>house</u> of <u>Bethuel</u> thy <u>mother's father</u>; and take thee a <u>wife</u> from thence of the daughers of <u>Laban</u> thy mother's brother.
- ³ And God Almighty <u>bless</u> thee, and make thee <u>fruitful</u>, and <u>multiply</u> thee, that thou mayest be a <u>multitude</u> of people;
- ⁴ And give thee the <u>blessing</u> of <u>Abraham</u>, to thee, and to thy <u>seed</u> with thee; that thou mayest <u>inherit</u> the land wherein thou art a <u>stranger</u>, which <u>God</u> gave unto <u>Abraham</u>.
- ⁵ And Isaac <u>sent away</u> Jacob: and he went to Padanaram unto Laban, son of Bethuel the Syrian, the brother of Rebekah, Jacob's and Esau's mother.
- When Esau saw that Isaac had <u>blessed</u> Jacob, and <u>sent</u> him <u>away</u> to <u>Padanaram</u>, to take him a <u>wife</u> from thence; and that as he blessed him he gave him a <u>charge</u>, saying, Thou shalt <u>not</u> take a <u>wife</u> of the daughers of <u>Canaan</u>;
- ⁷ And that Jacob <u>obeyed</u> his <u>father</u> and his <u>mother</u>, and was gone to <u>Padanaram</u>;
- 8 And Esau seeing that the daughters of Canaan pleased not Isaac his father;
- Then went Esau unto Ishmael, and took unto the <u>wives</u> which he had Mahalath the daughter of Ishmael Abraham's son, the sister of Nebajoth, to be his <u>wife</u>.
- And Jacob went out from Beersheba, and went toward Haran.
- 11 And he <u>lighted</u> upon a *certain* <u>place</u>, and <u>tarried</u> there *all* <u>night</u>, because the <u>sun</u> was <u>set</u>; and he took of the <u>stones</u> of that place, and put them for his <u>pillows</u>, and <u>lay</u> *down* in that <u>place</u> to <u>sleep</u>.
- 12 And he <u>dreamed</u>, and behold a <u>ladder set up on the <u>earth</u>, and the <u>top of it reached</u> to <u>heaven</u>: and behold the <u>angels</u> of God <u>ascending</u> and <u>descending</u> on it.</u>
- 13 And, behold, the LORD <u>stood</u> *above* it, and said, *I am* the LORD God of Abraham thy <u>father</u>, and the God of Isaac: the <u>land</u> whereon thou <u>liest</u>, to thee will I give it, and to thy <u>seed</u>;
- 14 And thy <u>seed</u> shall be as the <u>dust</u> of the <u>earth</u>, and thou shalt <u>spread</u> <u>abroad</u> to the <u>west</u>, and to the <u>earth</u>, and to the <u>north</u>, and to the <u>south</u>: and in thee and in thy seed shall <u>all</u> the <u>families</u> of the <u>earth</u> be <u>blessed</u>.

- 15 And, behold, *I am* with thee, and will <u>keep</u> thee in *all* <u>places</u> whither thou goest, and will bring thee <u>again</u> into this <u>land</u>; for I will <u>not leave</u> thee, until I have done that which I have spoken to thee of.
- ¹⁶ And Jacob <u>awaked</u> out of his <u>sleep</u>, and he said, Surely the LORD is in this <u>place</u>; and I <u>knew</u> it <u>not</u>.
- 17 And he was <u>afraid</u>, and said, How <u>dreadful</u> is this <u>place!</u> this is *none other but the <u>house</u>* of <u>God</u>, and this is the <u>gate</u> of <u>heaven</u>.
- 18 And Jacob rose up early in the morning, and took the stone that he had put for his pillows, and set it up for a pillar, and poured oil upon the top of it.
- 19 And he called the name of that place **Bethet**: but the name of that city was called **Luz** at the <u>first</u>.
- ²⁰ And Jacob vowed a vow, saying, If God will be with me, and will keep me in this way that I go, and will give me bread to eat, and raiment to put on,
- 21 So that I come <u>again</u> to my <u>father's house</u> in <u>peace</u>; then shall the **LORD** be my **God**:
- 22 And this <u>stone</u>, which I have <u>set</u> for a <u>pillar</u>, shall be **God's** <u>house</u>: and of *all* that thou shalt **give** me I will **surely give** the <u>tenth</u> unto thee.

- 1 Then Jacob went on his journey, and came into the land of the people of the east.
- ² And he looked, and behold a <u>well</u> in the <u>field</u>, and, lo, there were <u>three flocks</u> of <u>sheep lying</u> by it; for *out* of that well they <u>watered</u> the flocks: and a <u>great stone</u> was upon the well's <u>mouth</u>.
- 3 And thither were *all* the <u>flocks gathered</u>: and they <u>rolled</u> the <u>stone</u> from the <u>well's mouth</u>, and <u>watered</u> the <u>sheep</u>, and put the stone <u>again</u> upon the well's mouth in his <u>place</u>.
- ⁴ And Jacob said unto them, My brethren, whence be ye? And they said, Of Haran are we.
- 5 And he said unto them, Know ye Laban the son of Nahor? And they said, We know him.
- 6 And he said unto them, Is he <u>well</u>? And they said, He is well: and, behold, **Rachel** his daughter cometh with the <u>sheep</u>.
- ⁷ And he said, Lo, it is yet high day, neither is it time that the cattle should be gathered together: water ye the sheep, and go and feed them.
- 8 And they said, We <u>cannot</u>, until <u>all</u> the <u>flocks</u> be <u>gathered</u> together, and till they <u>roll</u> the <u>stone</u> from the <u>well's mouth</u>; then we <u>water</u> the <u>sheep</u>.
- 9 And while he yet spake with them, Rachel came with her father's sheep; for she kept them.
- 10 And it came to <u>pass</u>, when <u>Jacob</u> saw <u>Rachel</u> the daughter of <u>Laban</u> his <u>mother's</u> brother, and the <u>sheep</u> of <u>Laban</u> his mother's brother, that <u>Jacob</u> went <u>near</u>, and <u>rolled</u> the <u>stone</u> from the <u>well's mouth</u>, and <u>watered</u> the <u>flock</u> of <u>Laban</u> his mother's brother.
- 11 And Jacob *kissed* Rachel, and <u>lifted</u> *up* his <u>voice</u>, and <u>wept</u>.
- 12 And **Jacob** told **Rachel** that he was her <u>father's</u> brother, and that he was **Rebekah's** son: and she <u>ran</u> and told her <u>father</u>.
- ¹³ And it came to <u>pass</u>, when <u>Laban</u> heard the <u>tidings</u> of <u>Jacob</u> his sister's son, that he <u>ran</u> to <u>meet</u> him, and <u>embraced</u> him, and <u>kissed</u> him, and brought him to his <u>house</u>. And he told <u>Laban</u> all these <u>things</u>.
- ¹⁴ And Laban said to him, Surely thou art my bone and my flesh. And he abode with him the space of a month.
- ¹⁵ And Laban said unto Jacob, Because thou art my brother, shouldest thou therefore <u>serve</u> me for nought? tell me, what shall thy <u>wages</u> be?

- ¹⁶ And Laban had two daughters: the name of the elder was Leah, and the name of the younger was Rachel.
- 17 Leah was <u>tender eyed</u>; but Rachel was <u>beautiful</u> and <u>well favoured</u>.
- ¹⁸ And Jacob <u>loved</u> Rachel; and said, I will <u>serve</u> thee <u>seven years</u> for Rachel thy <u>younger daughter</u>.
- 19 And **Laban** said, It is <u>better</u> that I give her to thee, than that I should give her to <u>another man</u>: <u>abide</u> with me.
- 20 And Jacob <u>served seven years</u> for Rachel; and they <u>seemed</u> unto him but a *few* <u>days</u>, for the <u>love</u> he had to her.
- And Jacob said unto Laban, Give me my wife, for my days are fulfilled, that I may go in unto her.
- 22 And Laban gathered together all the men of the place, and made a feast.
- 23 And it came to <u>pass</u> in the <u>evening</u>, that he took **Leah** his daughter, and brought her to him; and he went in unto her.
- ²⁴ And Laban gave unto his daughter Leah <u>Zilpah</u> his <u>maid</u> for an <u>handmaid</u>.
- 25 And it came to <u>pass</u>, that in the <u>morning</u>, **behold, it was <u>Leah</u>**: and he said to **Laban**, What is this thou hast done unto me? did <u>not</u> I <u>serve</u> with thee for **Rachel**? wherefore then hast thou <u>beguiled</u> me?
- 26 And **Laban** said, It *must* not be so done in our <u>country</u>, to give the <u>younger</u> *before* the <u>firstborn</u>.
- ²⁷ Fulfil her week, and we will give thee this also for the service which thou shalt serve with me yet seven other years.
- 28 And **Jacob** did so, and <u>fulfilled</u> her <u>week</u>: and he gave him **Rachel** his daughter to <u>wife</u> also.
- ²⁹ And Laban gave to Rachel his daughter <u>Bilhah</u> his <u>handmaid</u> to be her maid.
- 30 And he went in also unto **Rachel**, and he <u>loved</u> also **Rachel** more than **Leah**, and <u>served</u> with him yet <u>seven other years</u>.
- 31 And when the LORD saw that Leah was <u>hated</u>, he <u>opened</u> her <u>womb</u>: but Rachel was <u>barren</u>.
- ³² And Leah <u>conceived</u>, and <u>bare</u> a son, and she called his name *Reuben*: for she said, *Surely* the LORD hath looked upon my <u>affliction</u>; now therefore my <u>husband</u> will <u>love</u> me.
- 33 And she <u>conceived again</u>, and <u>bare</u> a son; and said, Because the **LORD** hath heard I was <u>hated</u>, he hath therefore given me this son <u>also</u>: and she called his name <u>Simeon</u>. 34 And she <u>conceived again</u>, and <u>bare</u> a son; and said, Now this <u>time</u> will my <u>husband</u> be <u>joined</u> unto me, because I have <u>born</u> him <u>three</u> sons: therefore was his name called <u>Levi</u>. 35 And she <u>conceived again</u>, and <u>bare</u> a son: and she said, <u>Now</u> will I <u>praise</u> the LORD: therefore she called his name <u>Judah</u>; and <u>left bearing</u>.

- ¹ And when Rachel saw that she <u>bare Jacob no</u> children, Rachel <u>envied</u> her sister; and said unto <u>Jacob</u>,
 Give me children, or else I <u>die</u>.
- 2 And Jacob's anger was kindled against Rachel: and he said, Am I in God's stead, who hath withheld from thee the fruit of the womb?
- ³ And she said, Behold my <u>maid</u> Bilhah, go in unto her; and she shall <u>bear</u> upon my <u>knees</u>, that I may also have children by her.
- And she gave him Bilhah her handmaid to wife: and Jacob went in unto her.
- ⁵ And Bilhah conceived, and bare Jacob a son.
- 6 And Rachel said, God hath judged me, and hath also heard my voice, and hath given me a son: therefore called she his name *Dan*.
- ⁷ And Bilhah Rachel's maid conceived again, and bare Jacob a second son.
- 8 And Rachel said, With great wrestlings have I wrestled with my sister, and I have prevailed: and she called his name Naphtali.
- 9 When Leah saw that she had <u>left bearing</u>, she took Zilpah her <u>maid</u>, and gave her Jacob to <u>wife</u>.
- ¹⁰ And Zilpah Leah's maid bare Jacob a son.
- ¹¹ And Leah said, A troop cometh: and she called his name Gad.
- 12 And Zilpah Leah's maid bare Jacob a second son.
- 13 And Leah said, Happy am I, for the daughters will call me blessed: and she called his name Asher.
- 14 And Reuben went in the <u>days</u> of <u>wheat harvest</u>, and <u>found</u> <u>mandrakes</u> in the <u>field</u>, and brought them unto his mother **Leah**. Then **Rachel** said to **Leah**, Give me, I pray thee, of thy son's <u>mandrakes</u>.
- 15 And she said unto her, Is it a *small* matter that thou hast taken *my* husband? and wouldest thou take away my son's mandrakes also? And Rachel said, Therefore he shall lie with thee to night for thy son's mandrakes.
- 16 And **Jacob** came *out* of the <u>field</u> in the <u>evening</u>, and **Leah** went *out* to <u>meet</u> him, and said, Thou must come in unto me; for *surely* I have <u>hired</u> thee with my son's <u>mandrakes</u>. And he <u>lay</u> with her that <u>night</u>.
- ¹⁷ And God hearkened unto Leah, and she conceived, and bare Jacob the fifth son.

- 18 And **Leah** said, **God** hath given me my <u>hire</u>, because I have given my <u>maiden</u> to my <u>husband</u>: and she called his name **Issachar**.
- ¹⁹ And Leah conceived again, and bare Jacob the sixth son.
- ²⁰ And Leah said, God hath <u>endued</u> me with a good <u>dowry</u>; now will my <u>husband dwell</u> with me, because I have born him six sons: and she called his name Zebulun.
- 21 And afterwards she bare a daughter, and called her name **Dinah**.
- 22 And God remembered Rachel, and God hearkened to her, and opened her womb.
- ²³ And she <u>conceived</u>, and <u>bare</u> a son; and said, <u>God</u> hath taken <u>away</u> my <u>reproach</u>:
- ²⁴ And she called his name *Joseph*; and said, The LORD shall <u>add</u> to me <u>another</u> son.
- ²⁵ And it came to <u>pass</u>, when Rachel had <u>born</u> Joseph, that Jacob said unto Laban, <u>Send</u> me <u>away</u>, that I may go unto mine *own* <u>place</u>, and to my <u>country</u>.
- 26 Give me my <u>wives</u> and my children, for whom I have <u>served</u> thee, and let me go: for thou <u>knowest</u> my service which I have done thee.
- ²⁷ And Laban said unto him, I pray thee, if I have <u>found favour</u> in thine <u>eyes</u>, <u>tarry</u>: for I have <u>learned</u> by <u>experience</u> that the LORD hath <u>blessed</u> me for thy sake.
- ²⁸ And he said, Appoint me thy wages, and I will give it.
- ²⁹ And he said unto him, Thou knowest how I have served thee, and how thy cattle was with me.
- 30 For it was little which thou hadst before I came, and it is now increased unto a multitude; and the LORD hath blessed thee since my coming: and now when shall I provide for mine own house also?
- ³¹ And he said, What shall I give thee? And Jacob said, Thou shalt not give me any thing: if thou wilt do
 this thing for me, I will again feed and keep thy flock.
- 32 I will <u>pass</u> through *all* thy <u>flock</u> to <u>day</u>, <u>removing</u> from thence *all* the **speckled** and **spotted** <u>cattle</u>, and all the **brown** cattle among the <u>sheep</u>, and the spotted and speckled among the <u>goats</u>: and of such shall be my <u>hire</u>.
- 33 So shall my <u>righteousness answer</u> for me in <u>time</u> to come, when it shall come for my <u>hire before</u> thy <u>face</u>: <u>every one</u> that is <u>not speckled</u> and <u>spotted</u> among the <u>goats</u>, and <u>brown</u> among the <u>sheep</u>, that shall be <u>counted **stolen**</u> with me.
- 34 And Laban said, Behold, I would it might be according to thy word.
- 35 And he <u>removed</u> that <u>day</u> the <u>he goats</u> that were <u>ringstraked</u> and <u>spotted</u>, and <u>all</u> the <u>she goats</u> that were <u>speckled</u> and <u>spotted</u>, and <u>every one</u> that had some <u>white</u> in it, and <u>all</u> the <u>brown</u> among the <u>sheep</u>, and gave them into the <u>hand</u> of his sons.

- 36 And he set three days' journey betwixt himself and Jacob: and Jacob fed the rest of Laban's flocks.
- And Jacob took him <u>rods</u> of <u>green poplar</u>, and of the <u>hazel</u> and <u>chesnut tree</u>; and <u>pilled</u> <u>white</u> <u>strakes</u> in them, and made the white <u>appear</u> which was in the <u>rods</u>.
- 38 And he set the <u>rods</u> which he had <u>pilled</u> <u>before</u> the <u>flocks</u> in the <u>gutters</u> in the <u>watering troughs</u> when the flocks came to drink, that they should **conceive** when they came to drink.
- ³⁹ And the <u>flocks conceived</u> before the <u>rods</u>, and brought forth <u>cattle</u> ringstraked, speckled, and spotted.
- 40 And Jacob did <u>separate</u> the <u>lambs</u>, and set the <u>faces</u> of the <u>flocks</u> toward the <u>ringstraked</u>, and all the <u>brown</u> in the <u>flock</u> of <u>Laban</u>; and he put his own flocks by themselves, and put them <u>not</u> unto <u>Laban's</u> cattle.
- 41 And it came to <u>pass</u>, whensoever the <u>stronger cattle</u> did <u>conceive</u>, that <u>Jacob laid</u> the <u>rods</u> <u>before</u> the <u>eyes</u> of the cattle in the <u>gutters</u>, that they might conceive among the rods.
- 42 But when the <u>cattle</u> were <u>feeble</u>, he put them <u>not</u> in: so the <u>feebler</u> were <u>Laban's</u>, and the <u>stronger</u> <u>Jacob's</u>.
- 43 And the <u>man increased</u> exceedingly, and had much <u>cattle</u>, and <u>maidservants</u>, and <u>menservants</u>, and <u>camels</u>, and <u>asses</u>.

- 1 And he heard the <u>words</u> of **Laban's** sons, saying, **Jacob** hath taken <u>away</u> *all* that was our <u>father's</u>; and of that which was our father's hath he gotten *all* this <u>glory</u>.
- ² And Jacob beheld the <u>countenance</u> of Laban, and, behold, it was <u>not</u> toward him as before.
- 3 And the LORD said unto Jacob, <u>Return</u> unto the <u>land</u> of thy <u>fathers</u>, and to thy <u>kindred</u>; and I will be with thee.
- ⁴ And Jacob sent and called Rachel and Leah to the field unto his flock,
- 5 And said unto them, I see your <u>father's countenance</u>, that it is <u>not</u> *toward* me as *before*; but the <u>God</u> of my <u>father</u> hath been with me.
- 6 And ye know that with all my power I have served your father.
- 7 And your <u>father</u> hath <u>deceived</u> me, and <u>changed</u> my <u>wages ten times</u>; but <u>God suffered</u> him <u>not</u> to <u>hurt</u> me.
- 8 If he said thus, The <u>speckled</u> shall be thy <u>wages</u>; then *all* the <u>cattle bare</u> speckled: and if he said thus, The <u>ringstraked</u> shall be thy <u>hire</u>; then bare *all* the cattle ringstraked.
- 9 Thus God hath taken away the cattle of your father, and given them to me.
- 10 And it came to <u>pass</u> at the <u>time</u> that the <u>cattle conceived</u>, that I <u>lifted</u> *up* mine <u>eyes</u>, and saw in a <u>dream</u>, and, behold, the <u>rams</u> which <u>leaped</u> upon the <u>cattle</u> were <u>ringstraked</u>, <u>speckled</u>, and <u>grisled</u>.
- ¹¹ And the angel of God spake unto me in a <u>dream</u>, saying, Jacob: And I said, Here am I.
- 12 And he said, <u>Lift</u> *up* now thine <u>eyes</u>, and see, <u>all</u> the <u>rams</u> which <u>leap</u> upon the <u>cattle</u> are <u>ringstraked</u>, speckled, and grisled: for I have seen <u>all</u> that **Laban** doeth unto thee.
- 13 I am the God of Bethel, where thou <u>anointedst</u> the <u>pillar</u>, and where thou <u>vowedst</u> a <u>vow</u> unto me: now <u>arise</u>, get thee *out* from this <u>land</u>, and <u>return</u> unto the land of thy <u>kindred</u>.
- ¹⁴ And Rachel and Leah answered and said unto him, Is there yet any portion or inheritance for us in our father's house?
- 15 Are we not counted of him strangers? for he hath sold us, and hath quite devoured also our money.
- 16 For all the <u>riches</u> which God hath taken from our <u>father</u>, that is ours, and our children's: now then, whatsoever God hath said unto thee, do.
- 17 Then Jacob rose up, and set his sons and his wives upon camels;

- 18 And he <u>carried away</u> all his <u>cattle</u>, and all his <u>goods</u> which he had gotten, the cattle of his getting, which he had gotten in **Padanaram**, for to go to **Isaac** his <u>father</u> in the <u>land</u> of **Canaan**.
- ¹⁹ And Laban went to <u>shear</u> his <u>sheep</u>: and <u>Rachel</u> had <u>stolen</u> the <u>images</u> that were her <u>father's</u>.
- 20 And Jacob stole away unawares to Laban the Syrian, in that he told him not that he fled.
- 21 So he <u>fled</u> with *all* that he had; and he <u>rose</u> *up*, and <u>passed</u> over the <u>river</u>, and set his <u>face</u> *toward* the mount **Gilead**.
- 22 And it was told **Laban** on the <u>third day</u> that **Jacob** was <u>fled</u>.
- 23 And he took his brethren with him, and <u>pursued</u> after him <u>seven days' journey</u>; and they <u>overtook</u> him in the <u>mount</u> **Gilead**.
- 24 And God came to Laban the Syrian in a <u>dream</u> by <u>night</u>, and said unto him, Take heed that thou speak <u>not</u> to Jacob either <u>good</u> or <u>bad</u>.
- 25 Then Laban overtook Jacob. Now Jacob had pitched his tent in the mount: and Laban with his brethren pitched in the mount of Gilead.
- ²⁶ And Laban said to Jacob, What hast thou done, that thou hast <u>stolen away</u> unawares to me, and <u>carried away</u> my daughters, as <u>captives</u> taken with the <u>sword</u>?
- 27 Wherefore didst thou <u>flee away secretly</u>, and <u>steal away</u> from me; and didst <u>not</u> tell me, that I might have <u>sent</u> thee away with <u>mirth</u>, and with <u>songs</u>, with <u>tabret</u>, and with <u>harp</u>?
- 28 And hast not suffered me to kiss my sons and my daughters? thou hast now done foolishly in so doing.
- ²⁹ It is in the <u>power</u> of my <u>hand</u> to do you <u>hurt</u>: but the <u>God</u> of your <u>father</u> spake unto me <u>yesternight</u>, saying, Take thou heed that thou <u>speak</u> <u>not</u> to <u>Jacob</u> either <u>good</u> or <u>bad</u>.
- 30 And now, though thou wouldest needs be gone, because thou <u>sore</u> longedst after thy <u>father's house</u>, yet wherefore hast thou <u>stolen</u> my <u>gods</u>?
- 31 And **Jacob** answered and said to **Laban**, Because I was <u>afraid</u>: for I said, *Peradventure* thou wouldest take by <u>force</u> thy daughters from me.
- 32 With whomsoever thou <u>findest</u> thy <u>gods</u>, let him <u>not live</u>: <u>before</u> our brethren <u>discern</u> thou what is thine with me, and take it to thee. For <u>Jacob knew not</u> that <u>Rachel</u> had <u>stolen</u> them.
- 33 And Laban went into Jacob's tent, and into Leah's tent, and into the two maidservants tents; but he found them not. Then went he out of Leah's tent, and entered into Rachel's tent.
- 34 Now Rachel had taken the <u>images</u>, and put them in the <u>camel's furniture</u>, and <u>sat</u> upon them. And <u>Laban searched</u> all the <u>tent</u>, but <u>found</u> them <u>not</u>.

- ³⁵ And she said to her <u>father</u>, Let it <u>not displease</u> my <u>lord</u> that I <u>cannot rise</u> up before thee; for the <u>custom</u> of <u>women</u> is upon me. And he <u>searched</u> but <u>found not</u> the <u>images</u>.
- ³⁶ And Jacob was <u>wroth</u>, and <u>chode</u> with Laban: and Jacob answered and said to Laban, What is my <u>trespass</u>? what is my <u>sin</u>, that thou hast <u>so hotly pursued</u> after me?
- 37 Whereas thou hast <u>searched</u> *all* my <u>stuff</u>, what hast thou <u>found</u> of *all* thy household stuff? set it here *before* my brethren and thy brethren, that they may <u>judge</u> *betwixt* us both.
- 38 This <u>twenty years</u> have I been with thee; thy <u>ewes</u> and thy she <u>goats</u> have <u>not cast</u> their <u>young</u>, and the <u>rams</u> of thy <u>flock</u> have I <u>not eaten</u>.
- 39 That which was torn of beasts I brought not unto thee; I bare the loss of it; of my hand didst thou require it, whether stolen by day, or stolen by night.
- 40 Thus I was; in the <u>day</u> the <u>drought consumed</u> me, and the <u>frost</u> by <u>night</u>; and my <u>sleep departed</u> from mine <u>eyes</u>.
- 41 Thus have I been <u>twenty years</u> in thy <u>house</u>; I <u>served</u> thee <u>fourteen years</u> for thy <u>two</u> daughters, and <u>six years</u> for thy <u>cattle</u>: and thou hast <u>changed</u> my <u>wages ten times</u>.
- 42 <u>Except</u> the **God** of my <u>father</u>, the **God** of **Abraham**, and the <u>fear</u> of <u>Isaac</u>, had been with me, <u>surely</u> thou hadst <u>sent</u> me <u>away</u> now <u>empty</u>. <u>God</u> hath seen mine <u>affliction</u> and the <u>labour</u> of my <u>hands</u>, and <u>rebuked</u> thee yesternight.
- 43 And Laban answered and said unto Jacob, These daughters are my daughters, and these children are my children, and these cattle are my cattle, and all that thou seest is mine: and what can I do this day unto these my daughters, or unto their children which they have born?
- 44 Now therefore come thou, let us make a <u>covenant</u>, I and thou; and let it be for a <u>witness</u> between me and thee.
- 45 And Jacob took a <u>stone</u>, and <u>set</u> it *up* for a <u>pillar</u>.
- 46 And Jacob said unto his brethren, <u>Gather stones</u>; and they took stones, and made an <u>heap</u>: and they did <u>eat</u> there upon the heap.
- 47 And Laban called it Jegarsahadutha: but Jacob called it Galeed.
- ⁴⁸ And Laban said, This <u>heap</u> is a <u>witness</u> between me and thee this <u>day</u>. Therefore was the name of it called Galeed;
- ⁴⁹ And Mizpah; for he said, The LORD watch between me and thee, when we are absent one from another.

- 50 If thou shalt <u>afflict</u> my daughters, or if thou shalt take <u>other wives</u> beside my daughters, <u>no man</u> is with us; see, **God** is witness betwixt me and thee.
- ⁵¹ And Laban said to Jacob, Behold this <u>heap</u>, and behold this <u>pillar</u>, which I have <u>cast</u> betwixt me and thee:
- 52 This <u>heap</u> be <u>witness</u>, and this <u>pillar</u> be witness, that I will <u>not pass</u> over this heap to thee, and that thou shalt <u>not pass</u> over this heap and this pillar unto me, for <u>harm</u>.
- 53 The God of Abraham, and the God of Nahor, the God of their <u>father</u>, <u>judge</u> betwixt us. And Jacob <u>sware</u> by the <u>fear</u> of his father <u>Isaac</u>.
- 54 Then Jacob offered sacrifice upon the mount, and called his brethren to eat bread: and they did eat bread, and tarried all night in the mount.
- 55 And *early* in the <u>morning Laban rose</u> *up*, and <u>kissed</u> his sons and his daughters, and <u>blessed</u> them: and <u>Laban departed</u>, and <u>returned</u> unto his <u>place</u>.

- And Jacob went on his <u>way</u>, and the <u>angels</u> of <u>God met</u> him.
- ² And when Jacob saw them, he said, This is God's host: and he called the name of that place Mahanaim.
- 3 And Jacob sent messengers before him to Esau his brother unto the land of Seir, the country of Edom.
- ⁴ And he <u>commanded</u> them, saying, Thus shall ye speak unto my <u>lord</u> Esau; Thy <u>servant</u> Jacob saith thus, I have <u>sojourned</u> with <u>Laban</u>, and <u>stayed</u> there until now:
- ⁵ And I have <u>oxen</u>, and <u>asses</u>, <u>flocks</u>, and <u>menservants</u>, and <u>womenservants</u>: and I have <u>sent</u> to tell my <u>lord</u>, that I may <u>find grace</u> in thy <u>sight</u>.
- 6 And the <u>messengers</u> <u>returned</u> to **Jacob**, saying, We came to thy brother **Esau**, and also he cometh to **meet** thee, and four hundred men with him.
- Then Jacob was *greatly* <u>afraid</u> and <u>distressed</u>: and he <u>divided</u> the people that was with him, and the <u>flocks</u>, and <u>herds</u>, and the <u>camels</u>, into <u>two bands</u>;
- 8 And said, If Esau come to the <u>one company</u>, and <u>smite</u> it, then the <u>other</u> company which is <u>left</u> shall <u>escape</u>.
- ⁹ And Jacob said, O God of my <u>father Abraham</u>, and God of my father Isaac, the LORD which saidst unto me, Return unto thy country, and to thy kindred, and I will deal well with thee:
- 10 I am not worthy of the least of all the mercies, and of all the truth, which thou hast shewed unto thy servant; for with my staff I passed over this Jordan; and now I am become two bands.
- Deliver me, I pray thee, from the hand of my brother, from the hand of Esau: for I fear him, lest he will come and smite me, and the mother with the children.
- 12 And thou saidst, I will *surely* do thee good, and make thy <u>seed</u> as the <u>sand</u> of the <u>sea</u>, which <u>cannot</u> be <u>numbered</u> for <u>multitude</u>.
- 13 And he <u>lodged</u> there that same <u>night</u>; and took of that which came to his <u>hand</u> a <u>present</u> for **Esau** his brother;
- 14 Two hundred she goats, and twenty he goats, two hundred ewes, and twenty rams,
- 15 Thirty milch camels with their colts, forty kine, and ten bulls, twenty she asses, and ten foals.
- 16 And he <u>delivered</u> them into the <u>hand</u> of his <u>servants</u>, <u>every drove</u> by themselves; and said unto his <u>servants</u>, <u>Pass</u> over *before* me, and put a <u>space</u> betwixt <u>drove</u> and *drove*.

- 17 And he <u>commanded</u> the <u>foremost</u>, saying, When **Esau** my brother <u>meeteth</u> thee, and asketh thee, saying, Whose art thou? and whither goest thou? and whose are these *before* thee?
- 18 Then thou shalt say, They be thy <u>servant</u> **Jacob's**; it is a <u>present sent</u> unto my <u>lord</u> **Esau**: and, behold, also he is *behind* us.
- 19 And so <u>commanded</u> he the <u>second</u>, and the <u>third</u>, and <u>all</u> that <u>followed</u> the <u>droves</u>, saying, On this <u>manner</u> shall ye speak unto **Esau**, when ye <u>find</u> him.
- 20 And say ye moreover, Behold, thy <u>servant</u> **Jacob** is *behind* us. For he said, I will <u>appease</u> him with the <u>present</u> that goeth *before* me, and *afterward* I will see his <u>face</u>; *peradventure* he will <u>accept</u> of me.
- 21 So went the <u>present</u> over *before* him: and himself <u>lodged</u> that <u>night</u> in the <u>company</u>.
- 22 And he <u>rose up</u> that <u>night</u>, and took his <u>two wives</u>, and his <u>two womenservants</u>, and his <u>eleven</u> sons, and <u>passed</u> over the <u>ford</u> <u>Jabbok</u>.
- 23 And he took them, and <u>sent</u> them over the <u>brook</u>, and sent over that he had.
- 24 And Jacob was <u>left</u> alone; and there <u>wrestled</u> a man with him until the <u>breaking</u> of the <u>day</u>.
- 25 And when he saw that he <u>prevailed not against him</u>, he <u>touched</u> the <u>hollow</u> of his <u>thigh</u>; and the hollow of <u>Jacob's</u> thigh was <u>out of joint</u>, as he <u>wrestled</u> with him.
- 26 And he said, Let me go, for the day breaketh. And he said, I will not let thee go, except thou bless me.
- 27 And he said unto him, What is thy name? And he said, Jacob.
- 28 And he said, Thy name shall be called <u>no</u> *more* **Jacob**, but *Israel*: for as a <u>prince</u> hast thou <u>power</u> with **God** and with <u>men</u>, and hast <u>prevailed</u>.
- ²⁹ And Jacob asked him, and said, Tell me, I pray thee, thy name. And he said, Wherefore is it that thou
 dost ask after my name? And he <u>blessed</u> him there.
- 30 And Jacob called the name of the place Peniel: for I have seen God face to face, and my life is preserved.
- 31 And as he <u>passed</u> over **Penuel** the <u>sun rose</u> upon him, and he <u>halted</u> upon his <u>thigh</u>.
- 32 Therefore the children of **Israel** <u>eat not</u> of the <u>sinew</u> which <u>shrank</u>, which is upon the <u>hollow</u> of the <u>thigh</u>, unto this <u>day</u>: because he <u>touched</u> the hollow of **Jacob's** thigh in the sinew that shrank.

- And Jacob <u>lifted</u> up his <u>eyes</u>, and looked, and, behold, <u>Esau</u> came, and with him <u>four hundred men</u>. And he <u>divided</u> the children unto <u>Leah</u>, and unto <u>Rachel</u>, and unto the <u>two handmaids</u>.
- ² And he put the <u>handmaids</u> and their children foremost, and <u>Leah</u> and her children *after*, and <u>Rachel</u> and <u>Joseph *hindermost*</u>.
- 3 And he <u>passed</u> over *before* them, and <u>bowed</u> himself to the <u>ground seven times</u>, until he came *near* to his brother.
- ⁴ And Esau <u>ran</u> to <u>meet</u> him, and <u>embraced</u> him, and <u>fell</u> on his <u>neck</u>, and <u>kissed</u> him: and they <u>wept</u>.
- ⁵ And he <u>lifted up</u> his <u>eyes</u>, and saw the <u>women</u> and the children; and said, Who are those with thee? And he said, The children which <u>God</u> hath <u>graciously</u> given thy <u>servant</u>.
- 6 Then the <u>handmaidens</u> came *near*, they and their children, and they <u>bowed</u> themselves.
- And Leah also with her children came near, and bowed themselves: and after came Joseph near and Rachel, and they bowed themselves.
- 8 And he said, What <u>meanest</u> thou by <u>all</u> this <u>drove</u> which I <u>met</u>? And he said, These are to <u>find grace</u> in the <u>sight</u> of my <u>lord</u>.
- 9 And Esau said, I have enough, my brother; keep that thou hast unto thyself.
- 10 And Jacob said, Nay, I pray thee, if now I have found grace in thy sight, then receive my present at my hand: for therefore I have seen thy face, as though I had seen the face of God, and thou wast pleased with me.
- ¹¹ Take, I pray thee, my <u>blessing</u> that is brought to thee; because <u>God</u> hath <u>dealt</u> <u>graciously</u> with me, and because I have <u>enough</u>. And he <u>urged</u> him, and he took it.
- 12 And he said, Let us take our <u>journey</u>, and let us go, and I will go *before* thee.
- ¹³ And he said unto him, My <u>lord knoweth</u> that the children are <u>tender</u>, and the <u>flocks</u> and <u>herds</u> with <u>young</u> are with me: and if <u>men</u> should <u>overdrive</u> them <u>one day</u>, <u>all</u> the <u>flock</u> will <u>die</u>.
- 14 Let my <u>lord</u>, I pray thee, <u>pass</u> over *before* his <u>servant</u>: and I will <u>lead</u> on *softly*, according as the <u>cattle</u> that goeth *before* me and the children be able to <u>endure</u>, until I come unto my <u>lord</u> unto <u>Seir</u>.
- ¹⁵ And Esau said, Let me now <u>leave</u> with thee some of the <u>folk</u> that are with me. And he said, What <u>needeth</u> it? let me <u>find grace</u> in the <u>sight</u> of my <u>lord</u>.

- 16 So Esau returned that day on his way unto Seir.
- 17 And Jacob journeyed to Succoth, and built him an house, and made booths for his cattle: therefore the name of the place is called Succoth.
- 18 And Jacob came to Shalem, a <u>city</u> of Shechem, which is in the land of Canaan, when he came from Padanaram; and <u>pitched</u> his <u>tent</u> *before* the city.
- ¹⁹ And he <u>bought</u> a <u>parcel</u> of a <u>field</u>, where he had <u>spread</u> his <u>tent</u>, at the <u>hand</u> of the children of <u>Hamor</u>,
 Shechem's <u>father</u>, for an <u>hundred pieces</u> of <u>money</u>.
- 20 And he <u>erected</u> there an <u>altar</u>, and called it **Elelohelsrael**.

- And Dinah the daughter of Leah, which she <u>bare</u> unto Jacob, went *out* to see the daughters of the <u>land</u>.
- ² And when Shechem the son of Hamor the Hivite, <u>prince</u> of the <u>country</u>, saw her, he took her, and <u>lay</u> with her, and <u>defiled</u> her.
- 3 And his <u>soul clave</u> unto <u>Dinah</u> the daughter of <u>Jacob</u>, and he <u>loved</u> the <u>damsel</u>, and spake *kindly* unto the damsel.
- ⁴ And Shechem spake unto his <u>father</u> Hamor, saying, Get me this <u>damsel</u> to <u>wife</u>.
- ⁵ And Jacob heard that he had <u>defiled</u> Dinah his daughter: now his sons were with his <u>cattle</u> in the <u>field</u>: and Jacob <u>held</u> his <u>peace</u> until they were come.
- 6 And Hamor the father of Shechem went out unto Jacob to commune with him.
- And the sons of Jacob came out of the <u>field</u> when they heard it: and the <u>men</u> were <u>grieved</u>, and they were <u>very wroth</u>, because he had <u>wrought folly</u> in <u>Israel</u> in <u>Iying</u> with <u>Jacob's</u> daughter: which <u>thing</u> <u>ought</u> not to be done.
- 8 And Hamor communed with them, saying, The soul of my son Shechem longeth for your daughter: I pray you give her him to wife.
- 9 And make ye marriages with us, and give your daughters unto us, and take our daughters unto you.
- 10 And ye shall <u>dwell</u> with us: and the <u>land</u> shall be *before* you; dwell and <u>trade</u> ye therein, and get you <u>possessions</u> therein.
- ¹¹ And Shechem said unto her <u>father</u> and unto her brethren, Let me <u>find grace</u> in your <u>eyes</u>, and what ye shall say unto me I will give.
- 12 Ask me never so much dowry and gift, and I will give according as ye shall say unto me: but give me the damsel to wife.
- ¹³ And the sons of Jacob answered Shechem and Hamor his <u>father</u> deceitfully, and said, because he had <u>defiled</u> Dinah their sister:
- 14 And they said unto them, We <u>cannot</u> do this <u>thing</u>, to give our sister to <u>one</u> that is <u>uncircumcised</u>, for that were a <u>reproach</u> unto us:
- ¹⁵ But in this will we <u>consent</u> unto you: If ye will be as we be, that <u>every male</u> of you be <u>circumcised</u>;

- 16 Then will we give our daughters unto you, and we will take your daughters to us, and we will dwell with you, and we will become one people.
- ¹⁷ But if ye will <u>not</u> hearken unto us, to be <u>circumcised</u>; then will we take our daughter, and we will be gone.
- ¹⁸ And their <u>words pleased</u> Hamor, and Shechem Hamor's son.
- 19 And the young man deferred not to do the thing, because he had delight in Jacob's daughter: and he was more honourable than all the house of his father.
- ²⁰ And Hamor and Shechem his son came unto the gate of their city, and communed with the men of their city, saying,
- ²¹ These men are peaceable with us; therefore let them dwell in the land, and trade therein; for the land, behold, it is large enough for them; let us take their daughters to us for wives, and let us give them our daughters.
- ²² Only herein will the <u>men consent</u> unto us for to <u>dwell</u> with us, to be <u>one</u> people, if <u>every male</u> among us be <u>circumcised</u>, as they are circumcised.
- 23 Shall <u>not</u> their <u>cattle</u> and their <u>substance</u> and <u>every beast</u> of their's be our's? only let us <u>consent</u> unto them, and they will <u>dwell</u> with us.
- ²⁴ And unto Hamor and unto Shechem his son hearkened all that went out of the gate of his city; and every male was circumcised, all that went out of the gate of his city.
- 25 And it came to <u>pass</u> on the <u>third day</u>, when they were <u>sore</u>, that <u>two</u> of the sons of <u>Jacob</u>, <u>Simeon</u> and <u>Levi</u>, <u>Dinah's</u> brethren, took each <u>man</u> his <u>sword</u>, and came upon the <u>city</u> <u>boldly</u>, and <u>slew</u> <u>all</u> the <u>males</u>.
- 26 And they <u>slew</u> **Hamor** and **Shechem** his son with the <u>edge</u> of the <u>sword</u>, and took **Dinah** *out* of **Shechem's** house, and went *out*.
- 27 The sons of **Jacob** came upon the <u>slain</u>, and <u>spoiled</u> the <u>city</u>, because they had <u>defiled</u> their sister.
- ²⁸ They took their <u>sheep</u>, and their <u>oxen</u>, and their <u>asses</u>, and that which was in the <u>city</u>, and that which was in the <u>field</u>,
- ²⁹ And all their wealth, and all their little ones, and their wives took they captive, and spoiled even all that was in the house.
- ³⁰ And Jacob said to Simeon and Levi, Ye have <u>troubled</u> me to make me to <u>stink</u> among the <u>inhabitants</u> of the land, among the <u>Canaanites</u> and the <u>Perizzites</u>: and I being <u>few</u> in <u>number</u>, they shall <u>gather</u> themselves together <u>against</u> me, and <u>slay</u> me; and I shall be <u>destroyed</u>, I and my <u>house</u>.
- 31 And they said, Should he <u>deal</u> with our sister as with an <u>harlot</u>?

- And God said unto Jacob, Arise, go up to Bethel, and dwell there: and make there an altar unto God, that appeared unto thee when thou fleddest from the face of Esau thy brother.
- ² Then Jacob said unto his <u>household</u>, and to *all* that were with him, Put <u>away</u> the *strange gods* that are among you, and be <u>clean</u>, and <u>change</u> your <u>garments</u>:
- ³ And let us <u>arise</u>, and go up to Bethel; and I will make there an <u>altar</u> unto God, who answered me in the <u>day</u> of my <u>distress</u>, and was with me in the <u>way</u> which I went.
- ⁴ And they gave unto Jacob all the strange gods which were in their hand, and all their earrings which were in their ears; and Jacob hid them under the oak which was by Shechem.
- ⁵ And they <u>journeyed</u>: and the <u>terror</u> of God was upon the <u>cities</u> that were round about them, and they did not <u>pursue after</u> the sons of <u>Jacob</u>.
- ⁶ So Jacob came to Luz, which is in the land of Canaan, that is, Bethel, he and all the people that were with him.
- 7 And he <u>built</u> there an <u>altar</u>, and called the <u>place</u> **Elbethel**: because there **God** <u>appeared</u> unto him, when he <u>fled</u> from the <u>face</u> of his brother.
- But Deborah, Rebekah's <u>nurse</u> <u>died</u>, and she was <u>buried</u> <u>beneath</u> Bethel <u>under</u> an <u>oak</u>: and the name of it was called Allonbachuth.
- 9 And God appeared unto Jacob again, when he came *out* of Padanaram, and blessed him.
- 10 And God said unto him, Thy <u>name</u> is Jacob: thy name shall <u>not</u> be called *any more* Jacob, but Israel shall be thy name: and he called his name Israel.
- 11 And God said unto him, I am God Almighty: be <u>fruitful</u> and <u>multiply</u>; a <u>nation</u> and a <u>company</u> of <u>nations</u> shall be of thee, and <u>kings</u> shall come *out* of thy loins;
- 12 And the <u>land</u> which I gave **Abraham** and **Isaac**, to thee I will give it, and to thy <u>seed</u> *after* thee will I give the land.
- 13 And God went up from him in the place where he talked with him.
- ¹⁴ And Jacob set up a <u>pillar</u> in the <u>place</u> where he <u>talked</u> with him, even a pillar of <u>stone</u>: and he <u>poured</u> a <u>drink offering</u> thereon, and he poured <u>oil</u> thereon.
- 15 And Jacob called the name of the place where God spake with him, Bethel.

- 16 And they journeyed from Bethel; and there was but a *little* way to come to Ephrath: and Rachel travailed, and she had hard labour.
- 17 And it came to <u>pass</u>, when she was in <u>hard labour</u>, that the <u>midwife</u> said unto her, <u>Fear not</u>; thou shalt have this **son** *also*.
- 18 And it came to <u>pass</u>, as her <u>soul</u> was in <u>departing</u>, (for she <u>died</u>) that she called his name <u>Benoni</u>: but his <u>father</u> called him <u>Benjamin</u>.
- 19 And Rachel <u>died</u>, and was <u>buried</u> in the <u>way</u> to *Ephrath*, which is *Bethlehem*.
- And Jacob set a <u>pillar</u> upon her <u>grave</u>: that is the pillar of Rachel's grave unto this <u>day</u>.
- 21 And Israel journeyed, and spread his tent beyond the tower of Edar.
- 22 And it came to <u>pass</u>, when <u>Israel dwelt</u> in that land, that <u>Reuben</u> went and <u>lay</u> with <u>Bilhah</u> his <u>father's</u> <u>concubine</u>: and <u>Israel</u> heard it. Now the sons of <u>Jacob</u> were <u>twelve</u>:
- ²³ The sons of Leah; Reuben, Jacob's <u>firstborn</u>, and <u>Simeon</u>, and <u>Levi</u>, and <u>Judah</u>, and <u>Issachar</u>, and <u>Zebulun</u>:
- 24 The sons of Rachel; Joseph, and Benjamin:
- 25 And the sons of Bilhah, Rachel's handmaid; Dan, and Naphtali:
- 26 And the sons of Zilpah, Leah's <u>handmaid</u>: Gad, and Asher: these are the sons of Jacob, which were <u>born</u> to him in Padanaram.
- 27 And Jacob came unto Isaac his <u>father</u> unto <u>Mamre</u>, unto the <u>city</u> of <u>Arbah</u>, which is <u>Hebron</u>, where <u>Abraham and Isaac sojourned</u>.
- ²⁸ And the <u>days</u> of <u>lsaac</u> were an <u>hundred and fourscore years</u>.
- ²⁹ And Isaac gave up the ghost, and died, and was gathered unto his people, being old and full of days: and his sons Esau and Jacob buried him.

- Now these are the generations of Esau, who is Edom.
- ² Esau took his <u>wives</u> of the daughters of Canaan; Adah the daughter of Elon the Hittite, and Aholibamah the daughter of Anah the daughter of Zibeon the Hivite;
- 3 And Bashemath Ishmael's daughter, sister of Nebajoth.
- ⁴ And Adah <u>bare</u> to Esau Eliphaz; and Bashemath bare Reuel;
- 5 And Aholibamah <u>bare</u> Jeush, and Jaalam, and Korah: these are the sons of Esau, which were <u>born</u> unto him in the land of Canaan.
- ⁶ And Esau took his wives, and his sons, and his daughters, and all the persons of his house, and his cattle, and all his beasts, and all his substance, which he had got in the land of Canaan; and went into the country from the face of his brother Jacob.
- ⁷ For their <u>riches</u> were *more* than that they might <u>dwell</u> together; and the <u>land</u> wherein they were <u>strangers</u> could not bear them because of their cattle.
- 8 Thus <u>dwelt</u> Esau in <u>mount</u> Seir: Esau is Edom.
- ⁹ And these are the <u>generations</u> of <u>Esau</u> the <u>father</u> of the <u>Edomites</u> in <u>mount</u> <u>Seir</u>:
- 10 These are the <u>names</u> of **Esau's** sons; **Eliphaz** the son of **Adah** the wife of **Esau**, **Reuel** the son of **Bashemath** the wife of **Esau**.
- ¹¹ And the sons of Eliphaz were Teman, Omar, Zepho, and Gatam, and Kenaz.
- ¹² And Timna was <u>concubine</u> to <u>Eliphaz Esau's</u> son; and she <u>bare</u> to <u>Eliphaz Amalek</u>: these were the sons of <u>Adah Esau's</u> wife.
- ¹³ And these are the sons of Reuel; Nahath, and Zerah, Shammah, and Mizzah: these were the sons of Bashemath Esau's wife.
- ¹⁴ And these were the sons of Aholibamah, the daughter of Anah the daughter of Zibeon, Esau's wife: and she bare to Esau Jeush, and Jaalam, and Korah.
- ¹⁵ These were <u>dukes</u> of the sons of Esau: the sons of Eliphaz the <u>firstborn</u> son of Esau; duke Teman, duke Omar, duke Zepho, duke Kenaz,
- 16 Duke Korah, duke Gatam, and duke Amalek: these are the <u>dukes</u> that came of Eliphaz in the <u>land</u> of Edom; these were the sons of Adah.

- ¹⁷ And these are the sons of Reuel Esau's son; duke Nahath, duke Zerah, duke Shammah, duke Mizzah: these are the dukes that came of Reuel in the land of Edom; these are the sons of Bashemath Esau's wife.
- ¹⁸ And these are the sons of Aholibamah Esau's wife; duke Jeush, duke Jaalam, duke Korah: these
 were the dukes that came of Aholibamah the daughter of Anah, Esau's wife.
- ¹⁹ These are the sons of Esau, who is Edom, and these are their <u>dukes</u>.
- 20 These are the sons of **Seir** the **Horite**, who <u>inhabited</u> the <u>land</u>; **Lotan**, and **Shobal**, and **Zibeon**, and **Anah**,
- 21 And **Dishon**, and **Ezer**, and **Dishan**: these are the <u>dukes</u> of the **Horites**, the children of **Seir** in the land of **Edom**.
- ²² And the children of Lotan were Hori and Hemam; and Lotan's <u>sister</u> was Timna.
- ²³ And the children of Shobal were these; Alvan, and Manahath, and Ebal, Shepho, and Onam.
- ²⁴ And these are the children of **Zibeon**; both **Ajah**, and **Anah**: this was that **Anah** that <u>found</u> the <u>mules</u> in the <u>wilderness</u>, as he <u>fed</u> the <u>asses</u> of **Zibeon** his <u>father</u>.
- 25 And the children of **Anah** were these; **Dishon**, and **Aholibamah** the daughter of **Anah**.
- ²⁶ And these are the children of **Dishon**; **Hemdan**, and **Eshban**, and **Ithran**, and **Cheran**.
- 27 The children of **Ezer** are these; **Bilhan**, and **Zaavan**, and **Akan**.
- ²⁸ The children of **Dishan** are these; **Uz**, and **Aran**.
- 29 These are the <u>dukes</u> that came of the **Horites**; duke **Lotan**, duke **Shobal**, duke **Zibeon**, duke **Anah**,
- ³⁰ Duke **Dishon**, duke **Ezer**, duke **Dishan**: these are the <u>dukes</u> that came of **Hori**, among their dukes in the land of **Seir**.
- 31 And these are the <u>kings</u> that <u>reigned</u> in the land of **Edom**, *before* there reigned *any* king over the children of **Israel**.
- 32 And Bela the son of Beor reigned in Edom: and the name of his city was Dinhabah.
- 33 And Bela died, and Jobab the son of Zerah of Bozrah reigned in his stead.
- 34 And Jobab died, and Husham of the land of Temani reigned in his stead.
- ³⁵ And Husham died, and Hadad the son of Bedad, who smote Midian in the field of Moab, reigned in his stead: and the name of his city was Avith.
- 36 And Hadad died, and Samlah of Masrekah reigned in his stead.
- 37 And Samlah died, and Saul of Rehoboth by the river reigned in his stead.

- 38 And Saul died, and Baalhanan the son of Achbor reigned in his stead.
- 39 And Baalhanan the son of Achbor <u>died</u>, and Hadar <u>reigned</u> in his stead: and the name of his <u>city</u> was **Pau**; and his <u>wife's</u> name was **Mehetabel**, the daughter of **Matred**, the daughter of **Mezahab**.
- 40 And these are the <u>names</u> of the <u>dukes</u> that came of **Esau**, according to their <u>families</u>, <u>after</u> their <u>places</u>, by their names; duke **Timnah**, duke **Alvah**, duke **Jetheth**,
- 41 Duke Aholibamah, duke Elah, duke Pinon,
- 42 Duke Kenaz, duke Teman, duke Mibzar,
- ⁴³ Duke Magdiel, duke Iram: these be the <u>dukes</u> of Edom, according to their <u>habitations</u> in the land of their <u>possession</u>: he is Esau the <u>father</u> of the Edomites.

- And Jacob dwelt in the land wherein his father was a stranger, in the land of Canaan.
- ² These are the <u>generations</u> of <u>Jacob</u>. <u>Joseph</u>, being <u>seventeen years old</u>, was <u>feeding</u> the <u>flock</u> with his brethren; and the lad was with the sons of <u>Bilhah</u>, and with the sons of <u>Zilpah</u>, his <u>father's wives</u>: and <u>Joseph</u> brought unto his father their *evil* <u>report</u>.
- 3 Now Israel <u>loved</u> Joseph *more* than *all* his children, because he was the son of his <u>old age</u>: and he made him a <u>coat</u> of *many* <u>colours</u>.
- ⁴ And when his brethren saw that their <u>father loved</u> him *more* than *all* his brethren, they <u>hated</u> him, and could <u>not</u> speak <u>peaceably</u> unto him.
- 5 And Joseph <u>dreamed</u> a <u>dream</u>, and he told it his brethren: and they <u>hated</u> him yet the *more*.
- ⁶ And he said unto them, Hear, I pray you, this <u>dream</u> which I have dreamed:
- ⁷ For, behold, we were <u>binding sheaves</u> in the <u>field</u>, and, lo, my <u>sheaf arose</u>, and also <u>stood</u> *upright*, and, behold, your sheaves stood round about, and made <u>obeisance</u> to my sheaf.
- 8 And his brethren said to him, Shalt thou <u>indeed reign</u> over us? or shalt thou indeed have <u>dominion</u> over us? And they <u>hated</u> him yet the *more* for his dreams, and for his words.
- 9 And he <u>dreamed</u> yet <u>another dream</u>, and told it his brethren, and said, Behold, I have dreamed a dream *more*; and, behold, the <u>sun</u> and the <u>moon</u> and the <u>eleven stars</u> made <u>obeisance</u> to me.
- 10 And he told it to his <u>father</u>, and to his brethren: and his father <u>rebuked</u> him, and said unto him, What is this dream that thou hast dreamed? Shall I and thy <u>mother</u> and thy <u>brethren indeed</u> come to <u>bow</u> <u>down</u> ourselves to thee to the earth?
- ¹¹ And his brethren <u>envied</u> him; but his <u>father observed</u> the saying.
- 12 And his brethren went to feed their father's flock in Shechem.
- ¹³ And Israel said unto Joseph, Do <u>not</u> thy brethren <u>feed</u> the <u>flock</u> in Shechem? come, and I will <u>send</u> thee unto them. And he said to him, Here am I.
- 14 And he said to him, Go, I pray thee, see whether it be well with thy brethren, and well with the flocks; and bring me word again. So he sent him out of the vale of Hebron, and he came to Shechem.
- ¹⁵ And a certain man found him, and, behold, he was wandering in the field: and the man asked him, saying, What seekest thou?

- ¹⁶ And he said, I <u>seek</u> my brethren: tell me, I pray thee, where they <u>feed</u> their <u>flocks</u>.
- 17 And the <u>man</u> said, They are <u>departed</u> hence; for I heard them say, Let us go to **Dothan**. And **Joseph** went *after* his brethren, and found them in **Dothan**.
- ¹⁸ And when they saw him afar off, even before he came near unto them, they conspired against him to slay him.
- ¹⁹ And they said one to another, Behold, this dreamer cometh.
- Come now therefore, and let us <u>slay</u> him, and <u>cast</u> him into some <u>pit</u>, and we will say, Some *evil* <u>beast</u> hath <u>devoured</u> him: and **we shall see what will become of his** <u>dreams</u>.
- 21 And Reuben heard it, and he <u>delivered</u> him out of their <u>hands</u>; and said, Let us <u>not kill</u> him.
- 22 And **Reuben** said unto them, **Shed** no **blood**, but **cast** him into this **pit** that is in the <u>wilderness</u>, and **lay** no hand upon him; that he might <u>rid</u> him *out* of their <u>hands</u>, to <u>deliver</u> him to his <u>father again</u>.
- ²³ And it came to <u>pass</u>, when <u>Joseph</u> was come unto his brethren, that they <u>stript</u> <u>Joseph</u> out of his <u>coat</u>, his coat of <u>many colours</u> that was on him;
- 24 And they took him, and cast him into a pit: and the pit was empty, there was no water in it.
- ²⁵ And they <u>sat down</u> to <u>eat bread</u>: and they <u>lifted up</u> their <u>eyes</u> and looked, and, behold, a <u>company</u> of <u>lshmeelites</u> came from <u>Gilead</u> with their <u>camels bearing spicery</u> and <u>balm</u> and <u>myrrh</u>, going to <u>carry</u> it down to <u>Egypt</u>.
- ²⁶ And Judah said unto his brethren, What <u>profit</u> is it if we <u>slay</u> our brother, and <u>conceal</u> his <u>blood</u>?
- ²⁷ Come, and let us <u>sell</u> him to the **Ishmeelites**, and let <u>not</u> our <u>hand</u> be upon him; for he is our brother and our <u>flesh</u>. And his brethren were <u>content</u>.
- Then there <u>passed</u> by <u>Midianites merchantmen</u>; and they drew and <u>lifted up Joseph out</u> of the <u>pit</u>, and <u>sold Joseph</u> to the <u>Ishmeelites</u> for <u>twenty pieces</u> of <u>silver</u>: and they brought <u>Joseph</u> into <u>Egypt</u>.
 - And he returned unto his brethren, and said, The child is <u>not</u>; and I, whither shall I go? ³¹ And they took **Joseph's <u>coat</u>**, and <u>killed</u> a <u>kid</u> of the <u>goats</u>, and <u>dipped</u> the <u>coat</u> in the <u>blood</u>; ³² And they <u>sent</u> the <u>coat</u> of <u>many colours</u>, and they brought it to their <u>father</u>; and said, This have we <u>found</u>: know now whether it be thy son's coat or <u>no</u>. ³³ And he knew it, and said, It is my son's <u>coat</u>; an evil <u>beast</u> hath <u>devoured</u> him; **Joseph** is <u>without doubt rent</u> in <u>pieces</u>. ³⁴ And **Jacob** rent his <u>clothes</u>, and put <u>sackcloth</u> upon his <u>loins</u>, and <u>mourned</u> for his son <u>many days</u>. ³⁵ And <u>all</u> his sons and <u>all</u> his daughters <u>rose</u> <u>up</u> to <u>comfort</u> him; but he <u>refused</u> to be <u>comforted</u>; and he said, For I will go <u>down</u> into the <u>grave</u> unto my son <u>mourning</u>. Thus his <u>father wept</u> for him. ³⁶ And the <u>Midianites sold</u> him into <u>Egypt</u> unto <u>Potiphar</u>, an <u>officer</u> of <u>Pharaoh's</u>, and captain of the quard.

- And it came to <u>pass</u> at that <u>time</u>, that <u>Judah</u> went *down* from his brethren, and <u>turned</u> in to a <u>certain</u> Adullamite, whose name was <u>Hirah</u>.
- ² And Judah saw there a daughter of a certain Canaanite, whose name was Shuah; and he took her, and went in unto her.
- 3 And she <u>conceived</u>, and <u>bare</u> a son; and he called his name Er.
- 4 And she conceived again, and bare a son; and she called his name Onan.
- 5 And she yet <u>again conceived</u>, and <u>bare</u> a son; and called his name <u>Shelah</u>: and he was at <u>Chezib</u>, when she bare him.
- 6 And Judah took a wife for Er his firstborn, whose name was *Tamar*.
- 7 And Er, Judah's firstborn, was *wicked* in the sight of the LORD; and the LORD *slew* him.
- 8 And Judah said unto Onan, Go in unto thy brother's wife, and marry her, and raise up seed to thy brother.
- 9 And Onan knew that the seed should not be his; and it came to pass, when he went in unto his brother's wife, that he spilled it on the ground, lest that he should give seed to his brother.
- 10 And the thing which he did *displeased* the LORD: wherefore he *slew* him *also*.
- 11 Then said **Judah** to **Tamar** his daughter *in law*, **Remain** a <u>widow</u> at thy <u>father's house</u>, till **Shelah** my son be <u>grown</u>: for he said, Lest *peradventure* he <u>die</u> also, as his brethren did. And **Tamar** went and <u>dwelt</u> in her father's house.
- 12 And in <u>process</u> of <u>time</u> the daughter of <u>Shuah Judah's wife died</u>; and <u>Judah</u> was <u>comforted</u>, and went <u>up</u> unto his <u>sheepshearers</u> to <u>Timnath</u>, he and his <u>friend</u> <u>Hirah</u> the <u>Adullamite</u>.
- 13 And it was told **Tamar**, saying, Behold thy <u>father</u> in law goeth up to **Timnath** to <u>shear</u> his <u>sheep</u>.
- 14 And she put her *widow's* <u>garments</u> *off* from her, and <u>covered</u> her with a <u>vail</u>, and <u>wrapped</u> herself, and <u>sat</u> in an *open* <u>place</u>, which is by the <u>way</u> to <u>Timnath</u>; for she saw that <u>Shelah</u> was <u>grown</u>, and she was <u>not</u> *given* unto him to <u>wife</u>.
- 15 When Judah saw her, he thought her to be an <u>harlot</u>, because she had <u>covered</u> her <u>face</u>.
- 16 And he <u>turned</u> unto her by the <u>way</u>, and said, Go to, I pray thee, let me <u>come in</u> unto thee; (for he <u>knew not</u> that she was his daughter <u>in law</u>.) And she said, What wilt thou <u>give</u> me, that thou mayest <u>come in</u> unto me?

- 17 And he said, I will send thee a kid from the flock. And she said, Wilt thou give me a pledge, till thou send it?
- 18 And he said, What <u>pledge</u> shall I give thee? And she said, Thy <u>signet</u>, and thy <u>bracelets</u>, and thy <u>staff</u> that is in thine <u>hand</u>. And he gave it her, and *came in* unto her, and she <u>conceived</u> by him.
- 19 And she <u>arose</u>, and went <u>away</u>, and <u>laid</u> by her <u>vail</u> from her, and put on the <u>garments</u> of her <u>widowhood</u>.
- 20 And Judah sent the kid by the hand of his friend the Adullamite, to receive his pledge from the woman's hand: but he found her not.
- 21 Then he asked the men of that place, saying, Where is the harlot, that was openly by the way side? And they said, There was no harlot in this place.
- ²² And he <u>returned</u> to <u>Judah</u>, and said, I <u>cannot find</u> her; and <u>also</u> the <u>men</u> of the <u>place</u> said, that there was <u>no harlot</u> in this place.
- 23 And **Judah** said, Let her take it to her, lest we be <u>shamed</u>: behold, I <u>sent</u> this <u>kid</u>, and thou hast <u>not</u> found her.
- 24 And it came to <u>pass</u> about <u>three months</u> *after*, that it was told **Judah**, saying, **Tamar** thy daughter *in law* hath <u>played</u> the <u>harlot</u>, and also, behold, she is *with child by* <u>whoredom</u>. And **Judah** said, Bring her forth, and let her be <u>burnt</u>.
- 25 When she was brought forth, she <u>sent</u> to her <u>father</u> *in law*, saying, By the <u>man</u>, whose these are, am I with child: and she said, <u>Discern</u>, I pray thee, whose are these, the <u>signet</u>, and <u>bracelets</u>, and <u>staff</u>.
- 26 And Judah <u>acknowledged</u> them, and said, She hath been *more* <u>righteous</u> than I; because that I gave her <u>not</u> to **Shelah** my son. And he <u>knew</u> her <u>again no</u> *more*.
- 27 And it came to <u>pass</u> in the <u>time</u> of her <u>travail</u>, that, behold, <u>twins</u> were in her <u>womb</u>.
- ²⁸ And it came to <u>pass</u>, when she <u>travailed</u>, that the **one put** *out* his <u>hand</u>: and the <u>midwife</u> took and <u>bound</u> upon his <u>hand</u> a <u>scarlet thread</u>, saying, This came <u>out first</u>.
- 29 And it came to <u>pass</u>, as he <u>drew</u> <u>back</u> his <u>hand</u>, that, behold, his **brother came** <u>out</u>. and she said, How hast thou <u>broken forth?</u> this <u>breach</u> be upon thee: therefore his <u>name</u> was called <u>Pharez</u>.
- 30 And *afterward* came *out* his brother, that had the *scarlet* thread upon his <u>hand</u>: and his <u>name</u> was called **Zarah**.

- And Joseph was brought down to Egypt; and Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, captain of the guard, an Egyptian, bought him of the hands of the Ishmeelites, which had brought him down thither.
- ² And the LORD was with Joseph, and he was a prosperous man; and he was in the house of his master the Egyptian.
- ³ And his <u>master</u> saw that the LORD was with him, and that the LORD made all that he did to <u>prosper</u> in his <u>hand</u>.
- ⁴ And Joseph found grace in his sight, and he served him: and he made him overseer over his house, and all that he had he put into his hand.
- 5 And it came to <u>pass</u> from the <u>time</u> that he had made him <u>overseer</u> in his <u>house</u>, and over *all* that he had, that the <u>LORD</u> <u>blessed</u> the <u>Egyptian's house</u> for <u>Joseph's</u> sake; and the <u>blessing</u> of the <u>LORD</u> was upon *all* that he had in the house, and in the field.
- ⁶ And he <u>left</u> all that he had in <u>Joseph's hand</u>; and he <u>knew not ought</u> he had, save the <u>bread</u> which he did <u>eat</u>. And <u>Joseph</u> was a <u>goodly person</u>, and <u>well favoured</u>.
- And it came to <u>pass</u> after these <u>things</u>, that his <u>master's wife cast</u> her <u>eyes</u> upon <u>Joseph</u>; and she said,
 <u>Lie</u> with me.
- ⁸ But he <u>refused</u>, and said unto his <u>master's wife</u>, Behold, my master <u>wotteth</u> <u>not</u> what is with me in the <u>house</u>, and he hath <u>committed</u> <u>all</u> that he hath to my <u>hand</u>;
- There is <u>none greater</u> in this <u>house</u> than I; <u>neither</u> hath he <u>kept</u> back any thing from me but thee, because thou art his <u>wife</u>: how then can I do this <u>great wickedness</u>, and <u>sin</u> against God?
- 10 And it came to <u>pass</u>, as she spake to <u>Joseph day</u> by day, that he *hearkened* <u>not</u> unto her, to <u>lie</u> by her, or to be *with* her.
- ¹¹ And it came to <u>pass</u> about this <u>time</u>, that <u>Joseph</u> went into the <u>house</u> to do his <u>business</u>; and there was <u>none</u> of the <u>men</u> of the <u>house</u> there within.
- 12 And she <u>caught</u> him by his <u>garment</u>, saying, <u>Lie</u> with me: and he <u>left</u> his garment in her <u>hand</u>, and <u>fled</u>, and got him *out*.
- ¹³ And it came to <u>pass</u>, when she saw that he had <u>left</u> his <u>garment</u> in her <u>hand</u>, and was <u>fled</u> forth,
- 14 That she <u>called</u> unto the <u>men</u> of her <u>house</u>, and spake unto them, saying, See, he hath brought in an <u>Hebrew</u> unto us to <u>mock</u> us; he came in unto me to *lie with* me, and I <u>cried</u> with a *loud* <u>voice</u>:

- 15 And it came to <u>pass</u>, when he heard that I <u>lifted</u> *up* my <u>voice</u> and <u>cried</u>, that he <u>left</u> his <u>garment</u> with me, and <u>fled</u>, and got him *out*.
- 16 And she <u>laid</u> *up* his <u>garment</u> by her, until his <u>lord</u> came <u>home</u>.
- ¹⁷ And she spake unto him according to these <u>words</u>, saying, The <u>Hebrew servant</u>, which thou hast brought unto us, came in unto me to <u>mock</u> me:
- 18 And it came to pass, as I lifted up my voice and cried, that he left his garment with me, and fled out.
- 19 And it came to <u>pass</u>, when his <u>master</u> heard the <u>words</u> of his <u>wife</u>, which she spake unto him, saying, After this <u>manner</u> did thy <u>servant</u> to me; that his <u>wrath</u> was <u>kindled</u>.
- ²⁰ And Joseph's <u>master</u> took him, and put him into the <u>prison</u>, a <u>place</u> where the king's <u>prisoners</u> were <u>bound</u>: and he was there in the prison.
- 21 But the LORD was *with* Joseph, and shewed him <u>mercy</u>, and gave him <u>favour</u> in the <u>sight</u> of the <u>keeper</u> of the <u>prison</u>.
- 22 And the <u>keeper</u> of the <u>prison committed</u> to **Joseph's** <u>hand</u> *all* the <u>prisoners</u> that were in the prison; and whatsoever they did there, he was the doer of it.
- 23 The <u>keeper</u> of the <u>prison</u> looked <u>not</u> to <u>any thing</u> that was <u>under</u> his <u>hand</u>; because the **LORD** was <u>with</u> him, and that which he did, the **LORD** made it to <u>prosper</u>.

- And it came to <u>pass</u> after these <u>things</u>, that the <u>butler</u> of the king of <u>Egypt</u> and his <u>baker</u> had <u>offended</u> their lord the king of <u>Egypt</u>.
- ² And Pharaoh was <u>wroth against two</u> of his <u>officers</u>, against the <u>chief</u> of the <u>butlers</u>, and against the chief of the bakers.
- 3 And he put them in <u>ward</u> in the <u>house</u> of the <u>captain</u> of the <u>guard</u>, into the <u>prison</u>, the <u>place</u> where **Joseph** was <u>bound</u>.
- ⁴ And the <u>captain</u> of the <u>guard charged</u> Joseph with them, and he <u>served</u> them: and they <u>continued</u> a <u>season</u> in <u>ward</u>.
- 5 And they <u>dreamed</u> a <u>dream</u> both of them, each <u>man</u> his dream in <u>one night</u>, each man according to the <u>interpretation</u> of his dream, the <u>butler</u> and the <u>baker</u> of the king of **Egypt**, which were <u>bound</u> in the <u>prison</u>.
- 6 And Joseph came in unto them in the morning, and looked upon them, and, behold, they were sad.
- And he asked Pharaoh's officers that were with him in the ward of his lord's house, saying, Wherefore look ye so sadly to day?
- 8 And they said unto him, We have <u>dreamed</u> a <u>dream</u>, and there is <u>no interpreter</u> of it. And <u>Joseph</u> said unto them, Do not interpretations belong to <u>God</u>? tell me them, I pray you.
- ⁹ And the *chief* <u>butler</u> told his <u>dream</u> to <u>Joseph</u>, and said to him, In my dream, behold, a <u>vine</u> was *before* me;
- 10 And in the <u>vine</u> were <u>three branches</u>: and it was as though it <u>budded</u>, and her <u>blossoms shot</u> *forth*; and the <u>clusters</u> thereof brought forth *ripe* <u>grapes</u>:
- 11 And Pharaoh's cup was in my hand: and I took the grapes, and pressed them into Pharaoh's cup, and I gave the cup into Pharaoh's hand.
- 12 And **Joseph** said unto him, This is the <u>interpretation</u> of it: The <u>three branches</u> are <u>three days</u>:
- 13 Yet within three days shall Pharaoh lift up thine head, and restore thee unto thy place: and thou shalt deliver Pharaoh's cup into his hand, after the former manner when thou wast his butler.
- ¹⁴ But think on me when it shall be well with thee, and shew kindness, I pray thee, unto me, and make mention of me unto Pharaoh, and bring me out of this house:

- 15 For indeed I was stolen away out of the land of the Hebrews: and here also have I done nothing that they should put me into the dungeon.
- When the *chief* baker saw that the <u>interpretation</u> was good, he said unto **Joseph**, I also was in my <u>dream</u>, and, behold, I had <u>three white baskets</u> on my <u>head</u>:
- 17 And in the *uppermost* basket there was of *all* manner of bakemeats for Pharaoh; and the birds did eat them *out* of the basket upon my head.
- 18 And **Joseph** answered and said, This is the <u>interpretation</u> thereof: The <u>three baskets</u> are <u>three days</u>:
- 19 Yet within three days shall Pharaoh lift up thy head from off thee, and shall hang thee on a tree; and the birds shall eat thy flesh from off thee.
- 20 And it came to <u>pass</u> the <u>third day</u>, which was **Pharaoh's** <u>birthday</u>, that he made a <u>feast</u> unto <u>all</u> his <u>servants</u>: and he <u>lifted</u> <u>up</u> the <u>head</u> of the <u>chief butler</u> and of the <u>chief baker</u> among his servants.
- 21 And he <u>restored</u> the <u>chief butler</u> unto his <u>butlership again</u>; and he gave the <u>cup</u> into <u>Pharaoh's hand</u>:
- 22 But he <u>hanged</u> the *chief* <u>baker</u>: as **Joseph** had <u>interpreted</u> to them.
- 23 Yet did not the *chief* butler remember Joseph, but forgat him.

- And it came to <u>pass</u> at the <u>end</u> of <u>two</u> <u>full years</u>, that <u>Pharaoh</u> <u>dreamed</u>: and, behold, he <u>stood</u> by the <u>river</u>.
- ² And, behold, there came up out of the <u>river seven</u> well favoured <u>kine</u> and <u>fatfleshed</u>; and they <u>fed</u> in a <u>meadow</u>.
- And, behold, <u>seven other kine</u> came up after them out of the <u>river</u>, <u>ill favoured</u> and <u>leanfleshed</u>; and <u>stood</u> by the <u>other</u> kine upon the brink of the river.
- ⁴ And the *ill favoured* and *leanfleshed* <u>kine</u> did <u>eat</u> <u>up</u> the <u>seven</u> <u>well favoured</u> and <u>fat</u> kine. So <u>Pharaoh</u> <u>awoke</u>.
- ⁵ And he <u>slept</u> and <u>dreamed</u> the <u>second time</u>: and, behold, <u>seven ears</u> of <u>corn</u> came *up* upon <u>one stalk</u>, <u>rank</u> and <u>good</u>.
- 6 And, behold, seven thin ears and blasted with the east wind sprung up after them.
- 7 And the <u>seven thin ears devoured</u> the <u>seven rank</u> and <u>full ears</u>. And <u>Pharaoh awoke</u>, and, behold, it was a <u>dream</u>.
- And it came to <u>pass</u> in the <u>morning</u> that his <u>spirit</u> was <u>troubled</u>; and he <u>sent</u> and called for <u>all</u> the <u>magicians</u> of <u>Egypt</u>, and all the <u>wise men</u> thereof: and <u>Pharaoh</u> told them his <u>dream</u>; but there was <u>none</u> that could <u>interpret</u> them unto <u>Pharaoh</u>.
- Then spake the *chief* butler unto **Pharaoh**, saying, I do remember my faults this day:
- 10 Pharaoh was <u>wroth</u> with his <u>servants</u>, and put me in <u>ward</u> in the <u>captain</u> of the <u>guard's house</u>, both me and the *chief* baker:
- ¹¹ And we <u>dreamed</u> a <u>dream</u> in <u>one night</u>, I and he; we dreamed each <u>man</u> according to the <u>interpretation</u> of his dream.
- ¹² And there was there with us a <u>young man</u>, an <u>Hebrew</u>, <u>servant</u> to the <u>captain</u> of the <u>guard</u>; and we told him, and he <u>interpreted</u> to us our <u>dreams</u>; to each man according to his dream he did interpret.
- ¹³ And it came to <u>pass</u>, as he <u>interpreted</u> to us, so it was; me he <u>restored</u> unto mine <u>office</u>, and him he <u>hanged</u>.
- 14 Then **Pharaoh** sent and called **Joseph**, and they brought him *hastily out* of the <u>dungeon</u>: and he <u>shaved</u> himself, and <u>changed</u> his <u>raiment</u>, and came in unto **Pharaoh**.

- ¹⁵ And Pharaoh said unto Joseph, I have <u>dreamed</u> a <u>dream</u>, and there is <u>none</u> that can <u>interpret</u> it: and I have heard say of thee, that thou canst <u>understand</u> a dream to interpret it.
- 16 And Joseph answered Pharaoh, saying, It is not in me: God shall give Pharaoh an answer of peace.
- 17 And **Pharaoh** said unto **Joseph**, In my <u>dream</u>, behold, I <u>stood</u> upon the <u>bank</u> of the <u>river</u>:
- 18 And, behold, there came *up out* of the <u>river seven kine</u>, *fatfleshed* and *well favoured*; and they <u>fed</u> in a <u>meadow</u>:
- ¹⁹ And, behold, <u>seven other kine</u> came *up after* them, *poor* and *very ill favoured* and *leanfleshed*, such as I never saw in *all* the land of **Egypt** for <u>badness</u>:
- 20 And the *lean* and the *ill favoured* kine did eat up the first seven fat kine:
- ²¹ And when they had <u>eaten</u> them *up*, it could <u>not</u> be <u>known</u> that they had eaten them; but they were still *ill* favoured, as at the beginning. So I <u>awoke</u>.
- 22 And I saw in my <u>dream</u>, and, behold, <u>seven ears</u> came *up* in <u>one stalk</u>, *full* and *good*:
- 23 And, behold, seven ears, withered, thin, and blasted with the east wind, sprung up after them:
- 24 And the *thin* <u>ears devoured</u> the <u>seven</u> *good* ears: and I told this unto the <u>magicians</u>; but there was <u>none</u> that could declare it to me.
- ²⁵ And Joseph said unto Pharaoh, The <u>dream</u> of Pharaoh is <u>one</u>: God hath shewed Pharaoh what he is about to do.
- 26 The seven good kine are seven years; and the seven good ears are seven years: the dream is one.
- 27 And the <u>seven</u> thin and ill favoured <u>kine</u> that came up after them are <u>seven years</u>; and the <u>seven</u> empty <u>ears blasted</u> with the east <u>wind</u> shall be <u>seven years</u> of <u>famine</u>.
- 28 This is the thing which I have spoken unto **Pharaoh**: What **God** is about to do he sheweth unto **Pharaoh**.
- 29 Behold, there come <u>seven years</u> of *great* <u>plenty</u> throughout *all* the land of **Egypt**:
- 30 And there shall <u>arise</u> after them <u>seven years</u> of <u>famine</u>; and all the <u>plenty</u> shall be <u>forgotten</u> in the land of <u>Egypt</u>; and the famine shall <u>consume</u> the land;
- 31 And the <u>plenty</u> shall <u>not</u> be <u>known</u> in the land by <u>reason</u> of that <u>famine</u> following; for it shall be <u>very</u> grievous.
- 32 And for that the <u>dream</u> was <u>doubled</u> unto <u>Pharaoh</u> twice; it is because the <u>thing</u> is <u>established</u> by <u>God</u>, and <u>God</u> will <u>shortly</u> bring it to <u>pass</u>.
- 33 Now therefore let <u>Pharaoh</u> look out a <u>man</u> discreet and wise, and <u>set</u> him over the land of <u>Egypt</u>.

- ³⁴ Let **Pharaoh** do this, and let him <u>appoint officers</u> over the <u>land</u>, and take *up* the <u>fifth part</u> of the land of **Egypt** in the <u>seven plenteous years</u>.
- 35 And let them gather all the food of those good years that come, and lay up corn under the hand of **Pharaoh**, and let them keep food in the cities.
- 36 And that <u>food</u> shall be for <u>store</u> to the land <u>against</u> the <u>seven years</u> of <u>famine</u>, which shall be in the land of **Egypt**; that the land <u>perish not</u> through the famine.
- ³⁷ And the thing was good in the eyes of Pharaoh, and in the eyes of all his servants.
- ³⁸ And Pharaoh said unto his <u>servants</u>, Can we <u>find</u> such a <u>one</u> as this is, a <u>man</u> in whom the Spirit of God is?
- ³⁹ And Pharaoh said unto Joseph, Forasmuch as God hath shewed thee all this, there is none so discreet and wise as thou art:
- 40 Thou shalt be over my house, and according unto thy word shall all my people be ruled: only in the throne will I be greater than thou.
- 41 And Pharaoh said unto Joseph, See, I have <u>set</u> thee over all the land of Egypt.
- ⁴² And Pharaoh took off his <u>ring</u> from his <u>hand</u>, and put it upon Joseph's <u>hand</u>, and <u>arrayed</u> him in <u>vestures</u> of fine <u>linen</u>, and put a <u>gold chain</u> about his <u>neck</u>;
- 43 And he made him to <u>ride</u> in the <u>second chariot</u> which he had; and they <u>cried</u> <u>before</u> him, <u>Bow</u> the <u>knee</u>: and he made him ruler over <u>all</u> the land of **Egypt**.
- ⁴⁴ And Pharaoh said unto Joseph, I am Pharaoh, and without thee shall no man lift up his hand or foot in all the land of Egypt.
- ⁴⁵ And Pharaoh called Joseph's name Zaphnathpaaneah; and he gave him to wife Asenath the daughter of Potipherah priest of On. And Joseph went out over all the land of Egypt.
- 46 And **Joseph** was <u>thirty years old</u> when he <u>stood</u> before **Pharaoh** king of **Egypt**. And **Joseph** went out from the <u>presence</u> of **Pharaoh**, and went throughout all the land of **Egypt**.
- 47 And in the <u>seven plenteous years</u> the <u>earth</u> brought forth by <u>handfuls</u>.
- 48 And he gathered up all the food of the seven years, which were in the land of **Egypt**, and laid up the food in the cities: the food of the field, which was round about every city, laid he up in the same.
- ⁴⁹ And Joseph gathered corn as the sand of the sea, very much, until he left numbering; for it was without number.
- ⁵⁰ And unto Joseph were born two sons before the years of famine came, which Asenath the daughter of Potipherah priest of On bare unto him.

- ⁵¹ And Joseph called the <u>name</u> of the <u>firstborn</u> Manasseh: For God, said he, hath made me <u>forget</u> all my <u>toil</u>, and all my <u>father's house</u>.
- 52 And the <u>name</u> of the <u>second</u> called he **Ephraim**: For **God** hath caused me to be <u>fruitful</u> in the land of my <u>affliction</u>.
- 53 And the <u>seven years</u> of <u>plenteousness</u>, that was in the land of **Egypt**, were <u>ended</u>.
- ⁵⁴ And the <u>seven years</u> of <u>dearth</u> began to come, according as **Joseph** had said: and the dearth was in **all** <u>lands</u>; but in *all* the land of <u>Egypt</u> there was <u>bread</u>.
- 55 And when *all* the land of **Egypt** was <u>famished</u>, the people <u>cried</u> to **Pharaoh** for <u>bread</u>: and **Pharaoh** said unto *all* the **Egyptians**, Go unto **Joseph**; what he saith to you, do.
- ⁵⁶ And the <u>famine</u> was over all the <u>face</u> of the <u>earth</u>: and <u>Joseph opened</u> all the <u>storehouses</u>, and <u>sold</u> unto the <u>Egyptians</u>; and the <u>famine waxed</u> sore in the land of <u>Egypt</u>.
- 57 And all countries came into **Egypt** to **Joseph** for to buy corn; because that the famine was so sore in all lands.

- Now when Jacob saw that there was corn in Egypt, Jacob said unto his sons, Why do ye look one upon another?
- ² And he said, Behold, I have heard that there is <u>corn</u> in **Egypt**: get you *down* thither, and <u>buy</u> for us from thence; that we may <u>live</u>, and <u>not die</u>.
- 3 And Joseph's ten brethren went down to buy corn in Egypt.
- 4 But Benjamin, Joseph's brother, Jacob sent not with his brethren; for he said, Lest *peradventure* mischief befall him.
- ⁵ And the sons of Israel came to <u>buy corn</u> among those that came: for the <u>famine</u> was in the land of Canaan.
- 6 And Joseph was the governor over the land, and he it was that sold to all the people of the land: and Joseph's brethren came, and bowed down themselves before him with their faces to the earth.
- ⁷ And Joseph saw his brethren, and he <u>knew</u> them, but made himself <u>strange</u> unto them, and spake roughly unto them; and he said unto them, Whence come ye? And they said, From the land of <u>Canaan</u> to <u>buy food</u>.
- 8 And Joseph knew his brethren, but they knew not him.
- 9 And <u>Joseph remembered</u> the <u>dreams</u> which he <u>dreamed</u> of them, and said unto them, Ye are <u>spies</u>; to see the <u>nakedness</u> of the land ye are come.
- 10 And they said unto him, Nay, my lord, but to buy food are thy servants come.
- 11 We are all one man's sons; we are true men, thy servants are no spies.
- 12 And he said unto them, Nay, but to see the <u>nakedness</u> of the land ye are come.
- 13 And they said, Thy <u>servants</u> are <u>twelve</u> brethren, the sons of <u>one man</u> in the land of <u>Canaan</u>; and, behold, the <u>youngest</u> is this <u>day</u> with our <u>father</u>, and <u>one</u> is <u>not</u>.
- 14 And Joseph said unto them, That is it that I spake unto you, saying, Ye are spies:
- 15 Hereby ye shall be <u>proved</u>: By the <u>life</u> of **Pharaoh** ye shall <u>not</u> go forth hence, except your <u>youngest</u> brother come hither.
- Send one of you, and let him fetch your brother, and ye shall be kept in prison, that your words may be proved, whether there be any truth in you: or else by the life of Pharaoh surely ye are spies.

- ¹⁷ And he put them all together into ward three days.
- 18 And **Joseph** said unto them the <u>third day</u>, This do, and <u>live</u>; for I <u>fear God</u>:
- 19 If ye be true men, let one of your brethren be bound in the house of your prison: go ye, carry corn for the tamine of your houses:
- 20 But bring your <u>youngest</u> brother unto me; so shall your <u>words</u> be <u>verified</u>, and ye shall <u>not die</u>. And they did so.
- 21 And they said one to another, We are *verily* guilty concerning our <u>brother</u>, in that we saw the <u>anguish</u> of his <u>soul</u>, when he <u>besought</u> us, and we would <u>not</u> hear; therefore is this <u>distress</u> come upon us.
- ²² And Reuben answered them, saying, Spake I <u>not</u> unto you, saying, Do <u>not sin</u> <u>against</u> the child; and ye would <u>not</u> hear? therefore, behold, also his <u>blood</u> is <u>required</u>.
- ²³ And they knew not that Joseph understood them; for he spake unto them by an interpreter.
- 24 And he <u>turned</u> himself about from them, and <u>wept</u>; and <u>returned</u> to them <u>again</u>, and <u>communed</u> with them, and took from them <u>Simeon</u>, and <u>bound</u> him <u>before</u> their <u>eyes</u>.
- 25 Then **Joseph** commanded to fill their sacks with corn, and to restore every man's money into his sack, and to give them provision for the way: and thus did he unto them.
- ²⁶ And they <u>laded</u> their <u>asses</u> with the <u>corn</u>, and <u>departed</u> thence.
- ²⁷ And as <u>one</u> of them <u>opened</u> his <u>sack</u> to give his <u>ass provender</u> in the <u>inn</u>, he <u>espied</u> his <u>money</u>; for, behold, it was in his <u>sack's mouth</u>.
- 28 And he said unto his brethren, My money is restored; and, lo, it is even in my sack: and their heart failed them, and they were afraid, saying one to another, What is this that God hath done unto us?
- ²⁹ And they came unto Jacob their <u>father</u> unto the land of Canaan, and told him all that <u>befell</u> unto them; saying,
- 30 The man, who is the lord of the land, spake *roughly* to us, and took us for spies of the country.
- 31 And we said unto him, We are *true* men; we are no spies:
- 32 We be twelve brethren, sons of our father; one is not, and the youngest is this day with our father in the land of Canaan.
- 33 And the man, the lord of the country, said unto us, Hereby shall I know that ye are true men; leave one of your brethren here with me, and take food for the famine of your households, and be gone:
- 34 And bring your <u>youngest</u> brother unto me: then shall I <u>know</u> that ye are <u>no spies</u>, but that ye are <u>true</u> men: so will I <u>deliver</u> you your brother, and ye shall <u>traffick</u> in the land.

- 35 And it came to <u>pass</u> as they <u>emptied</u> their <u>sacks</u>, that, behold, <u>every man's bundle</u> of <u>money</u> was in his <u>sack</u>: and when both they and their <u>father</u> saw the bundles of money, they were <u>afraid</u>.
- And Jacob their father said unto them, Me have ye bereaved of my children: Joseph is not, and Simeon is not, and ye will take Benjamin away: all these things are against me.
- 37 And **Reuben** spake unto his <u>father</u>, saying, <u>Slay</u> my <u>two</u> sons, if I bring him <u>not</u> to thee: <u>deliver</u> him into my <u>hand</u>, and I will bring him to thee <u>again</u>.
- 38 And he said, My son shall not go down with you; for his brother is dead, and he is left alone: if mischief befall him by the way in the which ye go, then shall ye bring down my gray hairs with sorrow to the grave.

- ¹ And the famine was sore in the land.
- ² And it came to <u>pass</u>, when they had <u>eaten</u> *up* the <u>corn</u> which they had brought *out* of **Egypt**, their <u>father</u> said unto them, Go <u>again</u>, <u>buy</u> us a *little* <u>food</u>.
- 3 And **Judah** spake unto him, saying, The <u>man</u> did <u>solemnly protest</u> unto us, saying, Ye shall <u>not</u> see my <u>face</u>, except your brother be with you.
- 4 If thou wilt <u>send</u> our brother with us, we will go *down* and <u>buy</u> thee <u>food</u>:
- 5 But if thou wilt <u>not send</u> him, we will <u>not</u> go *down*: for the <u>man</u> said unto us, Ye shall <u>not</u> see my <u>face</u>, except your brother be with you.
- 6 And Israel said, Wherefore dealt ye so ill with me, as to tell the man whether ye had yet a brother?
- And they said, The man asked us straitly of our state, and of our kindred, saying, Is your father yet alive? have ye another brother? and we told him according to the tenor of these words: could we certainly know that he would say, Bring your brother down?
- And **Judah** said unto **Israel** his <u>father</u>, <u>Send</u> the <u>lad</u> with me, and we will <u>arise</u> and go; that we may <u>live</u>, and not <u>die</u>, both we, and thou, and also our *little* ones.
- I will be <u>surety</u> for him; of my <u>hand</u> shalt thou <u>require</u> him: if I bring him <u>not</u> unto thee, and set him <u>before</u> thee, then let me <u>bear</u> the <u>blame</u> for ever.
- 10 For except we had <u>lingered</u>, *surely* now we had <u>returned</u> this <u>second time</u>.
- 11 And their <u>father</u> <u>Israel</u> said unto them, If it must be so now, do this; take of the <u>best fruits</u> in the land in your <u>vessels</u>, and <u>carry</u> <u>down</u> the man a <u>present</u>, a <u>little balm</u>, and a <u>little honey</u>, <u>spices</u>, and <u>myrrh</u>, <u>nuts</u>, and almonds:
- ¹² And take <u>double money</u> in your <u>hand</u>; and the money that was brought <u>again</u> in the <u>mouth</u> of your <u>sacks</u>, <u>carry</u> it <u>again</u> in your hand; <u>peradventure</u> it was an <u>oversight</u>:
- 13 Take also your brother, and <u>arise</u>, go <u>again</u> unto the <u>man</u>:
- 14 And God Almighty give you mercy before the man, that he may send away your other brother, and Benjamin. If I be bereaved of my children, I am bereaved.
- ¹⁵ And the men took that present, and they took double money in their hand and Benjamin; and rose up, and went down to Egypt, and stood before Joseph.

- 16 And when **Joseph** saw **Benjamin** with them, he said to the <u>ruler</u> of his <u>house</u>, Bring these <u>men home</u>, and <u>slay</u>, and make <u>ready</u>; for these men shall <u>dine</u> with me at <u>noon</u>.
- ¹⁷ And the man did as Joseph bade; and the man brought the men into Joseph's house.
- ¹⁸ And the men were afraid, because they were brought into Joseph's house; and they said, Because of the money that was returned in our sacks at the first time are we brought in; that he may seek occasion against us, and fall upon us, and take us for bondmen, and our asses.
- ¹⁹ And they came *near* to the <u>steward</u> of **Joseph's** <u>house</u>, and they <u>communed</u> with him at the <u>door</u> of the <u>house</u>,
- 20 And said, O sir, we came indeed *down* at the <u>first time</u> to <u>buy food</u>:
- ²¹ And it came to <u>pass</u>, when we came to the <u>inn</u>, that we <u>opened</u> our <u>sacks</u>, and, behold, <u>every man's</u> money was in the <u>mouth</u> of his <u>sack</u>, our money in *full* <u>weight</u>: and we have brought it <u>again</u> in our <u>hand</u>.
- 22 And other money have we brought down in our hands to buy food: we cannot tell who put our money in our sacks.
- 23 And he said, <u>Peace</u> be to you, <u>fear not</u>: your <u>God</u>, and the <u>God</u> of your <u>father</u>, hath given you <u>treasure</u> in your <u>sacks</u>: I had your <u>money</u>. And he brought <u>Simeon</u> *out* unto them.
- ²⁴ And the <u>man</u> brought the <u>men</u> into **Joseph's** <u>house</u>, and gave them <u>water</u>, and they <u>washed</u> their <u>feet</u>; and he gave their <u>asses provender</u>.
- 25 And they made ready the <u>present against</u> **Joseph** came at <u>noon</u>: for they heard that they should <u>eat</u> <u>bread</u> there. 26 And when **Joseph** came <u>home</u>, they brought him the <u>present</u> which was in their <u>hand</u> into the <u>house</u>, and <u>bowed</u> themselves to him to the <u>earth</u>. 27 And he asked them of their <u>welfare</u>, and said, Is your <u>father well</u>, the <u>old man</u> of whom ye spake? Is he yet <u>alive</u>? 28 And they answered, Thy <u>servant</u> our <u>father</u> is in <u>good health</u>, he is yet <u>alive</u>. And they <u>bowed</u> down their <u>heads</u>, and made <u>obeisance</u>.
- ²⁹ And he <u>lifted</u> up his <u>eyes</u>, and saw his brother **Benjamin**, his <u>mother's</u> son, and said, Is this your <u>younger</u> brother, of whom ye spake unto me? And he said, **God** be <u>gracious</u> unto thee, my son.
- 30 And **Joseph** made <u>haste</u>; for his <u>bowels</u> did <u>yearn</u> upon his brother: and he <u>sought</u> where to <u>weep</u>; and he entered into his <u>chamber</u>, and wept there. 31 And he <u>washed</u> his <u>face</u>, and went <u>out</u>, and <u>refrained</u> himself, and said, <u>Set</u> on <u>bread</u>. 32 And they set on for him by himself, and for them by themselves, and for the **Egyptians**, which did <u>eat</u> with him, by themselves: because the **Egyptians** might <u>not</u> eat <u>bread</u> with the **Hebrews**; for that is an <u>abomination</u> unto the **Egyptians**. 33 And they <u>sat</u> <u>before</u> him, the <u>firstborn</u> according to his <u>birthright</u>, and the <u>youngest</u> according to his youth: and the men <u>marvelled</u> one at another. 34 And he took and <u>sent messes</u> unto them from <u>before</u> him: but **Benjamin's <u>mess</u>** was <u>five</u> times so much as <u>any</u> of their's. And they <u>drank</u>, and were <u>merry</u> with him.

- And he <u>commanded</u> the <u>steward</u> of his <u>house</u>, saying, <u>Fill</u> the <u>men's sacks</u> with <u>food</u>, as much as they can <u>carry</u>, and put <u>every man's money</u> in his sack's <u>mouth</u>.
- ² And put my <u>cup</u>, the <u>silver</u> cup, in the <u>sack's mouth</u> of the <u>youngest</u>, and his <u>corn money</u>. And he did according to the <u>word</u> that <u>Joseph</u> had spoken.
- 3 As soon as the morning was light, the men were sent away, they and their asses.
- And when they were gone *out* of the <u>city</u>, and <u>not</u> yet *far off*, **Joseph** said unto his <u>steward</u>, Up, <u>follow</u> *after* the <u>men</u>; and when thou dost <u>overtake</u> them, say unto them, Wherefore have ye <u>rewarded *evil*</u> for <u>good</u>?
- 5 Is not this it in which my lord drinketh, and whereby indeed he divineth? ye have done evil in so doing.
- 6 And he <u>overtook</u> them, and he spake unto them these same <u>words</u>.
- And they said unto him, Wherefore saith my <u>lord</u> these <u>words</u>? God <u>forbid</u> that thy <u>servants</u> should do according to this <u>thing</u>:
- Behold, the <u>money</u>, which we <u>found</u> in our <u>sacks' mouths</u>, we brought <u>again</u> unto thee *out* of the land of <u>Canaan</u>: how then should we <u>steal</u> *out* of thy lord's house <u>silver</u> or <u>gold</u>?
- 9 With whomsoever of thy servants it be found, both let him die, and we also will be my lord's bondmen.
- 10 And he said, Now also let it be according unto your words: he with whom it is found shall be my servant; and ye shall be blameless.
- 11 Then they *speedily* took *down* every man his <u>sack</u> to the <u>ground</u>, and <u>opened</u> every man his sack.
- 12 And he <u>searched</u>, and began at the <u>eldest</u>, and left at the <u>youngest</u>: and the <u>cup</u> was <u>found</u> in **Benjamin's** <u>sack</u>.
- 13 Then they <u>rent</u> their <u>clothes</u>, and <u>laded every man</u> his <u>ass</u>, and <u>returned</u> to the <u>city</u>.
- 14 And **Judah** and his brethren came to **Joseph's** house; for he was yet there: and they fell before him on the ground.
- 15 And Joseph said unto them, What deed is this that ye have done? wot ye not that such a man as I can certainly divine? 16 And Judah said, What shall we say unto my lord? what shall we speak? or how shall we clear ourselves? God hath found out the iniquity of thy servants: behold, we are my lord's servants, both we, and he also with whom the cup is found.

- ¹⁷ And he said, God forbid that I should do so: but the man in whose hand the cup is found, he shall be my servant; and as for you, get you up in peace unto your father.
- 18 Then **Judah** came *near* unto him, and said, Oh my lord, let thy <u>servant</u>, I pray thee, speak a <u>word</u> in my lord's <u>ears</u>, and let <u>not</u> thine <u>anger burn against</u> thy servant: for thou art even as **Pharaoh**.
- 19 My lord asked his <u>servants</u>, saying, Have ye a <u>father</u>, or a brother?
- 20 And we said unto my lord, We have a <u>father</u>, an <u>old man</u>, and a child of his <u>old age</u>, a *little* <u>one</u>; and his brother is <u>dead</u>, and he <u>alone</u> is left of his <u>mother</u>, and his father <u>loveth</u> him.
- 21 And thou saidst unto thy <u>servants</u>, Bring him *down* unto me, that I may set mine <u>eyes</u> upon him.
- 22 And we said unto my lord, The <u>lad cannot leave</u> his <u>father</u>: for if he should leave his father, his father would die.
- ²³ And thou saidst unto thy <u>servants</u>, Except your <u>youngest</u> brother come *down* with you, ye shall see my face no *more*.
- ²⁴ And it came to <u>pass</u> when we came *up* unto thy <u>servant</u> my <u>father</u>, we told him the <u>words</u> of my lord.
- 25 And our <u>father</u> said, Go <u>again</u>, and <u>buy</u> us a *little* <u>food</u>.
- 26 And we said, We <u>cannot</u> go <u>down</u>: if our <u>youngest</u> brother be with us, then will we go <u>down</u>: for we may <u>not</u> see the <u>man's face</u>, except our youngest brother be with us.
- 27 And thy servant my <u>father</u> said unto us, Ye <u>know</u> that my <u>wife bare</u> me <u>two</u> sons:
- 28 And the one went *out* from me, and I said, *Surely* he is **torn** in **pieces**; and I saw him <u>not</u> since:
- ²⁹ And if ye take this also from me, and <u>mischief befall</u> him, ye shall bring down my gray <u>hairs</u> with <u>sorrow</u> to the <u>grave</u>.
- Now therefore when I come to thy <u>servant</u> my <u>father</u>, and the <u>lad</u> be <u>not</u> with us; seeing that his <u>life</u> is <u>bound</u> *up* in the <u>lad's</u> life;
- 31 It shall come to <u>pass</u>, when he seeth that the <u>lad</u> is <u>not</u> with us, that he will <u>die</u>: and thy <u>servants</u> shall bring *down* the *gray* <u>hairs</u> of thy servant our <u>father</u> with <u>sorrow</u> to the <u>grave</u>.
- ³² For thy <u>servant</u> became <u>surety</u> for the <u>lad</u> unto my <u>father</u>, saying, If I bring him <u>not</u> unto thee, then I shall <u>bear</u> the <u>blame</u> to my *father for ever*.
- ³³ Now therefore, I pray thee, let thy <u>servant abide instead</u> of the <u>lad</u> a <u>bondman</u> to my <u>lord</u>; and let the lad go up with his brethren.
- 34 For how shall I go *up* to my <u>father</u>, and the <u>lad</u> be <u>not</u> with me? lest *peradventure* I see the <u>evil</u> that shall come on my father.

- ¹ Then Joseph could not <u>refrain</u> himself <u>before all</u> them that <u>stood</u> by him; and he <u>cried</u>, Cause <u>every man</u> to go <u>out</u> from me. And there <u>stood no man</u> with him, while <u>Joseph</u> made himself <u>known</u> unto his brethren.
- ² And he <u>wept aloud</u>: and the <u>Egyptians</u> and the <u>house</u> of <u>Pharaoh</u> heard.
- And Joseph said unto his brethren, I am Joseph; doth my father yet live? And his brethren could not answer him; for they were troubled at his presence.
- ⁴ And Joseph said unto his brethren, Come *near* to me, I pray you. And they came *near*. And he said, I am Joseph your brother, whom ye <u>sold</u> into <u>Egypt</u>.
- Now therefore be <u>not grieved</u>, <u>nor angry</u> with yourselves, that ye <u>sold</u> me hither: for God did <u>send</u> me before you to <u>preserve life</u>.
- 6 For these two years hath the famine been in the land: and yet there are five years, in the which there shall neither be earing nor harvest.
- And God <u>sent</u> me *before* you to <u>preserve</u> you a <u>posterity</u> in the <u>earth</u>, and to <u>save</u> your <u>lives</u> by a <u>great deliverance</u>.
- So now it was <u>not</u> you that <u>sent</u> me hither, but <u>God</u>: and he hath made me a <u>father</u> to <u>Pharaoh</u>, and <u>lord</u> of <u>all</u> his <u>house</u>, and a <u>ruler</u> throughout <u>all</u> the land of <u>Egypt</u>.
- Haste ye, and go up to my <u>father</u>, and say unto him, Thus saith thy son <u>Joseph</u>, <u>God hath made me lord</u> of all <u>Egypt</u>: come down unto me, <u>tarry not</u>:
- 10 And thou shalt <u>dwell</u> in the land of **Goshen**, and thou shalt be *near* unto me, thou, and thy children, and thy children, and thy <u>flocks</u>, and thy <u>herds</u>, and *all* that thou hast:
- 11 And there will I <u>nourish</u> thee; for yet there are <u>five years</u> of <u>famine</u>; lest thou, and thy <u>household</u>, and <u>all</u> that thou hast, come to <u>poverty</u>.
- ¹² And, behold, your <u>eyes</u> see, and the eyes of my brother Benjamin, that it is my <u>mouth</u> that speaketh unto you.
- 13 And ye shall tell my <u>father</u> of *all* my <u>glory</u> in <u>Egypt</u>, and of *all* that ye have seen; and ye shall haste and bring *down* my father hither.
- ¹⁴ And he <u>fell</u> upon his brother Benjamin's <u>neck</u>, and <u>wept</u>; and Benjamin wept upon his neck.
- 15 Moreover he kissed all his brethren, and wept upon them: and after that his brethren talked with him.

- 16 And the <u>fame</u> thereof was heard in <u>Pharaoh's house</u>, saying, <u>Joseph's</u> brethren are come: and it <u>pleased</u> <u>Pharaoh</u> well, and his <u>servants</u>.
- 17 And Pharaoh said unto Joseph, Say unto thy brethren, This do ye; <u>lade</u> your <u>beasts</u>, and go, get you unto the land of Canaan;
- ¹⁸ And take your <u>father</u> and your <u>households</u>, and come unto me: and I will give you the <u>good</u> of the land of <u>Egypt</u>, and ye shall <u>eat</u> the <u>fat</u> of the land.
- 19 Now thou art <u>commanded</u>, this do ye; take you <u>wagons</u> *out* of the land of **Egypt** for your *little* <u>ones</u>, and for your <u>wives</u>, and bring your <u>father</u>, and come.
- 20 Also <u>regard not</u> your <u>stuff</u>; for the <u>good</u> of *all* the land of **Egypt** is your's.
- 21 And the children of **Israel** did so: and **Joseph** gave them <u>wagons</u>, according to the <u>commandment</u> of **Pharaoh**, and gave them <u>provision</u> for the <u>way</u>.
- 22 To *all* of them he gave each <u>man changes</u> of <u>raiment</u>; but to <u>Benjamin</u> he gave <u>three hundred pieces</u> of <u>silver</u>, and <u>five changes</u> of <u>raiment</u>.
- 23 And to his <u>father</u> he <u>sent</u> <u>after</u> this <u>manner</u>; <u>ten asses laden</u> with the <u>good things</u> of **Egypt**, and <u>ten</u> she asses laden with <u>corn</u> and <u>bread</u> and <u>meat</u> for his father by the <u>way</u>.
- ²⁴ So he <u>sent</u> his brethren <u>away</u>, and they <u>departed</u>: and he said unto them, See that ye <u>fall not</u> *out* by the <u>way</u>.
- ²⁵ And they went up out of Egypt, and came into the land of Canaan unto Jacob their father,
- ²⁶ And told him, saying, Joseph is yet <u>alive</u>, and he is <u>governor</u> over <u>all</u> the land of Egypt. And Jacob's <u>heart fainted</u>, for he <u>believed</u> them <u>not</u>.
- 27 And they told him *all* the <u>words</u> of **Joseph**, which he had said unto them: and when he saw the <u>wagons</u> which **Joseph** had <u>sent</u> to <u>carry</u> him, the spirit of **Jacob** their <u>father revived</u>:
- And Israel said, It is enough; Joseph my son is yet <u>alive</u>: I will go and see him before I <u>die</u>.

- And Israel took his journey with all that he had, and came to Beersheba, and offered sacrifices unto the God of his father Isaac.
- 2 And God spake unto Israel in the <u>visions</u> of the <u>night</u>, and said, <u>Jacob</u>, <u>Jacob</u>. And he said, Here am I.
- 3 And he said, I am God, the God of thy <u>father</u>: <u>fear not</u> to go <u>down</u> into <u>Egypt</u>; for I will there make of thee a <u>great nation</u>:
- 4 I will go down with thee into Egypt; and I will also surely bring thee up again: and Joseph shall put his hand upon thine eyes.
- 5 And Jacob rose *up* from Beersheba: and the sons of Israel carried Jacob their father, and their little ones, and their wives, in the wagons which Pharaoh had sent to carry him.
- 6 And they took their <u>cattle</u>, and their <u>goods</u>, which they had gotten in the land of **Canaan**, and came into **Egypt**, **Jacob**, and *all* his <u>seed</u> with him:
- ⁷ His sons, and his sons' sons with him, his daughters, and his sons' daughters, and *all* his <u>seed</u> brought he with him into **Egypt**.
- ⁸ And these are the <u>names</u> of the children of <u>Israel</u>, which came into <u>Egypt</u>, <u>Jacob</u> and his sons: <u>Reuben</u>, <u>Jacob's firstborn</u>.
- 9 And the sons of Reuben; Hanoch, and Phallu, and Hezron, and Carmi.
- 10 And the sons of Simeon; Jemuel, and Jamin, and Ohad, and Jachin, and Zohar, and Shaul the son of a Canaanitish woman.
- ¹¹ And the sons of Levi; Gershon, Kohath, and Merari.
- ¹² And the sons of Judah; Er, and Onan, and Shelah, and Pharez, and Zarah: but Er and Onan <u>died</u> in the land of Canaan. And the sons of Pharez were Hezron and Hamul.
- 13 And the sons of Issachar; Tola, and Phuvah, and Job, and Shimron.
- ¹⁴ And the sons of Zebulun; Sered, and Elon, and Jahleel.
- ¹⁵ These be the sons of Leah, which she <u>bare</u> unto <u>Jacob</u> in <u>Padanaram</u>, with his daughter <u>Dinah</u>: all the <u>souls</u> of his sons and his daughters were <u>thirty and three</u>.
- 16 And the sons of Gad; Ziphion, and Haggi, Shuni, and Ezbon, Eri, and Arodi, and Areli.

- ¹⁷ And the sons of Asher; Jimnah, and Ishuah, and Isui, and Beriah, and Serah their sister: and the sons of Beriah; Heber, and Malchiel.
- ¹⁸ These are the sons of Zilpah, whom Laban gave to Leah his daughter, and these she <u>bare</u> unto Jacob, even sixteen souls.
- ¹⁹ The sons of Rachel Jacob's wife; Joseph, and Benjamin.
- ²⁰ And unto Joseph in the land of Egypt were born Manasseh and Ephraim, which Asenath the daughter of Potipherah priest of On bare unto him.
- ²¹ And the sons of Benjamin were Belah, and Becher, and Ashbel, Gera, and Naaman, Ehi, and Rosh, Muppim, and Huppim, and Ard.
- 22 These are the sons of **Rachel**, which were <u>born</u> to **Jacob**: *all* the <u>souls</u> were <u>fourteen</u>.
- ²³ And the sons of Dan; Hushim.
- 24 And the sons of Naphtali; Jahzeel, and Guni, and Jezer, and Shillem.
- ²⁵ These are the sons of Bilhah, which Laban gave unto Rachel his daughter, and she <u>bare</u> these unto Jacob: all the souls were seven.
- 26 All the <u>souls</u> that came with **Jacob** into **Egypt**, which came *out* of his <u>loins</u>, besides **Jacob's** sons' wives, *all* the souls were threescore and six;
- 27 And the sons of **Joseph**, which were <u>born</u> him in **Egypt**, were <u>two souls</u>: *all* the souls of the <u>house</u> of **Jacob**, which came into **Egypt**, were <u>threescore and ten</u>.
- 28 And he <u>sent</u> **Judah** *before* him unto **Joseph**, to <u>direct</u> his <u>face</u> unto **Goshen**; and they came into the land of **Goshen**.
- ²⁹ And Joseph made <u>ready</u> his <u>chariot</u>, and went <u>up</u> to <u>meet Israel</u> his <u>father</u>, to Goshen, and <u>presented</u> himself unto him; and he <u>fell</u> on his <u>neck</u>, and <u>wept</u> on his neck a <u>good</u> while.
- ³⁰ And Israel said unto Joseph, Now let me <u>die</u>, since I have seen thy <u>face</u>, because thou art yet <u>alive</u>.
- ³¹ And **Joseph** said unto his brethren, and unto his <u>father's house</u>, I will go *up*, and shew **Pharaoh**, and say unto him, My brethren, and my <u>father's house</u>, which were in the land of **Canaan**, are come unto me;
- 32 And the men are shepherds, for their trade hath been to feed cattle; and they have brought their flocks, and their herds, and all that they have.
- ³³ And it shall come to <u>pass</u>, when **Pharaoh** shall call you, and shall say, What is your <u>occupation</u>?
- 34 That ye shall say, Thy <u>servants' trade</u> hath been about <u>cattle</u> from our youth even until now, both we, and also our <u>fathers</u>: that ye may <u>dwell</u> in the land of **Goshen**; for <u>every <u>shepherd</u> is an <u>abomination</u> unto the **Egyptians**.</u>

- 1 Then Joseph came and told Pharaoh, and said, My <u>father</u> and my brethren, and their <u>flocks</u>, and their <u>herds</u>, and <u>all</u> that they have, are come <u>out</u> of the land of <u>Canaan</u>; and, behold, they are in the <u>land</u> of <u>Goshen</u>.
- 2 And he took some of his brethren, even <u>five men</u>, and <u>presented</u> them unto **Pharaoh**.
- And Pharaoh said unto his brethren, What is your <u>occupation</u>? And they said unto Pharaoh, Thy <u>servants</u> are <u>shepherds</u>, both we, and also our <u>fathers</u>.
- They said morever unto **Pharaoh**, For to **sojourn** in the land are we come; for thy **servants** have **no pasture** for their **flocks**; for the **famine** is **sore** in the land of **Canaan**: now therefore, we pray thee, let thy servants dwell in the land of **Goshen**.
- 5 And Pharaoh spake unto Joseph, saying, Thy <u>father</u> and thy brethren are come unto thee:
- 6 The land of Egypt is before thee; in the <u>best</u> of the land make thy <u>father</u> and brethren to <u>dwell</u>; in the land of Goshen let them dwell: and if thou <u>knowest</u> any <u>men</u> of <u>activity</u> among them, then make them <u>rulers</u> over my <u>cattle</u>.
- ⁷ And Joseph brought in Jacob his father, and set him before Pharaoh: and Jacob blessed Pharaoh.
- 8 And Pharaoh said unto Jacob, How old art thou?
- ⁹ And Jacob said unto Pharaoh, The <u>days</u> of the <u>years</u> of my <u>pilgrimage</u> are an <u>hundred and thirty years</u>:
 few and <u>evil</u> have the days of the years of my <u>life</u> been, and have <u>not attained</u> unto the days of the years
 of the life of my fathers in the days of their pilgrimage.
- And Jacob <u>blessed</u> Pharaoh, and went out from before Pharaoh.
- ¹¹ And Joseph <u>placed</u> his <u>father</u> and his brethren, and gave them a <u>possession</u> in the land of <u>Egypt</u>, in the <u>best</u> of the land, in the land of <u>Rameses</u>, as <u>Pharaoh</u> had <u>commanded</u>.
- ¹² And Joseph nourished his father, and his brethren, and all his father's household, with bread, according to their families.
- ¹³ And there was no bread in all the land; for the famine was very sore, so that the land of Egypt and all the land of Canaan fainted by reason of the famine.
- 14 And Joseph gathered *up all* the money that was found in the land of Egypt, and in the land of Canaan, for the corn which they bought: and Joseph brought the money into Pharaoh's house.

- 15 And when money failed in the land of Egypt, and in the land of Canaan, all the Egyptians came unto Joseph, and said, Give us bread: for why should we die in thy presence? for the money faileth.
- And Joseph said, Give your <u>cattle</u>; and I will give you for your cattle, if <u>money fail</u>.
- ¹⁷ And they brought their <u>cattle</u> unto **Joseph**: and **Joseph** gave them <u>bread</u> in <u>exchange</u> for <u>horses</u>, and for the <u>flocks</u>, and for the <u>cattle</u> of the <u>herds</u>, and for the <u>asses</u>: and he <u>fed</u> them with bread for *all* their cattle for that <u>year</u>.
- 18 When that <u>year</u> was <u>ended</u>, they came unto him the <u>second</u> year, and said unto him, We will <u>not hide</u> it from my <u>lord</u>, how that our <u>money</u> is <u>spent</u>; my lord also hath our <u>herds</u> of <u>cattle</u>; there is <u>not ought</u> left in the <u>sight</u> of my lord, but our <u>bodies</u>, and our lands:
- 19 Wherefore shall we <u>die before</u> thine <u>eyes</u>, both we and our <u>land</u>? <u>buy</u> us and our land for <u>bread</u>, and we and our land will be <u>servants</u> unto <u>Pharaoh</u>: and give us <u>seed</u>, that we may <u>live</u>, and <u>not die</u>, that the land be not desolate.
- 20 And Joseph <u>bought</u> all the <u>land</u> of Egypt for Pharaoh; for the Egyptians <u>sold every man</u> his <u>field</u>, because the <u>famine prevailed</u> over them: so the <u>land</u> became **Pharaoh's**.
- 21 And as for the people, he <u>removed</u> them to <u>cities</u> from <u>one end</u> of the <u>borders</u> of **Egypt** even to the <u>other end</u> thereof.
- ²² Only the land of the <u>priests bought</u> he <u>not</u>; for the priests had a <u>portion assigned</u> them of <u>Pharaoh</u>, and did <u>eat</u> their portion which <u>Pharaoh</u> gave them: wherefore they <u>sold not</u> their lands.
- ²³ Then Joseph said unto the people, Behold, I have <u>bought</u> you this <u>day</u> and your <u>land</u> for <u>Pharaoh</u>: lo, here is <u>seed</u> for you, and ye shall <u>sow</u> the land.
- 24 And it shall come to <u>pass</u> in the <u>increase</u>, that ye shall give the <u>fifth part</u> unto <u>Pharaoh</u>, and <u>four parts</u> shall be your own, for <u>seed</u> of the <u>field</u>, and for your <u>food</u>, and for them of your <u>households</u>, and for food for your <u>little ones</u>. ²⁵ And they said, Thou hast <u>saved</u> our <u>lives</u>: let us <u>find grace</u> in the <u>sight</u> of my <u>lord</u>, and we will be <u>Pharaoh's servants</u>. ²⁶ And <u>Joseph</u> made it a <u>law</u> over the land of <u>Egypt</u> unto this <u>day</u>, that <u>Pharaoh</u> should have the <u>fifth part</u>, except the land of the <u>priests</u> only, which became <u>not</u> <u>Pharaoh's</u>. ²⁷ And <u>Israel dwelt</u> in the land of <u>Egypt</u>, in the <u>country</u> of <u>Goshen</u>; and they had <u>possessions</u> therein, and <u>grew</u>, and <u>multiplied</u> <u>exceedingly</u>. ²⁸ And <u>Jacob lived</u> in the land of <u>Egypt</u> <u>seventeen years</u>: so the <u>whole age</u> of <u>Jacob</u> was an <u>hundred forty and seven years</u>. ²⁹ And the <u>time</u> drew <u>nigh</u> that <u>Israel</u> must <u>die</u>: and he called his son <u>Joseph</u>, and said unto him, If now I have <u>found grace</u> in thy <u>sight</u>, put, I pray thee, thy <u>hand under</u> my <u>thigh</u>, and <u>deal kindly</u> and <u>truly</u> with me; <u>bury</u> me <u>not</u>, I pray thee, in <u>Egypt</u>: ³⁰ But I will lie with my <u>fathers</u>, and thou shalt <u>carry</u> me <u>out</u> of <u>Egypt</u>, and <u>bury</u> me in their <u>buryingplace</u>. And he said, I will do as thou hast said. ³¹ And he said, <u>Swear</u> unto me. And he sware unto him. And Israel **bowed** himself upon the bed's head.

- And it came to <u>pass</u> after these <u>things</u>, that <u>one</u> told <u>Joseph</u>, Behold, thy <u>father</u> is <u>sick</u>: and he took with him his <u>two</u> sons, <u>Manasseh</u> and <u>Ephraim</u>.
- ² And <u>one</u> told **Jacob**, and said, Behold, thy son **Joseph** cometh unto thee: and **Israel** <u>strengthened</u> himself, and <u>sat</u> upon the <u>bed</u>.
- ³ And Jacob said unto Joseph, God Almighty <u>appeared</u> unto me at Luz in the land of Canaan, and <u>blessed</u> me,
- ⁴ And said unto me, Behold, I will make thee <u>fruitful</u>, and <u>multiply</u> thee, and I will make of thee a <u>multitude</u> of people; and will <u>give</u> this <u>land</u> to thy <u>seed</u> <u>after</u> thee for an <u>everlasting</u> <u>possession</u>.
- 5 And now thy two sons, **Ephraim** and **Manasseh**, which were born unto thee in the land of **Egypt** before I came unto thee into **Egypt**, are *mine*; as **Reuben** and **Simeon**, they shall be mine.
- 6 And thy <u>issue</u>, which thou <u>begettest</u> *after* them, shall be **thine**, and shall be called *after* the <u>name</u> of their brethren in their inheritance.
- And as for me, when I came from Padan, Rachel <u>died</u> by me in the land of Canaan in the <u>way</u>, when yet there was but a *little* way to come unto Ephrath: and I <u>buried</u> her there in the way of Ephrath; the same is Bethlehem.
- And Israel beheld Joseph's sons, and said, Who are these?
- ⁹ And Joseph said unto his <u>father</u>, They are my sons, whom God hath given me in this <u>place</u>. And he said, Bring them, I pray thee, unto me, and I will <u>bless</u> them.
- 10 Now the <u>eyes</u> of **Israel** were <u>dim</u> for <u>age</u>, so that he could <u>not</u> **see**. And he brought them *near* unto him; and he **kissed** them, and **embraced** them.
- 11 And Israel said unto Joseph, I had <u>not</u> thought to see thy <u>face</u>: and, lo, <u>God</u> hath shewed me *also* thy seed.
- 12 And Joseph brought them out from between his knees, and he bowed himself with his face to the earth.
- ¹³ And Joseph took them both, Ephraim in his <u>right hand</u> toward Israel's <u>left hand</u>, and Manasseh in his <u>left hand</u> toward Israel's <u>right hand</u>, and brought them near unto him.
- 14 And Israel stretched *out* his <u>right hand</u>, and <u>laid</u> it upon **Ephraim's** <u>head</u>, who was the <u>younger</u>, and his <u>left hand</u> upon **Manasseh's** head, <u>guiding</u> his <u>hands</u> <u>wittingly</u>; for **Manasseh** was the <u>firstborn</u>.

- 15 And he <u>blessed</u> Joseph, and said, God, before whom my <u>fathers</u> Abraham and Isaac did <u>walk</u>, the God which <u>fed</u> me all my <u>life</u> long unto this <u>day</u>,
- 16 The **Angel** which <u>redeemed</u> me from <u>all evil</u>, <u>bless</u> the <u>lads</u>; and let my <u>name</u> be named on them, and the name of my <u>fathers</u> **Abraham** and **Isaac**; and let them <u>grow</u> into a <u>multitude</u> in the midst of the <u>earth</u>.
- ¹⁷ And when Joseph saw that his <u>father laid</u> his <u>right hand</u> upon the <u>head</u> of <u>Ephraim</u>, it <u>displeased</u> him: and he <u>held</u> <u>up</u> his <u>father's hand</u>, to <u>remove</u> it from <u>Ephraim's</u> head unto <u>Manasseh's</u> head.
- ¹⁸ And Joseph said unto his <u>father</u>, <u>Not</u> so, my <u>father</u>: for this is the <u>firstborn</u>; put thy <u>right hand</u> upon his <u>head</u>.
- 19 And his <u>father refused</u>, and said, I <u>know</u> it, my son, I know it: he <u>also</u> shall become a people, and he also shall be <u>great</u>: but <u>truly</u> his <u>younger</u> brother shall be <u>greater</u> than he, and his <u>seed</u> shall become a <u>multitude</u> of <u>nations</u>.
- 20 And he <u>blessed</u> them that <u>day</u>, saying, In thee shall <u>Israel bless</u>, saying, <u>God</u> make thee as <u>Ephraim</u> and as <u>Manasseh</u>: and he set <u>Ephraim</u> before <u>Manasseh</u>.
- ²¹ And Israel said unto Joseph, Behold, I <u>die</u>: but <u>God</u> shall be with you, and bring you <u>again</u> unto the land of your <u>fathers</u>.
- ²² Moreover I have given to thee <u>one portion</u> above thy brethren, which I took out of the <u>hand</u> of the <u>Amorite</u> with my <u>sword</u> and with my <u>bow</u>.

- And Jacob called unto his sons, and said, <u>Gather</u> yourselves together, that I may tell you that which shall <u>befall</u> you in the <u>last days</u>.
- ² Gather yourselves together, and hear, ye sons of Jacob; and hearken unto Israel your father.
- Reuben, thou art my <u>firstborn</u>, my <u>might</u>, and the <u>beginning</u> of my <u>strength</u>, the <u>excellency</u> of <u>dignity</u>, and the excellency of <u>power</u>:
- ⁴ <u>Unstable</u> as <u>water</u>, thou shalt <u>not excel</u>; because thou wentest *up* to thy <u>father's bed</u>; then <u>defiledst</u> thou it: he went *up* to my <u>couch</u>.
- 5 Simeon and Levi are brethren; *instruments* of *cruelty* are in their <u>habitations</u>.
- 6 O my soul, come <u>not</u> thou into their <u>secret</u>; unto their <u>assembly</u>, mine <u>honour</u>, be <u>not</u> thou <u>united</u>: for in their <u>anger</u> they <u>slew</u> a <u>man</u>, and in their <u>selfwill</u> they <u>digged</u> <u>down</u> a <u>wall</u>.
- ⁷ <u>Cursed</u> be their <u>anger</u>, for it was <u>fierce</u>; and their <u>wrath</u>, for it was <u>cruel</u>: I will <u>divide</u> them in <u>Jacob</u>, and scatter them in <u>Israel</u>.
- ⁸ Judah, thou art he whom thy brethren shall *praise*: thy <u>hand</u> shall be in the <u>neck</u> of thine <u>enemies</u>; thy father's children shall *bow down before* thee.
- Judah is a <u>lion's whelp</u>: from the <u>prey</u>, my son, thou art gone <u>up</u>: he <u>stooped</u> <u>down</u>, he <u>couched</u> as a lion, and as an <u>old</u> lion; who shall <u>rouse</u> him <u>up</u>?
- 10 The <u>sceptre</u> shall not <u>depart</u> from Judah, nor a <u>lawgiver</u> from between his <u>feet</u>, until <u>Shiloh</u> come; and unto him shall the <u>gathering</u> of the people be.
- 11 Binding his <u>foal</u> unto the <u>vine</u>, and his <u>ass's colt</u> unto the <u>choice</u> vine; he <u>washed</u> his <u>garments</u> in <u>wine</u>, and his <u>clothes</u> in the <u>blood</u> of <u>grapes</u>:
- 12 His eyes shall be red with wine, and his teeth white with milk.
- 13 **Zebulun** shall <u>dwell</u> at the <u>haven</u> of the <u>sea;</u> and he shall be for an haven of <u>ships;</u> and his <u>border</u> shall be unto **Zidon**.
- 14 **Issachar** is a <u>strong ass couching</u> *down* between <u>two burdens</u>:
- ¹⁵ And he saw that <u>rest</u> was <u>good</u>, and the land that it was <u>pleasant</u>; and <u>bowed</u> his <u>shoulder</u> to <u>bear</u>, and became a servant unto tribute.
- ¹⁶ Dan shall <u>judge</u> his people, as one of the <u>tribes</u> of <u>Israel</u>.

- Dan shall be a <u>serpent</u> by the <u>way</u>, an <u>adder</u> in the <u>path</u>, that <u>biteth</u> the <u>horse heels</u>, so that his <u>rider</u> shall <u>fall</u> <u>backward</u>.
- 18 I have <u>waited</u> for thy <u>salvation</u>, O **LORD**.
- 19 Gad, a troop shall overcome him: but he shall overcome at the last.
- 20 Out of Asher his bread shall be fat, and he shall yield royal dainties.
- Naphtali is a hind let loose: he giveth goodly words.
- 22 **Joseph** is a *fruitful* bough, even a *fruitful* bough by a <u>well;</u> whose <u>branches run</u> over the <u>wall</u>:
- 23 The <u>archers</u> have <u>sorely grieved</u> him, and <u>shot</u> at him, and <u>hated</u> him:
- 24 But his <u>bow abode</u> in <u>strength</u>, and the <u>arms</u> of his <u>hands</u> were made <u>strong</u> by the <u>hands</u> of the <u>mighty</u> **God** of **Jacob**; (from thence is the <u>shepherd</u>, the <u>stone</u> of **Israel**:)
- ²⁵ Even by the God of thy <u>father</u>, who shall <u>help</u> thee; and by the <u>Almighty</u>, who shall <u>bless</u> thee with <u>blessings</u> of <u>heaven</u> <u>above</u>, blessings of the <u>deep</u> that <u>lieth</u> <u>under</u>, blessings of the <u>breasts</u>, and of the <u>womb</u>:
- 26 The <u>blessings</u> of thy <u>father</u> have <u>prevailed</u> above the blessings of my <u>progenitors</u> unto the <u>utmost bound</u> of the <u>everlasting hills</u>: they shall be on the <u>head</u> of Joseph, and on the <u>crown</u> of the head of him that was <u>separate</u> from his brethren.
- 27 **Benjamin** shall <u>ravin</u> as a <u>wolf</u>: in the <u>morning</u> he shall <u>devour</u> the <u>prey</u>, and at <u>night</u> he shall <u>divide</u> the <u>spoil</u>.
- 28 All these are the <u>twelve tribes</u> of **Israel**: and this is it that their <u>father</u> spake unto them, and <u>blessed</u> them; every one according to his <u>blessing</u> he blessed them.
- ²⁹ And he <u>charged</u> them, and said unto them, I am to be <u>gathered</u> unto my people: <u>bury</u> me with my <u>fathers</u> in the <u>cave</u> that is in the <u>field</u> of Ephron the Hittite,
- 30 In the <u>cave</u> that is in the <u>field</u> of **Machpelah**, which is *before* **Mamre**, in the land of **Canaan**, which **Abraham** <u>bought</u> with the field of **Ephron** the **Hittite** for a <u>possession</u> of a <u>buryingplace</u>.
- 31 There they <u>buried</u> Abraham and Sarah his <u>wife</u>; there they buried Isaac and Rebekah his wife; and there I buried Leah.
- 32 The <u>purchase</u> of the <u>field</u> and of the <u>cave</u> that is therein was from the children of **Heth**.
- ³³ And when Jacob had made an end of commanding his sons, he gathered up his feet into the bed, and yielded up the ghost, and was gathered unto his people.

- 1 And Joseph fell upon his father's face, and wept upon him, and kissed him.
- 2 And Joseph commanded his servants the physicians to embalmed lsrael.
- 3 And <u>forty days</u> were <u>fulfilled</u> for him; for so are fulfilled the <u>days</u> of those which are <u>embalmed</u>: and the <u>Egyptians mourned</u> for him <u>threescore and ten</u> days.
- ⁴ And when the <u>days</u> of his <u>mourning</u> were <u>past</u>, <u>Joseph</u> spake unto the <u>house</u> of <u>Pharaoh</u>, saying, If now I have <u>found grace</u> in your <u>eyes</u>, speak, I pray you, in the ears of <u>Pharaoh</u>, saying,
- ⁵ My <u>father</u> made me <u>swear</u>, saying, Lo, I <u>die</u>: in my <u>grave</u> which I have <u>digged</u> for me in the land of Canaan, there shalt thou <u>bury</u> me. Now therefore let me go *up*, I pray thee, and bury my father, and I will come <u>again</u>.
- 6 And Pharaoh said, Go *up*, and <u>bury</u> thy <u>father</u>, according as he made thee <u>swear</u>.
- 7 And Joseph went *up* to <u>bury</u> his <u>father</u>: and with him went *up all* the <u>servants</u> of <u>Pharaoh</u>, the <u>elders</u> of his <u>house</u>, and *all* the elders of the land of <u>Egypt</u>,
- And all the house of **Joseph**, and his brethren, and his father's house: only their little ones, and their flocks, and their herds, they left in the land of **Goshen**.
- 9 And there went *up* with him both <u>chariots</u> and <u>horsemen</u>: and it was a *very great* <u>company</u>.
- 10 And they came to the <u>threshingfloor</u> of **Atad**, which is *beyond* **Jordan**, and there they <u>mourned</u> with a *great* and *very sore* <u>lamentation</u>: and he made a mourning for his <u>father seven days</u>.
- 11 And when the <u>inhabitants</u> of the land, the **Canaanites**, saw the <u>mourning</u> in the <u>floor</u> of **Atad**, they said, This is a *grievous* mourning to the **Egyptians**: wherefore the name of it was called **Abelmizraim**, which is beyond **Jordan**.
- ¹² And his sons did unto him according as he <u>commanded</u> them:
- 13 For his sons <u>carried</u> him into the land of <u>Canaan</u>, and <u>buried</u> him in the <u>cave</u> of the <u>field</u> of <u>Machpelah</u>, which <u>Abraham bought</u> with the <u>field</u> for a <u>possession</u> of a <u>buryingplace</u> of <u>Ephron</u> the <u>Hittite</u>, <u>before</u> <u>Mamre</u>.
- 14 And Joseph <u>returned</u> into **Egypt**, he, and his brethren, and *all* that went *up* with him to <u>bury</u> his <u>father</u>, *after* he had buried his father.

- ¹⁵ And when Joseph's brethren saw that their <u>father</u> was <u>dead</u>, they said, <u>Joseph</u> will <u>peradventure <u>hate</u> us, and will <u>certainly requite</u> us <u>all</u> the <u>evil</u> which we did unto him.
 </u>
- ¹⁶ And they <u>sent</u> a <u>messenger</u> unto <u>Joseph</u>, saying, Thy <u>father</u> did <u>command</u> <u>before</u> he <u>died</u>, saying,
- 17 So shall ye say unto Joseph, Forgive, I pray thee now, the trespass of thy brethren, and their sin; for they did unto thee evil: and now, we pray thee, forgive the trespass of the servants of the God of thy father. And Joseph wept when they spake unto him.
- 18 And his brethren also went and <u>fell</u> *down before* his <u>face</u>; and they said, Behold, we be thy <u>servants</u>.
- ¹⁹ And Joseph said unto them, <u>Fear</u> not: for am I in the <u>place</u> of God?
- 20 But as for you, **ye thought** <u>evil against</u> me; but God <u>meant</u> it unto <u>good</u>, to bring to <u>pass</u>, as it is this <u>day</u>, to <u>save</u> <u>much</u> people <u>alive</u>.
- 21 Now therefore <u>fear</u> ye <u>not</u>: I will <u>nourish</u> you, and your *little* <u>ones</u>. And he <u>comforted</u> them, and spake *kindly* unto them.
- 22 And Joseph dwelt in Egypt, he, and his father's house: and Joseph lived an hundred and ten years.
- ²³ And Joseph saw Ephraim's children of the <u>third generation</u>: the children also of <u>Machir</u> the son of <u>Manasseh</u> were brought *up* upon <u>Joseph's knees</u>.
- 24 And Joseph said unto his brethren, I <u>die</u>: and <u>God will surely visit</u> you, and bring you *out* of this land unto the land which he <u>sware</u> to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob.
- 25 And Joseph took an <u>oath</u> of the children of Israel, saying, God will *surely* visit you, and ye shall <u>carry</u> up my <u>bones</u> from hence.
- ²⁶ So Joseph <u>died</u>, being an <u>hundred and ten years old</u>: and they <u>embalmed</u> him, and he was put in a <u>coffin</u> in Egypt.
